UNBRIDLED'S SONG TO STAND AT TAYLOR

MADE Taylor Made Farm in Nicholasville, Kentucky announced plans yesterday to add a Stallion Division to its Thoroughbred operations. "We are going to build this stallion complex one stall at a time," said Ben Taylor. "Our primary focus is on quality. That's why **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled) will be our first stallion. We are extremely excited about the horse. We're hoping to find stallions like Unbridled's Song who can play both sides of the fence...stallions with the credentials to be leading sires on the racetrack and leading sires in the sales ring." Three-year-old Unbridled's Song has won four of seven starts, with two seconds, for earnings to date of \$1,223,000. He won last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile and this year's GI Florida Derby and GI Wood Memorial and is the early favorite for the May 4 Kentucky Derby. As to when the horse will be retired to stud, Taylor said, "We hope it will be a long time. He's sound. Hopefully he'll race through his three, four and five-year-old seasons. We'll let him tell us when he's ready."

KING UPSETS ALHAARTH'S THRONE

Alhaarth (Ire) (Unfuwain), last year's champion European juvenile, had his unbeaten streak snapped yesterday, losing by a neck to **Beauchamp King (GB)** (Nishapour {Fr}) in the Craven S. at Newmarket. Hamdan al Maktoum's colt, boasting a perfect five-for-five record going into the G3 event, went off at odds of 1-2. The favorite was rank early as veteran jockey Willie Carson attempted to settle his mount in behind pacesetter **Rio Duvida (GB)** (Salse). Carson gave up trying to rate the champ halfway through the one-mile contest. But, even though Alhaarth hit the front, Beauchamp King was always travelling slightly better and probably won a little in hand. Successful trainer John Dunlop seemed astonished by his colt's victory. "I was no more than hopeful about beating (trainer) Dick (Hern)'s horse," he said. "Beauchamp King seemed around 12-15 pounds behind the best last year and Alhaarth appeared a worthy champion. But, whether he has failed to improve or even gone back, or if it's that we have come on, it's too early to say." Alhaarth's connections were equally bemused. Angus Gold, racing manager to Sheikh Hamdan, could offer no firm explanation other than being "beaten by a better horse on the day." However, he added, "Willie thought we might have been better allowing Alhaarth to bowl along, rather than trying to hold him up. But I could be no more than hopeful about turning the tables in the 2000 Guineas, because Beauchamp King looked a very good horse this afternoon." *Craven Stakes Result, p. 5.*

KENTUCKY RACING COMMISSION GETS NEW CHAIRMAN

Richard (Smitty) Taylor has been appointed Chairman of the Kentucky Racing Commission by Kentucky Governor Paul Patton. Taylor replaces Wayne G. Lyster III, owner of Ashview Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. Lyster said, "The chairmanship of the Kentucky Racing Commission has always been a political appointment. That the leadership changes with each new incoming governor is a routine and fully anticipated part of Kentucky politics. I congratulate my successor on his appointment. My term as chairman of the Kentucky Racing Commission has been one of the most exciting and rewarding challenges of my professional career. I am forever indebted to former Governor Brereton Jones for giving me this remarkable opportunity to serve the business I love."

CAERLEON FILLY TOPS TATTERSALLS FIRST SESSION

A chestnut filly by Caerleon--Darnelle (Ire) (Shirley Heights {GB}) brought \$72,818 to top Wednesday's first session of the Tattersalls Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale in Newmarket, England. The filly was consigned by Portlester Stud, Ireland (agent) and purchased by Mr. R. Akehurst. Overall, 62 two-year-olds were sold for a gross of \$1,363,275 and an average of \$21,988, up 30.5 percent from last year's \$16,853. The two-day sale was scheduled to conclude Thursday.

FIFTY-THREE CATALOGUED FOR CHURCHILL DOWNS/KEENELAND SALE

Keeneland will team with Churchill Downs this year to conduct a Horses in Training Sale in Louisville during Kentucky Derby week. It marks the second straight year for this sale, but it will be conducted by Keeneland for the first time. The Churchill Downs/Keeneland Horses in Training Sale is set for Wednesday night, May 1 at Sports Spectrum. The sale will start at 7:30 p.m., following the draw for Kentucky Derby post positions. Fifty-three horses have been catalogued, including **Juliannus** (Alydar), winner of the GII Razorback H. at Oaklawn March 16; Triple Crown nominee **Storm Creek** (Storm Cat), third in the \$100,000 Great West S. at Remington Park March 2; and **Cymbala (Fr)** (Assert {Ire}), third by a neck in the \$71,240 Appalachian S. at Keeneland April 6. Horses for the sale will be stabled at Sports Spectrum. "Through the years, Keeneland's focus has been on yearling and breeding stock sales and, most recently, a two-year-olds in training auction," said Keeneland President Bill Greely. "Derby Week in Louisville is an excellent opportunity for us to expand our expertise into the horses-in-training market. We look forward to working with Churchill Downs on this exciting event." Don Richardson, Churchill Downs' vice president of racing, added, "Churchill Downs and Keeneland are two of the most respected names in racing, and the expertise that each provides will undoubtedly ensure the success of the Sports Spectrum sale."

CASE OF STRANGLES IN NEWMARKET

Britain's Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food is monitoring a case of CEM (commonly known as Strangles) discovered this week. The alert came about when a maiden mare which had been covered by **Cyrano de Bergerac** (Bold Lad {Ire}) tested positive to the infection this Tuesday. Now, under agreed code of practice, no further coverings by the stallion will take place until the situation is clarified in seven days' time. Cyrano de Bergerac had returned negative swabs at the beginning of the season and it is thought the root of infection is another mare previously covered by him. All the Barleythorpe Stud-based 13-year-old stallion's mates will now be re-tested, but other residents at the Rutland stud will continue as normal.

Jockey Tony McNeil, who took the worst of a three-horse spill at Remington Park April 11, was released from the hospital Wednesday night after successful surgery to repair his fractured left femur. McNeil, a 39-year-old veteran of race riding, is expected to be out of action for a year.

Local News, Guatemala:

The Jockey Club Registrar Edward "Buddy" Bishop and Registration Supervisor Rick Bailey have returned from four days spent in Guatemala, where they inspected the facilities, procedures and integrity of *The Guatemala Stud Book* on behalf of the International Stud Book Committee (ISBC) following the Central American country's request for approval. "An important but little-known responsibility of The Jockey Club is to inspect other Stud Books in North America and Caribbean areas in order to ensure that they are maintaining the standards required by the ISBC," said Bishop. "At present, *The Guatemala Stud Book* produces only a relatively small foal crop a year, but they are working very hard to develop their breeding industry in hopes of running a homebred in the most prestigious race in the Caribbean, the Clasico del Caribe. Approval of *The Guatemala Stud Book* would allow Guatemalan horses to be exported to any country in the world to race or breed." Bishop will submit his recommendation on Guatemala later this spring; the ISBC is expected to vote on the matter in September.
