### OCALA BREEDERS' SALES RESULTS:

#### Tuesday's Second Session:

The second session of the OBS Spring Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale was completed Tuesday night with gains all around. A total of 182 horses were sold for a gross of \$3,109,200, a 40% increase over last year's second-session gross of \$2,217,600. The average of \$17,084 was up 16% from last year's \$14,686 for the same session. A total of 62 horses were offered but not sold, for a buy-back percentage of 25.4%, down from 30.6% in 1995. The median of \$11,750 was up slightly from last year's \$11,500.

Hartley/DeRenzo, agent, sold the top two horses of the session. A bay colt by Candi's Gold--Bid Me Adieu (Spectacular Bid) topped the session with a final bid of \$200,000 from Yusuf Mongroo of Guyana. The a half-brother to GISW Spectacular Tide breezed the fastest three-eighths of the sale in :34. A gray or roan colt by Silver Buck--Bonnie's Poker (Poker), who breezed a quarter in :21 4/5, brought the second-highest bid of \$100,000 from Canadian C.J. Gray.

#### Wednesday's Third Session:

Wednesday's third session saw 161 two-year-olds sell for a gross of \$2,236,500 and an average of \$13,891, down 1.6 percent from last year's comparable session average of \$14,128. The median price for yesterday's third session was identical to last year's \$10,000. The top price of \$50,000 was paid for three horses. The first, a dark bay filly by Diablo--Iron's Advance (Iron Constitution), was consigned by Leppala/Wormser, agent, and purchased by Mark Gunderson's R.G.X. Inc. The second, a bay filly by Skywalker--Lady Doswell (Lord Gaylord), was sold by Parrish Farm, agent, to Helge Stumpfegger. The third, a chestnut colt by Skip Trial--Leecoo (Lee Gary), was purchased by Richard "Red" Curtin from the consignment of Equitor Farm Inc., agent. "Without the help of the high-priced horses from the first two sessions, the average fell off slightly, but the median remained steady," commented Tom Ventura, director of sales. "As the horses are distributed throughout the catalog alphabetically, the top horses are sold randomly. We expect some higher priced horses as we wrap up the sale." The sale's fourth and final session will be held today.

### Saturday, May 4, Churchill Downs:

#### KENTUCKY DERBY-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo, 1 1/4m

Early Kentucky Derby favorite **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled) worked six furlongs in 1:14 4/5 over a sloppy Churchill Downs track Wednesday morning with regular jockey Mike Smith up. Splits on the work were :25 3/5, :49 4/5, 1:01 4/5 and the colt galloped out seven-eighths in 1:28. "I was glad with the way he went over the racetrack," Smith said. "I have found that some take to this track and some don't. You can tell in the mornings, at least with some that I have ridden here, that I didn't care for the way they went over it and it seems to carry over to the afternoon." Trainer Jim Ryerson said Unbridled's Song would breeze two or three days before the Derby and would be schooled in the paddock two or three times. One of those trips to the paddock will occur Saturday, opening day at Churchill.

Derby hopefuls **Cavonnier** (Batonnier), **Corker** (Festin {Arg}), and **Built for Pleasure** (Homebuilder) also worked Wednesday morning. Santa Anita Derby winner Cavonnier went six furlongs in 1:13 3/5, while Corker covered the same distance in 1:14 2/5. Built for Pleasure breezed seven furlongs in 1:28. Jockey Aaron Gryder was up for the work, but Built for Pleasure will be partnered with John Velazquez for the Run for the Roses. It will be Velazquez's first Derby mount.

The Bob Baffert-trained **Semorán** (Phone Trick), winner of the Remington Park Derby but most recently sixth in the Blue Grass, will start next in the Gill Derby Trial Saturday. Should the colt run a strong race there, Baffert would consider running him back the next week in the Derby.

Trainer Bill Mott reported that Gill Flamingo S. winner **El Amante** (Wild Again) is doubtful for the Derby. "The Illinois Derby (May 11 at Sportsman's Park) would be my preference, but I have to talk to the owners," Mott said. "If it were left up to me, I'd pass. He's behind in his work." Also removed from Derby consideration was **E.C.'s Dream** (Incinderator).

The short field of five, in post position order, is as follows: **Takeawakatlove** (Miswaki), Sellers; **Sunny Sunrise** (Sunny's Halo), Smith; **Knockadoon** (Dixieland Band), Bailey; **Halo's Image** (Halo), Day; **Thorny Crown** (Garthorn), Luzzi.

Halo's Image is dropping down in class after dueling on the front end then tiring to be fourth in the GI Oaklawn H. April 6. He retains the services of Pat Day. Sunny Sunrise, winner of the Ben Ali S. in 1993, will try for his second victory in the event. The nine-year-old veteran went wire-to-wire to take the GIII John B. Campbell H. at Pimlico in his last outing April 6; finishing third in that race was fellow Ben Ali starter Knockadoon.

**GANAY HEATS UP** Sunday's Prix Ganay, the first G1 race of the European season, could turn out to be one of the best races of the year for older horses. After yesterday's first forfeit stage, 15 horses have stood their ground, including 1995 Prix de Diane heroine **Carling (Fr)** (Garde Royale {Ire}), 1995 Dubai Champion S. winner **Spectrum (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest), 1995 Italian Derby winner **Luso (GB)** (Salse) and the recent G2 Prix d'Harcourt winner **Valanour (Ire)** (Lomond). The full 15 also include: **De Quest (GB)** (Rainbow Quest), **Flemensfirth (Alleged)**, **Singspiel (Ire)** (In the Wings {GB}), **Swain (Ire)** (Nashwan), **Tot Ou Tard (Ire)** (Robellino), **Diamond Mix (Ire)** (Linamix {Fr}), **Slicious (GB)** (Slip Anchor {GB}), **Marildo (Fr)** (Romildo {GB}), **Prince Arthur (Ire)** (Fairy King), **Gunboat Diplomacy (Fr)** (Dominion {GB}) and **Muncie (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). Three of the English horses still engaged--Flemensfirth, Singspiel and Prince Arthur --are not expected to run, however.

**FRESHMAN SIRE FIRSTS** Two freshman sires of 1996 had their first winners yesterday. **I Ain't Bluffing**, a two-year-old daughter of 1992 Preakness S. winner **Pine Bluff** (Danzig), won the third race at Keeneland, a 4½-furlong maiden special weight, by three lengths as the 5-2 second choice. **I Ain't Bluffing**, bred in Louisiana by Rolling Hills Farm, is owned by Jan, Mace and Samantha Siegel and trained by Don Divine. In the fourth race at Golden Gate yesterday, also at 4½-furlongs, the filly **Market Designer** became the first winner for her freshman sire **For Really** (Buckaroo). **Market Designer**, who went wire-to-wire to win by ½-length as the 8-5 favorite, was bred in Washington by Nick and Alexis Tomanelli and is owned and trained by Jerry Hollendorfer.

Apprentice jockey Ricardo Antonio Wloka scored his first career triumph Wednesday at Hialeah in the second race aboard **Rule Nisi** (Carload). Wloka is the son of Ricardo Gerardo Wloka, who also rides at Hialeah Park.

### Local News, Ontario:

The Ontario Jockey Club announced yesterday that, effective this Friday, April 26, exacta wagers involving two parts of an entry will no longer be offered at its tracks. Racing fans previously could include both horses in an entry in their exacta wagers. Now, if the same betting interest finishes first and second, the exacta payoff will be on horses finishing first and third. "The decision to eliminate 1 and 1A exactas will facilitate cross-border betting," said David Gorman, vice president of corporate development. "Previously, fans of Canadian racing in the United States could not bet into our exacta pools because of the differing set of wagering rules. The new regulations are now uniform across both Canada and the United States."

Trainer Bill Mott reported yesterday that he is pointing both **Geri** (Theatrical {Ire}) and **Wekiva Springs** (Runaway Groom), one-two in the GI Oaklawn H., to the GI \$600,000 Pimlico Special May 11.

**A #** will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a **@** will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a **+** will denote winners who are first-time starters, an **(S)** will be used for state-bred races and an **(R)** will be used for other restricted races.

## SWEDEN'S RACING SCENE

Who'd ever pick a gray, freezing winter day at Aqueduct for his introduction to American racing?

Bjorn Eklund did. The 48-year-old member of the Swedish Jockey Club, editor of its publication *Veckans Galopp* (Weekly Racing) and chairman of the Horseowner's National Association felt right at home during his visit to the Big A in early March.

"It's my first time to the races in America. I've been to the races in many parts of the world, but I felt it was essential to see the world's leading racing nation and I was very curious to see Aqueduct. Our race course in Stockholm, Taby, is modeled on this track, though Aqueduct is quite a bit bigger. And we race through the winter in Sweden as well," said Eklund in lightly-accented, near-perfect English. "The track oval in particular is modelled on Aqueduct's though Taby's track is a mile. Recently Joe King (former NYRA track superintendent) came over and gave us a lot of good advice on improving the drainage for the track."

The Aqueduct-styled dirt track took hold in Sweden after several unsuccessful attempts in creating an all-weather racing surface that could be used in place of the turf during the Scandinavian winter.

"Up until the '80's we raced on a track covered with straw, but it could be dangerous and slippery. We experimented with wood chips and still use them on training tracks, but we eventually moved to a dirt track like you use in America," Eklund said.

In addition to the American-style surface under the horses hooves are the American-style jockeys on their backs.

"We've had Willie Shoemaker, Corey Nakatani and Julie Krone ride over here and they've been very popular," Eklund said. "Corey Nakatani in particular made a big impression over there. The Swedish jockeys tend to mold themselves on American riders. They have a crunched style and sit low over the horse. We're very proud of our champion Swedish rider, Fredrik Johannson, who has been doing well riding in Hong Kong."

Many foreign riders have done well in Sweden, according to Eklund. "We've had some good English riders here and for some reason many of the top riders on the Scandinavian circuit have traditionally come from Hungary," he said, adding, "Now more young women are riding in Sweden.

About 30 percent of our jockeys are women."

Between the two main tracks of Taby and Malmo and a couple of country meets, Sweden stages just 75 days of racing and has a Thoroughbred racing population of about 1,100--about half of which are Swedish-breds. There is no simulcasting yet and off-track betting is state-run. Swedish racing stands on the fringes of the European racing scene, and on the Swedish sporting scene as well, Eklund acknowledged.

"I hesitate to even refer to a Swedish Thoroughbred *industry*--that's a strong word for us. We're proud, though, that Sweden is the only country in Europe outside of the five pattern race countries that has a Group race," Eklund said. "That's the Stockholm Cup. It's a mile and a half race with a purse of a million Swedish Crowns (\$147,984 U.S.) and is held at Taby on the first Sunday in September. We get horses from several European countries for it. Our other big million crown races are the Swedish Derby and the Breeders' Trophy, both run at Malmo in August."

In Sweden, though, the trotters get top billing, but Eklund pointed out that they help pay the bills.

"In Sweden the betting is run by a government tote board. The gallops (Thoroughbreds) get about 10 percent of profits generated by betting on the trotters," he said.

Conversation concluded, the professorial-looking Eklund returned his attention to the racing program in his hands, hoping that his translating skills would extend to deciphering past performance lines.

## FOALING NEWS:
