CHURCHILL DOWNS OPENS TODAY Churchill Downs opens its 122nd spring season of Thoroughbred racing this afternoon, kicking off an eight-day festival of racing that begins with today's GIII Derby Trial and culminates in the 122nd running of the GI Kentucky Derby May 4. Headed by record purses for the Derby and May 3 Kentucky Oaks, the Louisville oval will present the richest stakes program in track history during its 48-day season. The Derby boasts a guaranteed purse of \$1 million for the first time, while the Oaks will be run for a record \$500,000; a total of \$4.05 million will be offered for the 26 added-money events on the schedule. Two new bets have been added to the Churchill wagering menu; fans can now bet on the Derby/Oaks double, attempting to pick the winners of both races; a Superfecta, requiring a handicapper to select the first four finishers, in order, in a given race, will be available throughout the meet. The Spring meeting closes June 30.

THREE CHIMNEYS TO SPONSOR SPINSTER STAKES Three Chimneys Farm will sponsor the GI Spinster S. at Keeneland, beginning this fall with the 41st running Sunday, Oct. 6. The Midway, Kentucky farm, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Robert N. Clay, has entered into a multi-year commitment to sponsor the race, which has been renamed the Three Chimneys Spinster. The value of the Spinster previously had been increased from \$300,000-added to \$500,000-added. The 1 1/8-mile event is one of America's most important weight-for-age stakes races exclusively for fillies and mares. On the day of the Spinster, every other race on Keeneland's program will be named in honor of one of Three Chimneys nine stallions--Capote, Chief's Crown, Dynaformer, Fly So Free, French Deputy, Rahy, Seattle Slew, Slew o' Gold and Wild Again. "Three Chimneys is delighted to be associated with the Spinster's long and distinguished history," Clay said. "It has become arguably the most significant fall prep race for the Breeders' Cup Distaff, certainly befitting our philosophy that 'The Idea Is Excellence.'" Three Chimneys is the first horse farm to sponsor a stakes race at Keeneland. Two other Keeneland stakes are sponsored--the Toyota Blue Grass and the Ashland S., sponsored by Ashland Inc.

KENTUCKY DERBY-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo, 1 1/4m
Trainer Bob Baffert said yesterday that Remington Park Derby winner **Semoran** (Phone Trick) will be scratched from today's GIII Derby Trial and will instead train up to the Kentucky Derby. "We had a meeting (Thursday) and they (owners Donald Dizney and James English) asked if the horse was doing good, and I said he was doing great," Baffert said. "The Derby has always been in their plans. They were raised in Kentucky and love Kentucky. The horse is doing good, so we decided to take a shot." Baffert had said Wednesday that he would prefer a race over a work for Semoran prior to the Derby. Asked why he changed his mind Friday, the trainer said, "I'm like the weather here."

Fountain of Youth winner **Built for Pleasure** (Homebuilder), seventh in the GIII Flamingo S. in his last start April 6, will race in blinkers for the first time in the Derby. "He tended to look around quite a bit so we galloped him two days in blinkers and he quit playing around and got really focused," said owner/trainer Tommy Heard.

STRONG FINISH FOR OBS SALE The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company completed the 1996 April Spring Two-Year-Olds In Training Sale Thursday, maintaining the strong pace established through the first three days of the auction. Thursday's fourth and final session saw the average rise 11.5 percent, to \$15,648, and the gross increased by over \$1 million, to \$2,581,900, compared to last year's closing day. A colt by Valid Appeal out of MSW Miss Running Vany (Run-away Groom) topped the final session, bringing a bid of \$200,000 from John Patitucci of Miami, with Harry Benson acting as his agent; he was consigned by Cecil and Ojia Stewart, agents. Overall, a total of 680 horses sold for a gross of \$10,517,300, nearly \$3 million higher than last year's sale, an increase of nearly 40 percent. Despite an additional 276 horses offered this year, the average rose 11.5 percent, to \$15,466, and the median was up five percent, to \$10,500. These figures followed increases of approximately 25 percent in the average and median during last year's event. "While we were not able to match the figures of the Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis auction, we still sold over \$10 million worth of horses and are very pleased with the results of the sale," said Tom Ventura, director of sales. "The market withstood the large number of horses that were offered and still showed gains in the average and median."

MINNESOTA MAC DEAD Tartan Farms-bred and raced **Minnesota Mac** (Rough'n Tumble) died April 25 at the Ocala, Florida farm where he was foaled, raised, trained and stood stud at. The 32-year-old stallion had been a pensioner at Tartan Farms since 1984. Winner of the \$75,000 Chicagoan H. in 1967, Minnesota Mac was named after the founder of Tartan Farms, William L. McKnight, who originally hailed from St. Paul, Minnesota. At stud, Minnesota Mac sired 18 stakes-winners; his progeny earned over \$8 million. Among his best runners were 1978 Champion Grass Horse Mac Diarmida; MGSW's Honey Fox and Minnesota Chief; and GSW's Great Above, My Mac, Tuxedo Mac, Virilify, Katonka and Mini Gift.
