HOLLYWOOD GETS INCREASE FROM

NEVADA CASINOS Hollywood Park has reached an agreement with Nevada outlets and will begin sending the signal of its races to Nevada in time for tonight's card. The agreement covers only the current spring/summer meeting. "This is a single-meeting deal only," Hollywood Park Chairman R.D. Hubbard said. "The reason we settled is any additional increase would have required approval from the Nevada Gaming Commission. That would have taken 30 to 60 days and the meeting would have been over. We'll continue to discuss an increase for the fall meeting with the Gaming Commission. We thank our fans for bearing with us through this difficult negotiation period." Hollywood Park received a commission of 3% on win/place/show and 3.5% on all other wagers from Nevada racebooks in 1995. The commission is now 3.5% on all wagers. Hollywood Park, which opened its 67-day spring/summer meeting last Friday, did not send its signal to Nevada during the first five days of racing.

NEW DERBY POST-POSITION DRAW IN 1997?

Churchill Downs officials confirmed yesterday that there have been talks about changing the entire format for the post position draw for the Kentucky Derby. Impressed by the popularity of the NBA draft, Churchill President and CEO Tom Meeker thought that the post draw for the Derby could use the same type of formula. Instead of drawing post positions, there would be a lottery. The owner of the first horse drawn would choose whatever post he or she wanted. Each successive horse drawn would then be given whatever remaining post position his or her owner chose. Meeker is considering making the change in the future. "It's one of the most innovative ideas I've ever heard for the Derby," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas.

BIG DROP IN BRITISH PRIZE MONEY FUNDS

Britain's Horserace Betting Levy Board, which derives the vast majority of its funds from deductions on wagers in off-course betting shops, is to make a 4.7 percent cut in its projected allocation of prize money for 1997. There has been a huge decline in gambling on British horseracing following the introduction of a National Lottery some 18 months ago and this has resulted in a deficit on the Board's revenue account of approximately \$7.75 million. Next year's Levy allocation for prize money (split 60-40 between flat and jump racing) will therefore amount to about \$43.3 million. This figure is down \$2.1 million from 1996.

Saturday, Churchill Downs:

KENTUCKY DERBY-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo, 1 1/4m

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas has named Aaron Gryder to ride **Honour and Glory** (Relaunch) in Saturday's 122nd Run for the Roses. It will be the second Derby mount for Gryder, who rode Mi Cielo to a 14th-place finish in 1993.

Favorite **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled) walked for an hour under the shedrow with trainer Jim Ryerson Thursday morning following his half-mile work Wednesday. Buzz Chace, racing manager for owner Ernie Paragallo's Paraneck Stable, reported that things were looking good for the Florida Derby and Wood Memorial winner. "He had a nice work yesterday and came out of it fine," Chace said Thursday. "He ate all his oats and is a very happy horse this morning. Since Tuesday, he has improved, going forward all the way. As it stands right now, it looks like we are in the thick of it." Chace said the two bar shoes remain on Unbridled's Song, but the decision to run in them probably will not be made until Saturday. "The way he worked in them yesterday, we're kind of leaning toward that," Chace said.

Former New York Yankees first baseman Don Mattingly paid a visit to trainer Nick Zito's barn at Churchill Downs yesterday. Zito is the trainer of Derby starter **Diligence** (Miswaki), who is owned by George Steinbrenner, owner of the Yankees. Mattingly and his wife were on their way to a horse show in Lexington.

FIRST FOAL FOR LET'S ELOPE The 1991-92 Australian Horse of the Year **Let's Elope (NZ)** (Nassipour) has finally produced her first foal, a filly by Danzig, at Don Robinson's Winter Quarter Farm near Lexington in Kentucky. Winner of the Caulfield Cup and Melbourne Cups in 1991 and the Australian Cup in 1992, the now nine-year-old mare was then banned from racing in Australia because of a bleeding problem. She was shipped to North America to race, where she "won" the \$500,000 GI Beverly D at Arlington Park in Chicago, only to be disqualified and placed third after a bumping incident in the stretch. She was subsequently retired from racing after sustaining a hairline fracture to her right front cannon bone. She is still owned by Dennis and Margaret Marks from Melbourne.

EPSOM DERBY "WILD CARD" UNLIKELY Officials of the British Horseracing Board appear to have little sympathy with plans to open the Epsom Derby to "wild card" entries. Some British trainers have called for changes to the current nomination stages for the Classic and racecourse executives had been considering a system within which late-developing horses might be supplemented in the last days before the event. One scheme suggested was an arrangement similar to that which operates in tennis tournaments, whereby worthy "wild card" candidates gain entry despite missing earlier acceptance deadlines. Epsom's chairman Christopher Spence was reported in Britain's Press as saying, "We are hoping very much to introduce a wild card entry. It would be a good way around a good horse missing the race and the fact that **Pentire (GB)** (Be My Guest) (winner of six of his seven races during the 1995 season) did not run last year because he was not entered did not reflect well on the race." However, John Smee, the BHB's race-planning manager, replied, "This is news to me. I have had no correspondence on the matter and anything like it would need to be done through the proper channels. It seems very radical."

CEM OUTBREAK UNDER CONTROL Britain's Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Foods is now satisfied that two outbreaks of Contagious Equine Metritis (CEM) are under control. The notifiable reproductive disease affected three stallions at two separate English studs during the past month, but following extensive veterinary tests which have found no further spread, two of the stallions have returned to normal duties. The third will not cover again this season. CEM, which is spread between stallion and mare, is a bacterial infection and has been restricted to isolated incidents in Britain for about 20 years. Several bodies, including the ministry, plus Newmarket's Animal Health Trust and Thoroughbred Breeders Association, have combined successfully to monitor this latest occurrence.

JAPANESE TARGET ROYAL ASCOT Fabulous La Fouine (Fr) (Fabulous Dancer) looks set to become the first ever Japanese-trained runner at Royal Ascot. The three-year-old filly, unbeaten in a trio of starts and already earner of around \$760,000, is one of 45 entries for the G1 Coronation S. to be run June 19. Fabulous La Fouine is owned by Mrs Kazuko Yoshida and trained by Hiroyuki Nagahama. Ascot officials have already expressed their delight at the possibility that there will be a Far Eastern flavor to the Royal fixture. Nick Cheyne, clerk of the course at the Berkshire venue, said, "Racing is becoming ever more of an international sport and to see Fabulous La Fouine entered for the race is especially pleasing. We are speaking to an agent for the filly's connections and understand they are very keen to run."
