MOONHELL TO MACHIAVELLIAN Godolphin-owned **Moonshell (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), the 1995 Epsom Oaks winner who was retired last week, is to be covered this season by **Machiavellian** (Mr. Prospector). Michael Goodbody, manager of Hamdan al Maktoum's Gainsborough Stud, revealed, "Moonshell will be bred to Machiavellian as soon as we can get her in season in the next two or three weeks." Machiavellian, based at Sheikh Mohammed's Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket, has made a good start to his career as a stallion. His first three-year-old crop included last year's Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero **Vettori (Ire)**.

NO CHANGE ON BRITISH WHIP RULES Britain's Jockey Club has issued a statement confirming that it is satisfied with the current regulations concerning jockeys' use of whips. The country's newspapers have been bulging with correspondence over the past week following Newmarket's 2000 Guineas, in which the first three riders all picked up suspensions for "misuse" owing to what was officially seen to be excessive whip-contact with their mounts in a tight finish. Frankie Dettori, successful rider on **Mark of Esteem (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}), picked up a ban of eight days; Philip Robinson, aboard short-head runner-up **Even Top (Ire)** (Topanoora {Ire}), was handed a four-day holiday; and Jason Weaver, whose third-placed **Bijou d'Inde (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) was beaten another head, found himself stood down for 48 hours. Much has been written subsequently regarding the Jockey Club Instruction H9, introduced at the beginning of 1993 to deter jockeys from over-use, in which it is stated that stewards are to consider an official inquiry into any race when a rider strikes his mount more than six times. But Anthony Mildmay-White, chairman of the Club's disciplinary committee, has denied allegations that big-race jockeys are ignoring the rules in an effort to "win at all costs" and that the solution is to disqualify horses on which riders seem to be particularly severe. His statement, issued Friday, argued this: "The standard of riding has improved considerably following the introduction of the current whip instruction. Statistics for Group One races since then (which show only four to have involved whip-related offenses) are encouraging and I see no requirement for a hasty reaction as a result of one race."

PREAKNESS S.-GI, \$500,000, 3yo, 9.5f

BAILEY BACK IN ACTION FOR PREAKNESS A day after losing his Preakness mount when Derby winner **Grindstone** (Unbridled) was retired, jockey Jerry Bailey was back on the Triple Crown trail, picking up the mount on Derby third **Prince Of Thieves** (Hansel). Bailey replaces Pat Day, who was in the saddle for the Derby and has also won the last two editions of the Preakness aboard D. Wayne Lukas-trained colts. "It's no reflection on anything," said Lukas. "It's just that Bailey was available and I think he's riding superbly right now, as was evident in the Kentucky Derby. I just made a change, like a coach starting one point guard over another." Bailey was aboard **Prince Of Thieves** when he broke his maiden last fall at Aqueduct. "It's good news. I always liked him," said Bailey.

SKIP AWAY PROBABLE FOR PREAKNESS Blue Grass winner **Skip Away** (Skip Trial), a disappointing 12th in the Derby, is "90 percent probable" for the Preakness, according to trainer Sonny Hine. "He really picked up the bit (Friday) morning," said Hine from his barn at Monmouth Park. "He really got tired in the Derby. He tried all the way, but he was laboring the whole time. He'd been pretty quiet for a few days, but he's back into his feed tub real good. I probably won't make a final decision until Monday or so, but it looks good."

MIXED COUNT SHARP AT LAUREL **Mixed Count** (Polish Numbers), third last out in the GIII Federico Tesio S., worked seven furlongs in 1:27 2/5 at Laurel Park Thursday in a prep for the second jewel in the Triple Crown. "He galloped out the mile in about 1:41," said trainer Ron Benshoff. "It was a good work. He's had a race over the track (at Pimlico), so I'll just train him up to the race here and ship over that morning."

UNBRIDLED'S SONG POSSIBLE FOR

MASSCAP? If he can't make the Preakness May 18, and if his connections don't opt for the Met Mile May 27, there is now word that **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled) could make his next start in the Massachusetts H. at Suffolk Downs June 1. "We're aware of the race and the bonus," said trainer Jim Ryerson. "Since Unbridled's Song has a couple of Grade I wins, we would certainly have to make this race an option." The MassCap bonus would offer the colt an additional \$200,000 over the winner's share of the \$250,000 purse. "It's our understanding that the first goal for Unbridled's Song is the Preakness," said Suffolk Downs Executive Vice President Lou Raffetto. "However, his connections have indicated to us that they are strongly considering the MassCap if he's not ready to go next Saturday." Pointing in that direction would require making a somewhat dubious decision to face superstar **Cigar** (Palace Music).

GARY JONES NAMED COBRA GOLF/TDN

SUBSCRIBER OF THE MONTH Trainer Gary Jones, who retired April 22 after saddling the earners of more than \$52 million, has been named the Cobra Golf/Thoroughbred Daily News Subscriber of the Month for April, it was announced yesterday. Jones will receive a set of King Cobra golf clubs, the country's leading oversize irons and woods, in recognition of the honor. The 51-year-old trainer capped his career with a pair of graded stakes wins, taking the closing day feature at the Santa Anita meeting, the GIII San Simeon H. April 22, with the last starter he saddled, **Ski Dancer** (Baldski), and the GII Santa Barbara H. with **Auriette** (Ire) (Caerleon) April 20. Cobra chairman Gary Biszantz has known Biszantz since he got started in racing, taking over the stable from his father, Farrell Jones, in 1975. "I have the highest respect for Gary Jones," said Biszantz. "We're all disappointed to see him step away from the game, but it's a tough business and it takes its toll. My advice to Gary would be, 'take the time off, get your golf game sharpened up, and get ready for a comeback because you have too much talent to leave it on the sidelines'." Jones, who closed out his career with 1,457 winners, said he hoped to be able to use the new clubs in his retirement. "I'd like to sincerely thank Gary Biszantz for this award," said Jones, who has retired to Del Mar. "I don't play right now, but I think it's probably time I started with this retirement stuff. It's either that or start cutting out paper dolls. I just know everytime I shipped someplace from California, every racing secretary or racing executive said you've got to get yourself a set of those golf clubs."

MISS ALLEGED FOALS Eclipse Award winner and French champion **Miss Alleged** (Alleged), winner of the 1991 Breeders' Cup Turf and \$1,532,500, foaled a bay colt by Storm Cat at Lexington's Fares Farm May 6. It was the nine-year-old mare's third foal; her first, a colt by Danzig, was the highest-priced colt at the 1995 Keeneland July Yearling sales, bringing \$950,000. **Miss Alleged**, who is also owned by Fares Farm, will be bred back to Storm Cat.

DAILY RACING FORM NAMES NEW PRESIDENT

William J. Dow, a member of the *Daily Racing Form* staff for 38 years, has been named the company's new president and chief executive officer, it was announced Thursday. Dow, a native of Toronto, Canada, started with the *Form* in 1958 while attending college; he had held the position of chief operating officer since 1992.

THORO-GRAPH ANALYSIS OF THE ILLINOIS DERBY

As a lot of people have found out the hard way, it's very difficult to show a profit owning racehorses. The key to success lies not just in choosing good stock, but in managing it to maximum effect.

We were behind the purchase of **Connecting Terms** (Private Terms) by Prestonwood late last year, and while the heavies in the division were butting heads in Florida, California and the Kentucky Derby, we were ducking, diving and running second in four straight stakes.

We have avoided the big boys in the Illinois Derby as well. **Connecting Terms** has been gradually improving, with a lifetime best Thoro-Graph figure of 8 1/2 in his last. Because he didn't win any of those stakes, he gets 12 pounds, worth five lengths, at this distance, from highweight **El Amante** (Wild Again). The competition could come from **Instant Friendship** (Cormorant) and **Bold Lachee** (Apalachee), both of whom are developing rapidly and also get a big break in the weights.

The Thoro-Graph play is a win bet on **Connecting Terms** and a three-horse box using **Instant Friendship** and **Bold Lachee**. *The Thoro-Graph handicapper's line offers analyses and suggested plays for six major tracks daily. 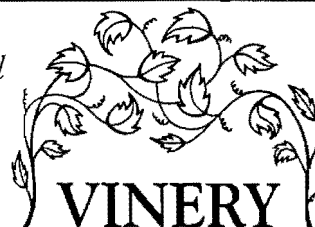
