QUEEN'S PLATE RESCHEDULED The visit of Her Royal Highness Princess Margaret for the 137th running of The Queen's Plate at Woodbine has been canceled due to the ongoing lockout of the track's mutuel workers, and as a result the race will be rescheduled for July 7. The Princess' visit was called off over concern for her safety because of the labor dispute. "I have advised Her Royal Highness Princess Margaret that it would be inadvisable to attend this year's running of The Queen's Plate, which had been scheduled for July 13," said George Hendrie, chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Ontario Jockey Club. "We are now moving The Queen's Plate to July 7, which is the traditional date for the race to be run."

MERLENE SCORES AGAIN Merlene (Aus) (Danehill), ridden by Shane Dye in place of the suspended Greg Hall, followed her victory in the G1 Golden Slipper S. with a 1 1/4-length win in yesterday's G1 AJC Sires Produce S. over seven furlongs at Randwick in Sydney. The two-year-old filly, sent off at odds of 10-9, collected another \$185,443 and boosted her career earnings to more than \$1.1 million, having won five of her six career starts. However, Merlene's trainer Lee Freedman intends to resist the temptation to win the juvenile Triple Crown and will skip the third leg of the series, the G1 Champagne S. over a mile at Randwick April 20. "She'll go to the paddock and come back in the spring," said Freedman. "She's had a hard campaign and the extra distance of the Champagne might be beyond her at this stage. I think she'll make a Guineas horse later." Australia's spring begins in September.

THIS WEEK'S TRIPLE CROWN PREPS

Saturday, Keeneland

TOYOTA BLUE GRASS S.-GII, \$700,000, 3yo, 9f

Seven horses are expected to face the starter for the Blue Grass. **Skip Away** (Skip Trial), third in the GI Florida Derby last out March 16, blazed through five furlongs in :58 2/5 at Keeneland Monday. With jockey Shane Sellers in the irons, the colt galloped out the six furlongs in 1:11 1/5. "I wanted something good in him," said trainer Sonny Hine. "He hasn't run in quite a while." Added Sellers, "That's the best he's worked since I've been getting on him. He went fairly easily. It was very impressive, believe me." Also prepping for the Blue Grass yesterday, Florida Derby runner-up **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner) went five furlongs in a bullet 1:00 3/5 at Churchill Downs; and Jim Beam runner-up **Ensign Ray** (Blue Ensign) went the same distance in 1:01 2/5 at Keeneland. **Semoran** (Phone Trick), winner of the Remington Park Derby for trainer Bob Baffert, who saddled Cavonnier to win the GI Santa Anita Derby Saturday, went five-eighths in 1:01 3/5 Sunday at Churchill; he will be shipped to Keeneland today. Trainer Nick Zito will send out his Blue Grass candidates, **Diligence** (Miswaki) and **Louis Quatorze** (Sovereign Dancer), to breeze this morning, while Shug McGaughey trainee **Draw** (Private Account) will blow out for the race Thursday or Friday.

Saturday, Aqueduct Racetrack

WOOD MEMORIAL S.-GII, \$500,000, 3yo, 9f

A field of six is likely for the Wood, headed by early Kentucky Derby favorite **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled). Also pointing for the race is undefeated **Romano Gucci** (Aaron's Concorde), who captured the GI Gotham in his last start. The Dick Dutrow trainee was scheduled to breeze yesterday or today, but may be forced to skip his final Wood prep because recent rains have turned the track muddy. "I guess we're all in the same boat with the weather," said Dutrow. "The track conditions may cost us a workout--it's a day-by-day thing, and it looks like I won't be able to do much with him." Cherry Hill Mile winner **In Contention** (Devil's Bag) had his final work last Thursday, going an easy five furlongs in 1:03 at Philadelphia Park. "He's dead fit and he doesn't need a whole lot," said trainer Cynthia Reese. Also expected in the gate Saturday are **Harrowman** (Dawn Quixote), **Feather Box** (Cherokee Colony), and **Secreto de Estado** (General Assembly).

LAST WEEK'S TRIPLE CROWN TRIALS

Two major contenders were lost to the Triple Crown last week when both **Cobra King** (Farma Way) and **Ide** (Forty Niner) were sidelined by injuries, and top California prospect **Honour and Glory** (Relaunch) lost some luster with a lackluster third-place finish (moved to second by the stewards) in the GI Santa Anita Derby. But the official first five finishers from Santa Anita's \$1 million Kentucky Derby prep--**Cavonnier** (Batonnier), **Honour and Glory**, **Corker** (Festin {Arg}), **E C's Dream** (Incinerator) and **Prince Of Thieves** (Hansel)--as well as the original runner-up, **Alyrob** (Alysheba), are all heading to Churchill Downs.

Saturday's Flamingo produced only one Kentucky Derby prospect. Trainer Thomas Heard said yesterday that **Built for Pleasure** (Homebuilder) will be pointed for the Derby, blaming a poor ride by jockey Gary Boulanger for the colt's seventh-place finish. "I was hoping to find out something about him in this race but it was a waste of time," said Heard. "He was full of run down the backside and then (Boulanger) took him back before coming on again to make a big run. You don't do that. There's a cardinal rule--once you have position, don't blow it." Heard will look for a new rider. Flamingo winner **El Amante** (Wild Again) looks likely to head to Sportsman's Park for the Illinois Derby May 11, runner-up **Bold Lachee** (Apalachee) will go to Maryland for the Federico Tesio April 20, and **Will's Way** (Easy Goer), third at even-money, will ship to New York with an eye towards the Illinois Derby or the Peter Pan S. at Belmont May 26. His trainer, H. James Bond, said, "I'm still very disappointed. He came back with a muscle pull--not serious. The first thing I thought was that he might have bled, but he scoped clean. He came back blowing harder and more stressed than after his previous two races. But I'm still convinced he is a good colt."

CALDER STAKES SCHEDULE RELEASED A total of 42 stakes worth over \$3.7 million will be offered during the 1996 meet at Calder Race Course, including the 15th presentation of one of the nation's most prestigious programs for two-year-olds, the Florida Stallion Stakes. Finals of that program, along with four other added-money events, will be contested on the richest day in Florida racing, the Sept. 28 Festival of the Sun. Other highlights of the schedule are the recently graded **Azalea Breeders' Cup S.** (GIII), to be run June 1, and the **Calder Breeders' Cup Derby** (GIII), to be run Oct. 19. Also new are the richer **Powder Break H.** Nov. 2 and **Spirit of Fighter H.** Oct. 12, both on the turf, with purses now at \$150,000 and \$100,000 respectively. Calder's 1996 season begins Friday, May 24 and concludes Tuesday, Nov. 5.

HIALEAH CANCELS AFTER THE FOURTH

Racing was called off after the fourth race at Hialeah Park yesterday when a severe rain storm turned the track to a sea of slop by the middle of the day's live card. The fifth and seventh races, which were simulcast events from Aqueduct, were held as scheduled. Racing is expected to resume this afternoon.

Giving owner James Riccio and trainer Juan Serey their second graded stakes win of the weekend with horses claimed last year, **Punkin Pie** bounced back from a throat infection and a sixth-place finish in the GIII Next Move H. March 10 to post this game wire-to-wire victory. Haltered for \$25,000 from a race at Monmouth Park last August, the chestnut mare was picking up her fourth win for her new connections; she also notched back-to-back allowance tallies over the Aqueduct inner track in January and February. Sent right to the front as the lightweight and longest shot on the board, **Punkin Pie** shook off a challenge from **SHOOP** (Double Sonic) at the quarter-pole, then dug down deep once again to take the photo from the fast-finishing **Incinerate**. "I kept looking for the finish line. I said, 'Where is it--where is it?'," said Serey, who also saddled reformed claimer **Little Miss Fast** to win the GIII **Comely S.** Friday.

Local News: Atlanta, Georgia

Augustin Stable's **Irish Approach** (Irish River {Fr}), winless in 1995, captured the first leg of the Steeplechase Triple Crown, taking Saturday's \$100,000 GI Robinson-Humphrey Coca-Cola Atlanta Cup by a neck over stablemate **Mistico (Chi)** (Balconaje {Arg}), with **Confidente (Chi)** (El Morgon) third. The new series offers a \$100,000 bonus for a sweep; the next leg is the \$75,000 GII Temple Gwathmey at Middleburg, Virginia April 20 and it concludes with the \$100,000 GI Iroquois S. at Nashville, Tennessee May 11. Carrying 144 pounds, seven-year-old Irish Approach ran the 2 3/8 miles in 4:41 2/5 with jockey Blythe Miller in the irons; his trainer, Jonathan Sheppard, saddled the first three finishers in the race as well as the fifth and sixth-placed horses.

Local News: Atlantic City Race Course

According to a report in *The Press of Atlantic City*, Atlantic City Race Course Chairman Robert Levy is negotiating to bring auto racing to his track. The plan would allow for auto racing during three weekends per year, possibly as early as 1997.

Local News: Monmouth Park

Monmouth Park will offer racing fans season passes for the first time for the 1996 meet. Available at the cost of \$50, the pass will be good for grandstand or clubhouse admission throughout the 73-day season, which runs May 25-September 2, as well as for preferred admission to the simulcast programs through December, 1996; they will be on sale until June 16.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

Wagering lines in the infield at Churchill Downs Derby Day should be a little shorter this year with the addition of 80 new mutuel windows in the area. The new wagering sites increase the total at Churchill Downs to 1,100 for Derby Day, with 260 located in the infield.

A special ceremony to honor African-American jockey William Walker, winner of the 1877 Kentucky Derby aboard *Baden-Baden*, will be held in Louisville Cemetery at 6:00 p.m. Monday, April 29. A headstone which outlines Walker's career in racing will be dedicated during the ceremony at the rider's currently unmarked grave. Walker, a native of Kentucky, was born into slavery in 1860; he rode his first race at age 11 and led the standings at Churchill Downs five times.
