**DERBY POST DRAW TO BE TELEVISED** The Kentucky Derby Post Position Draw will have a new day, time and location in 1996, with the event scheduled for Wednesday, May 1 from 6:00 to 6:30 p.m. (EDT) at the Churchill Downs Sports Spectrum. ESPN will telecast the draw live to a national audience. The ESPN coverage marks the second year the event has been televised on a national level. The move to Wednesday will require that all Kentucky Derby and Derby Day entries be taken 72 hours in advance of the Saturday, May 4 race day. Entries for the May 3 Kentucky Oaks, as well as all entries for the Oaks day race card, will also be taken 72 hours in advance Tuesday, April 30.

**DANEHILL COLT TOPS SYDNEY FINAL SESSION** Retired champion trainer Colin Hayes, master of Lindsay Park Stud in South Australia, purchased the most expensive lot on the third day of the Inglis Easter Yearling Sales in Sydney when he paid \$251,120 for a colt by Danehill--Lyrical Vine (Godswalk). The colt will be handled by Hayes' son Peter, trainer this year of Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum's 1994 Melbourne Cup winner Jeune (GB). Eight of Danehill's yearlings were in the top 10 lots sold at the sale and Hayes' purchase was the seventh-highest. The average price for his progeny was \$185,570, more than double that of his nearest rival, the New Zealand-based **Sir Tristram** (Sir Ivor), whose average was \$88,470. Over the three days, 403 yearlings were sold, a clearance rate of 89 percent, for a gross value of \$26,174,470; the average of \$64,950 was up 16.3 percent from last year. Colts averaged \$74,825 and fillies \$52,210. Reg Inglis, Managing Director of the sales company, said, "This was the most successful yearling sale ever conducted in Australia. It was strong right from the start and it stayed exceptionally strong all the way through. This will be the benchmark now. It will follow through to other sales, including next week's weanling and broodmare sales. All the major Australian buyers were here plus many trainers, agents and owners from Hong Kong, Malaysia, Japan, New Zealand, South Africa and Europe."

**EIGHT ADDED TO EPSOM LIST** Connections of eight horses have paid an £8,000 (around \$12,000) supplementary entry fee for this season's Epsom Derby to be run June 8. **Beauchamp King** (GB) (Nishapour {Fr}), **Bonarelli** (Ire) (Dancing Dissident), **Clever Cliche** (Aus) (Danehill), **Glory of Dancer** (GB) (Shareef Dancer), **Mark of Esteem** (Ire) (Daarshan {GB}), **Shaamit** (Ire) (Mtoto {GB}), French-based **Spinning World** (Nureyev), and **Tagula** (Ire) (Taufan) were added to the list of hopefuls, now totaling 158, revealed by course officials yesterday morning. Britain's bookmakers rate **Beauchamp King**, hero of last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy for champion trainer John Dunlop, and **Mark of Esteem**, now with the Godolphin team in Dubai after scoring in maiden company while trained by Henry Cecil during 1995, as the most significant additions. Latest Derby betting is: 11-4 **Alhaarth**, 12-1 **Mark of Esteem**, 14-1 **Sacho**, 16-1 **Silver Dome**, 20-1 **Mons**, 25-1 **Beauchamp King**, 33-1 others.

**GOMTUU EUTHANIZED** Tri-Colour Racing's **Gomtuu** (Hail the Ruckus), last year's Champion Two-Year-Old Colt in Canada, was euthanized Wednesday at the University of Guelph in Canada. The Florida-bred three-year-old had been retired last week after suffering a fracture in his left knee while finishing fifth in the **Friar Rock S. (GIIIC)** at Woodbine March 31. **Gomtuu** won three of 12 starts, with four seconds and a third, for earnings of \$214,766. His victories included tallies in last year's **GIII Grey S.** and **Victoria S.** at Woodbine.

**PERFECT ARC NAMED NEW YORK-BRED**

**HORSE OF THE YEAR** In the fourth straight "photo finish" for New York-Bred Horse of the Year, a panel of 15 New York turf writers plus the racing secretaries at NYRA and Finger Lakes awarded **Brazil Stable's** Grade I-winning, unbeaten-on-the-turf **Perfect Arc** (Brown Arc) the 1995 title by a 71-65 margin over Virginia Kraft Payson's **Saratoga Cup** victor and **Breeders' Cup Classic** runner-up **L'Carriere** (Carr de Naskra). But the panelists couldn't make up their minds for **Trainer of the Year**, with the result that the respective conditioners of the two **Horse of the Year** finalists, **Angel Penna Jr.** and **H. James Bond**, ended up in a flat tie for the first **Sally A. Bailie Memorial Award**. **Perfect Arc**, bred by **Delehanty Stock Farm**, was a perfect seven-for-seven last year including victories in the **G1 Queen Elizabeth II Invitational Challenge Cup**, **GII Rare Perfume S.** and **GII Diana H.** In addition to **Horse of the Year**, she was also named **Champion Turf Female** and **Champion Three-Year-Old Filly**. **L'Carriere** was the unanimous choice as **Champion Older Male**. In addition, **Fourstars Allstar** (Compliance) took his record 10th New York-Bred title as **Champion Turf Male**. Other winners were: **Lottsa Talc** (Talc), **Champion Sprinter** and **Champion Older Female**; **Ave's Flag** (Personal Flag), **Champion Three-Year-Old Male**; **Thunder Achiever** (Thunder Puddles), **Champion Two-Year-Old Filly**; **Carrbine Special** (Carr de Naskra), **Champion Two-Year-Old Male**.

**TV BOSS DISMISSES DEATH CLAIM** British TV Producer Andrew Franklin, whose company Channel 4 covered last month's Cheltenham Festival fixture, has dismissed suggestions that noise from an airship's engines contributed to the deaths of 10 horses running at the 20-race meeting. But Jockey Club investigators are considering the claim made by the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. Franklin described as "ludicrous" the RSPCA's suspicion that the airship, which took high-altitude overhead pictures of action at the course, might have distracted horses while they were negotiating fences. He added, "I'm utterly contemptuous of any suggestions that we could have contributed to the fatalities. (But) we acknowledge that the noise made by the airship's engines impaired the enjoyment of racegoers and intend to address that." Jockey Club spokesman David Pipe responded, "The working group (which has been set up to assess factors contributing to the 10 deaths) have looked at the issue of the airship and this will form part of their report."

**EQUIBASE SIGNS AGREEMENT WITH ON-LINE ENTERTAINMENT PROVIDER** Equibase Company, a central database of racing information in the Thoroughbred industry, has signed an agreement to provide extensive electronic racing data to You Bet International Inc. ("You Bet!"), developers of an on-line service designed to give personal computer users the ability to experience, in the comfort of their homes, the interactive aspect of horse racing that makes it unique as a sporting event. In a joint announcement by the two organizations Thursday, Equibase President Alan Marzelli called the agreement a step into the future which further enhances the Company's goal of bringing Thoroughbred racing information to a wider market. Beginning this winter, "You Bet!" will use its proprietary interactive simulcast technology to deliver live racing, with powerful handicapping tools and up-to-the-minute on-line information.

**MUNDY & SCHENCK NAMED AMBASSADORS OF RACING** Kentucky Thoroughbred Media, an organization of reporters and publicists who write about Thoroughbred racing, each spring recognizes an Ambassador of Racing. The Ambassador of Racing is a person who has gone above and beyond the call of duty in spreading the word about Thoroughbred racing and breeding to the public at large. This year, for the first time, the award will be given to two people: George Mundy, DVM and Cathy Cooper Schenck. Dr. Mundy is chief veterinarian with the Kentucky Racing Commission and veterinary consultant to Breeders' Cup Limited, while Schenck is the head librarian at the Keeneland Association. The awards will be presented to Mundy and Schenck April 30 in Louisville at the Kentucky Derby Trainers' dinner sponsored by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association.

**Local News: Dubai**

Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford played down the Dubai-based team's chances of repeating last year's exploits in Britain following a series of full-scale time trials at Nad Al Sheba racecourse yesterday. Godolphin captured three English Classics--the Derby, Oaks and St. Leger--in 1995. But, after watching 19 of their string work under jockeys Frankie Dettori and Richard Hills, Crisford was low key. The most significant works involved 2000 Guineas candidate **Mark Of Esteem (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}) and leading 1000 Guineas fancy **Bint Shadayid** (Nashwan). Neither stood out in their gallops, however, and the former was seemingly unable to quicken up significantly at the end of his exercise. Crisford said: "Mark Of Esteem went satisfactorily and it is not a problem that he did not go past his lead horse. Today was like a Guineas prep-race for him and I would expect him to come on a lot. He is on schedule for the 2000 Guineas. Bint Shadayid's work was only fair, but she should benefit from these trials and we're still aiming her at the 1000 Guineas."

Off the board only once in her career, Apolda ended 1995 with a graded stakes win, then returned from a two-month vacation to take another at Gulfstream in January. The grey mare missed by only three-quarters in the GIII Suwanee River H. in her last but made it three-for-four here with a gallant effort under jockey Jerry Bailey. On the pace early, the bettors' choice was shuffled back to fifth on the backstretch but came on again to take the lead and held on while drifting out slightly to best Mediation in a tight photo. Jockey Jose Santos aboard the runner-up claimed foul against winning jockey Jerry Bailey for allegedly hitting his filly in the face with the whip during the drive, but the stewards looked at the films and found no reason to reverse the order of finish. The winner set a new course record, breaking the old mark by three-fifths of a second.
