RIVER DOWNS TRACK FLOODS; RACING

CANCELLED After a winter that caused plenty of snow and low temperature cancellations, rain is the new culprit in Ohio. Cincinnati was hit with heavy rains the past few days which caused the Ohio River to flood its banks and River Downs' track. As a result, River Downs cancelled four racing cards from Thursday through Monday. Approximately 1,000 Thoroughbreds were evacuated from the grounds in anticipation of continued rains; waters from the Ohio River have a predicted cresting level of 56.5 feet. "While we and Turfway Park are often competitors in the Cincinnati market, when it comes to the care of the horses and horsemen, we are on the same team," said River Downs General Manager Jack Hanessian. River Downs contacted Turfway officials early Thursday morning and they gave the green light to an evacuation plan that shipped about 400 of the horses at River Downs to Turfway for stabling and training. Some trainers opted to ship their horses to local farms or training facilities. There was no flooding on the River Downs backstretch and the horses were able to be transported without incident.

MICK'S LOVE COULD STILL AIM FOR EPSOM

Mick's Love (Ire) (Law Society), unbeaten in three career starts, is still a possible for the Epsom Derby June 8. The Godolphin-owned colt, most recently victor of the listed Newmarket S. in his '96 reappearance May 3, was nominated for the Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly. But, with no obvious superstar emerging from Britain's Classic trials, connections of Mick's Love may reconsider their options. Simon Crisford, racing manager for Godolphin, said, "The reason we named the French race as his likely target was mainly down to the course and ground at Chantilly. You normally expect to get some cut there and we were not certain how he would handle Epsom. But the owners have always wanted to wait for all the trials to be run and the door is still open. We'll just have to wait and see what the weather is like for the Derby meeting." Crisford confirmed that 2000 Guineas winner **Mark Of Esteem (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}) is Godolphin's number one Derby contender at this stage. "He has come out of the Guineas very well," Crisford added, "and will go straight to Epsom. We don't know yet if he will stay the mile and a half, but we hope he will travel well throughout the race and then go all the way to the line."

Saturday, Pimlico Race Course:

PREAKNESS S.-GI, \$704,800, 3yo, 1 3/16m

Maryland-based **Mixed Count** (Polish Numbers), winner of the Private Terms S. at Laurel March 30 before finishing third in the GIII Federico Tesio S. at Pimlico April 20, blew out three-eighths in :35 1/5 Thursday over a muddy Laurel Park track. "He really went super," trainer Ron Benschhoff said. "He loved the mud. I wish they were running the race (Preakness) over here today. He was that impressive. He came back bucking and playing. I couldn't have asked for him to go any better. As we get closer to the race, I'm feeling more and more confident." Benschhoff added, "I think **Cavonnier** (Batonnier) is strictly the horse to beat."

In Contention (Devil's Bag), 15th in the Kentucky Derby, drilled a half-mile in :47 1/5 at his Philadelphia Park base Tuesday. The GII Wood Memorial runner-up will ship to Pimlico Saturday morning. "We figured we'd give him another chance," said trainer Cynthia Reese. "We wanted to look at some other spots for him, but when you have a chance to run in this kind of race you have to take it. If he jumps up into the money, we'd have to look at the Belmont."

Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin was surprised to see **Allied Forces** (Miswaki), a stakes-winner in the U.S. and England, at 30-1 on the Preakness morning line. "I thought he'd be 15-1," he said. Though he had hoped for a post between 2 and 7, McLaughlin said the rail would be fine. "He has speed, enough tactical speed to be in position early. He won't be on the lead, but he'll be able to lay somewhere between third and sixth early."

FIRST APPEAL FOR PAT DAY Jockey Pat Day is appealing a suspension for the first time in his career. Day, who will bid for his third straight Preakness win when he rides Louis Quatorze at Pimlico Saturday, was disqualified after finishing first aboard **Gonna Shine** (Baederwood) in the eighth race at Churchill Downs Sunday; he was handed a five-day suspension by the Churchill stewards for causing interference in that race. "In my opinion, this is a tremendous injustice," said Day. "I understand the reason to disqualify my horse, but a suspension is not warranted."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

Twist Afleet (Afleet), winner of her last five starts, including the GIII Vagrancy H. in her '96 debut May 4, will definitely start next in the GI Shuvee H. over a mile at Belmont May 25, according to trainer John Kimmel. The five-year-old mare breezed five furlongs Thursday in 1:01 4/5.

Trainer Shug McGaughey said that GII Jim Beam winner **Roar (Forty Niner),** third as the favorite in the GII Withers S. at Belmont May 11, probably will not start again until later this summer, possibly at Saratoga. "I'm going to back off him for a while," McGaughey said.

George Weaver, D. Wayne Lukas's assistant trainer in New York, said yesterday there is "definite consideration" for **Honour and Glory (Relaunch)** to run in the May 27 Met Mile. The three-year-old colt, 18th of 19 in the Kentucky Derby, last visited the winners' circle after a one-mile event, the GII San Rafael S. at Santa Anita March 2.

Jockey Kerwin "Boo Boo" Clark, who had been riding in Saudi Arabia for the last three years, has returned from the Middle East and will begin riding at Arlington. Clark, 37, rode for 14 years on the Chicago circuit before signing a contract to ride in Saudi Arabia at the beginning of 1993. Of the Saudi experience, Clark said, "It's a different culture, a different religion. But I rode some of the best horses I've ever ridden. When you first get there everything is new and exciting, but after a while there's not that many things to do." Clark was originally accompanied on the trip by his wife Samantha and 15-year-old daughter, Samara, but Samara returned to the States after a year-and-a-half and lived with her grandparents in Arkansas. "It's tough on women over there," said Clark. "They have no rights. My wife had to cover her head and wear what looks like a black gown. Women can't drive a car. It was difficult, but financially it was good. My contract was good and the purse money was okay, so it worked out good."

A.V. Eight (Wavering Monarch), a two-time stakes winner last year at two, has fully recovered from a bout with the disease equine protozoal myelitis and will make his first start of 1996 in today's feature race at Churchill. Last year's English St Leger winner Classic Cliche shrugged off a 250-day racecourse absence since that success when taking yesterday's East Coast Yorkshire Cup in course record time. But the Godolphin-owned colt collected this prize only after a titanic battle with Strategic Choice and would probably have benefited from rather more give underfoot, according to jockey Michael Kinane. Classic Cliche was held up in the early stages as GREY SHOT (GB) (Sharrood) set off in a bid to make all the running. However, Kinane slipped his mount into the lead with three furlongs left and then fought off the second for a well-deserved win. Simon Crisford, racing manager to Godolphin, stated, "He's a funny character, but very versatile. He could go back down in trip now, but Mick (Kinane) came back and said the (2 1/2-mile) Ascot Gold Cup might suit him."

Dr Massini (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) burst into the Epsom Derby picture with his victory in yesterday's Michael Seely Memorial Glasgow S. at York. The Michael Tabor-owned colt had made his first public appearance a winning one, taking a maiden race at Kempton ten days ago. In spite of making only his second start, the colt was the 6-4 favorite for this 10f 85y event, which he won by 3 1/2-lengths. The Glasgow S. has a reputation for revealing late-developing Epsom candidates--subsequent Derby hero **Commander In Chief** won it in 1993 and **Tamure** scored here before going on to finish second to **Lammtarra** in the Classic last season--so Dr Massini's chance June 8 must be respected. His odds for Epsom are down to 6-1.

Danjur (Dayjur) worked a half-mile in :50 1/5 on the turf yesterday and remains possible for the **Thirty Slews H. Sunday**. Trainer **Neil Drysdale**, leaning heavily towards running the undefeated colt in the **GIII Jaipur S.** at **Belmont Park** as late as **Wednesday**, is reportedly now reconsidering a start in the **Thirty Slews**.
