### KEENELAND SCHEDULES TWO JULY

**EVENING SESSIONS** Horses in Keeneland's 1996 July 15-16 Selected Yearling Sale will be sold during two evening sessions, officials announced Wednesday. The sessions will start at 7:30 pm (EDT). Director of Sales Rogers Beasley said approximately 220 yearlings will be cataloged for the 53rd annual auction. Beasley said it was the "consensus of the consignors to consolidate the sale into two evening sessions." Last year's sale was held during afternoon and evening sessions.

### CALDER TO BEGIN MEET WITH RECORD

**PURSE STRUCTURE** Predicated upon legislative approval of full-card simulcasting in Florida, Calder President Ken Dunn announced yesterday that the Miami track will begin its 1996 meet offering the highest purses in its 26-year history, including a substantial increase for two-year-old Florida-breds in maiden special weight races as well as other races for freshmen and sophomore runners. The daily average purse outlay will now be \$140,000, which includes over \$110,000 in overnight purses. "We are optimistic that the recently passed legislation allowing full-card simulcasting will enhance our purse structure at Calder," Dunn said. "It's also extremely important to reward Florida breeders and owners who are the lifeblood of racing not just at Calder, but for the other tracks as well." New this year will be increased Florida Owners' Awards (FOA) monies, most notably in two-year-old maiden special weight races. The base purse for such races will be \$14,000, but with FOA and Canadian Fund monies (derived from Canadian simulcasting revenue during the Tropical meet), there will be an additional \$6,500 for winners who are bred in Florida and an additional \$2,475 if the owner is also the breeder. All subsequent purse increases will be allocated to the three-year-olds and up category. The Calder meet begins Friday, May 24.

Kentucky Derby runner-up **Cavonnier** (Batonnier) flew from Louisville to Baltimore Wednesday morning, arriving at Pimlico's stable area shortly after noon. "Sixty days ago, I never even thought I'd be going to the Kentucky Derby with him," trainer Bob Baffert said. "Now he's the Preakness favorite. That's quite a turnaround for this horse. As far as the Kentucky Derby and the Santa Anita Derby, he was a bit of an unknown. Now the element of surprise is gone. They know he's a good horse now. Other jockeys know he's the horse to beat. He'll be a super marked horse." Baffert added that the gelding will return to Churchill Downs after Saturday's race to train for the June 8 Belmont S.

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas has named Rene Douglas to ride **Victory Speech** (Deputy Minister). Douglas, who has earned over \$25 million in his riding career, has appeared in just one prior Triple Crown event. He rode Fortune's Gone to a 10th-place finish in the 1992 Preakness. Regarding the post positions for his trainees **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner) and **Prince of Thieves** (Hansel), Lukas said, "I don't think I drew very good on the outside horses. At Pimlico, the draw is more important than it is at the Derby. It's a shorter run to the turn. But we've got good riders; we'll make the best of it." Lukas added that he and his three Preakness starters are scheduled to depart Louisville at approximately 10 or 10:30 a.m. Thursday morning.

**Tour's Big Red** (Tour d'Or), who travelled more miles than any of his rivals to get to Pimlico for the Preakness, checked into the stable area at 10 a.m. Wednesday after a van ride of approximately 18 hours from Miami's Calder Race Course.

Jockey Richard Migliore, who has ridden **Feather Box** (Cherokee Colony) in the colt's last seven starts, took off the Wood Memorial S. fifth-place finisher for the Preakness to ride newcomer **Allied Forces** (Miswaki). In his first U.S. start May 4, Allied Forces won the \$75,000 Woodlawn S. over the Pimlico turf. Trainer Angel Cordero Jr. has named Jorge Velasquez to ride Feather Box this Saturday.

Trainer Nick Zito and his owners decided Wednesday to start only **Louis Quatorze** (Sovereign Dancer) in the Preakness, reserving DILIGENCE (Miswaki) for the May 26 Peter Pan S. at Belmont and SARATOGA DANDY (Saratoga Six) for the Sir Barton S. on the Preakness undercard.

#### PIMLICO HONORS LUKAS WITH SPECIAL

**AWARD OF MERIT** Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who has saddled the past six winners of Triple Crown races, will be honored by Pimlico Race Course with the distinguished Special Award of Merit. "Wayne's accomplishments in the Triple Crown races speak volumes," said Pimlico President and CEO Joseph De Francis. "Of course, Wayne could add to this record by winning the 121st Preakness Saturday." Pimlico will also honor George Michael of WRC-TV in Washington, D.C. as well as the nationally syndicated George Michael Sports Machine, and *Racing Post* turf writer Dan Farley. Both will receive Old Hilltop Awards. Sportswriter Bill Finley of the *New York Daily News* is the recipient of the David F. Woods Memorial Award, which has been presented annually since 1982 to the writer of the best Preakness story from the previous year. Finley's piece, entitled "Cool Hand Lukas," chronicled the trainer's victory with Timber Country in the 1995 Preakness. The awards ceremony is part of the traditional Alibi Breakfast, which is slated for Friday at 9 a.m. in the Pimlico Dining Room. Jim McKay of ABC Sports will serve as the master of ceremonies.

#### FRANKEL NAMED APRIL TRAINER OF THE

**MONTH** Robert Frankel has been named outstanding Trainer of the Month for April. The award, a featured segment of ESPN's weekly program, *Racehorse Digest*, is co-sponsored by Vinery Farm and United Thoroughbred Trainers of America. Frankel, a Hall-of-Fame conditioner, won four added money events with four different horses in April, including the GI San Juan Capistrano H. with Raintrap and the GI A Gleam H. with Igotrhythm. Frankel was also the leading trainer by number of stakes winners (9) at the Santa Anita winter meet which concluded April 22.

#### KENTUCKY LEADS NATION IN NUMBER OF THOROUGHBRED FOALS

Kentucky consistently leads the annual list of states producing registered Thoroughbred foals. For over 25 years, since The Jockey Club first began computerized analysis of the foal crop, Kentucky has been followed by California and Florida. In 1994, however, with Kentucky continuing to reinforce its position, Florida overtook California to become the nation's second largest producer of registered Thoroughbred foals. The figures for the 1994 foal crop are as follows: Kentucky-7,061 registered foals (20.3%); Florida-3,520 (10.12%); California-3,486 (10.02%); Texas-2,322; Oklahoma-1,472; Louisiana-1,456; Illinois-1,173; New York-1,163; Maryland-1,153; Washington-1,144; Pennsylvania-809; Ohio-720; other states-6,127. The total registered U.S. foal crop for '94 numbers 31,606. Including the 2,553 Thoroughbreds foaled in Canada and 619 in Puerto Rico, the total North American registered crop for 1994 comes to 34,778.

#### GRAND PLANS FOR 'STAND'-LESS TRACKS IN AUSTRALIA.

A private company, teleTrak Australia Pty Ltd, has announced its plans to build four racetracks in rural locations around Australia, designed to lure not spectators, but phone bettors from around the world. Organizers said the tracks will be straight all-weather synthetic tracks, suitable for racing at all distances from five furlongs to 1 1/4-miles. The tracks will not have grandstands, but "spectator lounges" suspended by steel, arch-like frameworks above the track and past the finish line allowing full view down the track. Television cameras will be positioned at various points for maximum effect, but particularly two side and front-mounted units running at high-speed on a track parallel to the running. teleTrak's four intended "television racecourses" will have no on-course wagering or tote facilities, but access to off-course contracted licensed tote operators. The tracks will be geographically located for a two-season circuit, southern and northern seasons, with the southern season running from October 1 to March 31 and the northern from April 1 to late September. Each will be a stand-alone facility, with stabling for 1000 horses, training tracks and other services. Newly appointed Marketing Director John Hodgman said teleTrak's aim is to penetrate the betting markets of the 16 time-zone friendly nations. "Betting will be done on the basis of a toll-free telephone number or through interactive television wagering from home," Hodgman said. teleTrak has earmarked \$7.5 million (AUS) in its annual budget to purchase horses to race at its tracks. Hodgman would not identify the project's backers by name, saying only that they were a syndicate of investors, 80 per cent of who were based in Australia, the rest from Asia and Europe.

**GUINEAS DUO SET FOR SPRINTS** Danehill Dancer (Ire) (Danehill) and Royal Applause (GB) (Waajib), sixth and 10th respectively in the English 2000 Guineas over a mile, will be raced at shorter distances for the rest of their careers. Danehill Dancer, a Group 1 winner over seven furlongs last year, is to have his next outing over that distance in Royal Ascot's G3 Jersey S. June 19. The colt's trainer Neville Callaghan stated, "I think it is fairly plain he does not get the mile. We will aim him at the July Cup (six furlongs at Newmarket) after the Jersey." Meanwhile, connections of Royal Applause are aiming their colt at the King's Stand S., a Group 2 race over five furlongs at Royal Ascot June 21. Joe Mercer, racing manager to owner Maktoum Al Maktoum, explained, "The race conditions will suit him."

The handler said, "He's in tip-top form after a recent gallop and could go to the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot (in which he finished third to subsequent Arc winner Lammtarra last season) in July." But the five-year-old, whose win in the Irish St. Leger earned him his place as top long-distance colt of '95, faces a tough challenge on his comeback. Lining up against him will be last season's English St. Leger winner Classic Cliche.

The Leo O'Brien-trainee, undefeated in three career starts, will be making her stakes debut in the Acorn. "I tend to fuss over her a bit more than the others because she appears to be a little bit special," O'Brien said. "I've never had a horse who's been this good on the dirt."

Prompted by a piece of martingale that came loose and flapped against her stomach, Nassau County S. runner-up **STOP TRAFFIC** (Cure the Blues) went a half-mile in an eye-opening :46.51 Monday under jockey Robbie Davis. "I was looking for :48 and change, but with that piece of leather flapping against her, Robbie had no choice," said trainer Rick Schosberg. "She came out of it great and I'm very happy with her."

**Local News, Churchill Downs:**

The highly touted three-year-old **Dr. Caton** (Seattle Slew), who is coming off minor throat surgery, worked six furlongs in 1:15 2/5 over a sloppy Churchill Downs track Wednesday morning. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas said he may start Dr. Caton at Churchill before running him in the Gill Dwyer July 6 at Belmont.

Churchill Downs Inc. (NASDAQ:CHDN) yesterday announced results for the first quarter ended March 31, 1996. First quarter revenues for 1996 were \$11,550,753, versus \$8,612,607 for the corresponding period last year. First quarter performance was offset primarily by start-up expenses associated with the operation of two additional Sports Spectrums in Indiana. Churchill Downs reported a net loss of \$2,073,213, or 55 cents per share, as compared to \$1,772,277, or 47 cents per share, in 1995. The Company historically incurs a net loss during its first quarter, when no live racing is conducted at Churchill Downs or Hoosier Park.

**Local News, Retama Park:**

Retama Park's new dirt racetrack, which cost an estimated \$250,000, was open for training for the first time Monday, May 13. "The entire renovation procedure went as scheduled and we are pleased with what is now on the ground," said Track Consultant Dennis Moore. "Horsemen will see a marked improvement in the racing surface." Retama Park's 66-day Thoroughbred season opens June 8.

### Local News, Lone Star Park:

Now that officials at Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie have opened their Post Time Pavilion with simulcast attendance and handle numbers exceeding expectations, attention is being turned to continued construction of the \$96 million track near Dallas and Fort Worth, Texas. The pouring of piers for the grandstand began Tuesday, and construction on the barn area and racing surface is expected to begin soon as well. Lone Star General Manager Corey Johnsen told the *Dallas Morning News* that Lone Star is on schedule to have most of its barn area and racetrack built by the end of October. Johnsen said he does not expect the grandstand to be fully completed when the track conducts its 11-day live race meet in December, but expects no problems with the existing Pavilion and temporary facilities planned. Through the first eight days of operation, the Lone Star Pavilion has averaged \$601,038 in handle from 3,257 daily fans.

Glory of Dancer was installed the favorite for the Epsom Derby after his half-length victory here. Jockey Olivier Peslier was content to sit quietly at the back of the field as Jack Jennings set a steady gallop and, for a few seconds a quarter of a mile from home, it looked as if he might have trouble passing the leaders. However, the French-based jockey switched his mount off the rails and squeezed through a gap to score over the fast-finishing Dushyantor. Jack Jennings battled on gamely to retain third place in front of pre-race Derby favorite **NASH HOUSE (IRE)** (Nashwan), who appeared not to stay the extended ten furlongs. Successful trainer Paul Kelleway was delighted by the result. "He is a lazy horse and I would have preferred a stronger pace," he said. "But there must be a lot of improvement to come from Glory of Dancer, as he is laid back at home and only lights up when he gets onto the track. He loves the rough and tumble of tough races, though, and I'm sure he has a big chance at Epsom." Connections of Dushyantor, however, are more than hopeful of reversing form June 8. Handler Henry Cecil insisted, "He ran a very good race, but will improve a lot for the extra distance in the Derby."
