SANTA ANITA DERBY WRAP-UP Trainer Bob Baffert could not have been more pleased with the effort of his three-year-old gelding **Cavonnier** (Batonnier) in winning Saturday's \$1 million Santa Anita Derby. "He took me by surprise the way he finished down the stretch," Baffert said. "That's something he had never really showed us in his previous races. He came back well and we'll see what happens, but right now we're headed to Kentucky." It is not certain whether jockey Chris McCarron will be aboard the California-bred the first Saturday in May. "We'll let Chris and his agent decide what they do," Baffert said. "I don't think I'll have any trouble getting a top rider now." Baffert indicated he plans to run both Cavonnier and Remington Park Derby winner **Semoran** (Phone Trick) in the Kentucky Derby. "Semoran gets the acid test this weekend in the Blue Grass (Saturday at Keeneland)," Baffert continued. "I would only enter them both if I thought they could win, but, like they say, if you're going to go bear hunting, it's better to have two bullets." Semoran breezed five furlongs in 1:01 3/5 over a fast Churchill Downs track yesterday morning.

Honour and Glory (Relaunch), who crossed the wire third but was moved up to second by the stewards after the disqualification of **Alyrob** (Alysheba), may get a new jockey for the Run for the Roses. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas indicated that Gary Stevens, who has ridden the colt in six of his eight career starts, may be replaced in the Kentucky Derby by Pat Day, who teamed up with Honour and Glory last October to win the Gil Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland. "It's time to make some changes," Lukas said after the Santa Anita Derby. "I've always believed that if something isn't working, then change it and make it work. I'd rather have Gary Stevens on my horse than anyone else when it comes to the big races, but sometimes a rider and horse just don't match each other very well."

The race was won in good style by Valanour, who sat behind pacesetter MARILDO (FR) (Romildo {GB}) until the straight and then found a split between the leader and GUNBOAT DIPLOMACY (Fr) (Dominion {GB}) and quickened away to win comfortably; he had no trouble withstanding the strong late run of 1995 French Oaks winner Carling. Winning trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre said, "Valanour is a top-class horse. He was very sick after last year's Grand Prix de Paris and I made a mistake in running him in the Irish Champion." The colt ended his three-year-old season with a sixth-place finish in the Irish Champion S. last September 9, and was making his '96 debut here. The G1 Prix Ganay is the target for the first two finishers.

An impressive performance from the progressive Helissio, who raced in second behind Go Between until the straight, when he quickened well to go clear of the field. "I didn't really want to run him here, as I would have preferred to wait for the Prix Greffulhe in two weeks' time, but the owner insisted and now everything has worked out well," said trainer Elie Lellouche. "But we will stick to my plan in the future and he will run next in the G1 Prix Lupin May 12." Helissio, who was purchased for \$69,210 as a weanling from the Deauville sales, ran the final furlong in :10.30.

Charlie Whittingham, whose **Corker** (Festin {Arg}) was moved up to third following the disqualification of Alyrob, said the half-brother to '94 Kentucky Derby runner-up Strodes Creek is a go for the May 4 classic. "He had a rough trip and still ran on well," Whittingham said Sunday morning. "With any luck yesterday, we could have won the whole thing. If you remember, Ferdinand finished third in this race in 1986, and he came right back to take the Kentucky Derby."

Alyrob will make his next start at Churchill Downs during the first week of May, trainer Wally Dollase reported Sunday afternoon. The race, however, remains to be determined. If Alyrob, who has earned only \$53,000, fails to draw into the Kentucky Derby field, he will run in the \$100,000a Crown Royal American Turf for three-year-olds Friday, May 3. "I obviously think he fits in the Derby," Dollase said. "But whether or not he has enough earnings to get in remains to be seen." The number of starters in the Kentucky Derby will be limited to 20, with preference given to horses who have accumulated the highest earnings in graded races. Dollase added that he intends to retain Corey Nakatani as the rider for Alyrob.

Others from the Santa Anita Derby field pointing to the Kentucky Derby include **EC's Dream** (Incinderator) (4th) and **Prince of Thieves** (Hansel) (5th).

WATERHOUSE CAPTURES THIRD STRAIGHT G1 DONCASTER

While trainer Lee Freedman dominates the Golden Slipper in Australia, having just landed the \$1.5 million juvenile spectacular for the fourth straight year with the filly Merlene, another Australian-based trainer, Mrs. Gai Waterhouse, has won the \$772,678 Doncaster H. three years running. Her latest winner of Saturday's highly competitive mile handicap was the four-year-old gelding **Sprint By (NZ)** (Kaapstad {NZ}), a 10 to 1 shot, who won by a short head from **Danasinga (Aus)** (Danehill), with Waterhouse's winner from last year, **Juggler (Aus)** (Jugah), the same distance away in third. Said a jubilant Waterhouse, daughter of the legendary Australian trainer Tommy Smith, "We got him for \$21,635. He didn't race until he was four and now he's won more than a million dollars (Australian)." The gelding has in fact won nine of his 19 starts and been placed five times.

Three-year-old **Argonnier** (Batonnier) drilled six furlongs yesterday in 1:12 1/5 in preparation for Saturday's \$100,000a San Pedro S. at 6 1/2-furlongs on the main track. The Bob Baffert-trainee won his last three starts at age two, including two stakes, then returned from a seven-month layoff to take the \$75,000a Zany Tactics S. at Santa Anita March 16 by a half-length. "Argonnier has a tremendous amount of talent, but we lost time with him due to a pulled muscle," Baffert said. "His last start in the Zany Tactics was an ugly win, but he got the job done. He wasn't really ready to run in that race, but he's starting to put it all together now."

Track Gal (Track Barron), scratched from Saturday's GIII Potrero Grande Breeders' Cup H., will make her first start since finishing 11th in the Oct. 28 Breeders' Cup Sprint in Wednesday's Time To Leave H. "We just thought this was a much better spot for her than the race on Saturday," said trainer John Sadler. The five-year-old mare won six of eight starts last year including two graded stakes.
