“KEY” TO TRY HIS LUCK AGAINST CIGAR Key Of Luck (Chief's Crown), second in the GI Pimlico Special in his American debut May 11, is likely to challenge 1995 Horse of the Year Cigar (Palace Music) in the Massachusetts H. at Suffolk Downs June 1. The five-year-old opened eyes when taking the Dubai Duty Free Race by 20 lengths March 27, running in a time a tick faster than Cigar's hard-fought victory in the Dubai World Cup later on the card. Trainer Kieran McLaughlin had been eyeing the GI Brooklyn H. at Belmont Park, but owner Saeed bin Maktoum al Maktoum is eager to take on the World Cup winner. Said McLaughlin, "I spoke to the owner Thursday and he wanted to know where Cigar was going; he asked if we could run against him. I said, 'sure, all we have to do is put him on a van.' He is interested to see how we stack up against Cigar." McLaughlin added that he wants to see the weights before a final decision is made.

CALDER TO OPEN WITH FULL-CARD

SIMULCASTING Calder President Ken Dunn announced yesterday that Calder Race Course will begin full-card simulcasting on opening day of the 1996 meet, Friday, May 24. Florida's Parimutuel Wagering Division Director Deborah Miller has granted temporary approval for full-card simulcasting until July 1, when new legislation allowing the simulcasts goes into effect. Calder will take Belmont Park's full card from opening day through Memorial Day, May 27, and Monmouth Park's card from May 25-27, then will alternate between Arlington, Belmont, Monmouth and Philadelphia Park, offering two tracks per day Thursdays through Mondays.

SWINBURN SETS ASCOT TARGET Walter Swinburn, the three-time Epsom Derby winning jockey seriously injured in a fall at Hong Kong's Sha Tin racecourse in February, believes he chances of returning to action by Royal Ascot are "even-money." The 34-year-old rider suffered head injuries and multiple fractures when his mount swerved and hit a running rail shortly after leaving the stalls. He has already counted himself out of this season's meeting at Epsom and has just flown out of Britain for a holiday in Jamaica. But before leaving, he stated: "I don't want to come back too early and let anyone down, so I have decided not to set a fixed date for a return and will simply let nature take its course. But I am an even-money shot to be back in time for Royal Ascot in mid-June."

Mesabi Maiden, third in a Churchill allowance in her most recent effort May 1, had taken on stakes foes just once before, finishing third in the GI Astarita S. last October. Overlooked in this field after running as the favorite in her last three starts, the daughter of 1986 Black-Eyed Susan runner-up Steel Maiden did her dam one better, rallying from midpack to catch favored Cara Rafaela and edge clear for her first stakes triumph. "The idea was to sit three or four behind the leaders and make that one run, and that's what she did," said winning jockey Mike Smith. "The ones that were handling the track were winning; fortunately I was on two horses who handled it all right." (Smith also rode Gallorette winner Aucilla--see East Report). Added owner Stuart Janney III, "I think she's showed a lot of talent, but she's had problems. Mike (Smith) said she couldn't handle the track at Churchill, and she was trouble in Florida--she threw Mike once. Shug (McGaughey) felt if we could get past the temperamental business, she'd be all right." The consistent Cara Rafaela, third in the GI Kentucky Oaks last out after finishing second in the GI Santa Anita Oaks and GI Ashland S., put a head in front at the top of the lane but could not hold off the winner.

THORO-GRAPH ANALYSIS by Jerry Brown

The Preakness features a much smaller field than the Kentucky Derby, making racing luck less an issue; and horses that were rested to be pointed for the Derby are coming back on short rest from a stressful experience.

Derby-winning jockey Jerry Bailey shifts to **Prince Of Thieves** (Hansel), further shortening the price on what is sure to be an underlay. The colt's Derby effort was a 6 1/4, slightly better than his previous race, and looked better than it was because of a favorable trip. A pair of such performances for a spring three-year-old often lead to an off race, and even a repeat of his Derby figure doesn't make him strong.

Cavonnier (Batonnier), who continues to surprise us with his development, earned the best figure in the Derby. A two-point forward move gave him a lifetime best of 4 1/2, and since spring three-year-olds tend to pair up efforts, and his pattern is healthy, a repeat seems likely. This puts him in the thick of it.

Editor's Note (Forty Niner) got a horrible trip in the Derby; his seven-wide second turn earned him a 5 1/2, close to what Grindstone got for winning. It was his fifth straight effort between 5 and 6 3/4, and any horse who runs that many good ones without bouncing is capable of running faster. He could make his breakthrough in Baltimore, and will likely get a better trip, making him Lukas' best shot to keep the streak alive.

The horse we liked in the Derby didn't run a lick. **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) had gradually moved forward, peaking with a huge 1 3/4 in the Bluegrass. We thought he had another good one in him, and we were wrong--if you want to see what a bounce looks like, look at Skip Away's sheet. The non-effort looked even worse on the racetrack, due to substantial ground loss.

The question is--what now? Skip Away clearly is the best horse in the Preakness, but will he snap right back on two weeks rest? It's tricky.

In the final analysis, the only value in the Preakness comes from throwing out the overbet Prince Of Thieves. Cobra King (Farma Way), one of the top Triple Crown prospects before injuring a tendon after the Florida Derby in March, will return to trainer Mike Puype's barn to resume training July 1. "We went to see him the other day and he looked great," said Puype, who hopes to have the three-year-old ready for a return at the Del Mar meet, but added, "I don't want to rush him. We'll see what happens."

The 122nd Kentucky Derby marked the first time that interactive home wagering was accepted on the "Run for the Roses," and the ODS Technologies system, available on TKR Cable of Greater Louisville, handled 7,573 wagers, a total of \$68,070, on Derby Day, 1996. The per capita ODS bet was \$324, with an average test home placing 36 wagers on the day, indicating that many homes hosted Derby parties and allowed family and friends to try out the system. "Our hope is that once these casual and non-racing fans are introduced, we can help create new and dedicated fans by showing them how fun and easy the ODS system is and how accessible it makes horse racing to them," said Mark Brenner, founder and president of ODS.

Local News: Colonial Downs

The Virginia Jockey Club's right to refile an appeal with the Virginia Court of Appeals over the awarding of the state's track license to Colonial Downs expired at noon Friday, and plans now call for Virginia's first pari-mutuel racetrack to open in June, 1997. Construction had been delayed during the appeal.

The Virginia Racing Commission has also approved CD Entertainment Ltd., a business controlled by investor and real estate developer Jeff Jacobs, as a general partner in Colonial Downs. Jacobs is the son of the owner of the Cleveland Indians, and is credited with helping to revitalize the Cleveland waterfront.

Local News: Rockingham Park

The New Hampshire legislature has passed a bill which allows a portion of the breakage to be used to supplement the purses at Rockingham Park, and also commissioned a study on strengthening the pari-mutuel industry in the state. The breakage, monies left over when pari-mutuel payoffs are rounded off to the nearest dime, will total \$195,000 and will be added to the purses effective July 1, giving the track an average daily purse distribution of \$77,600 during its upcoming live season, which runs June 9-October 16.

Two candidates for the GI Hollywood Turf H. May 27 worked Friday morning at Santa Anita. **Awad (Caveat)**, last year's GI Arlington Million winner and third in the San Juan Capistrano last out, went six furlongs in 1:13, while defending Turf H. champion **Earl Of Barking (Ire)** (Common Grounds {GB}) breezed seven furlongs in 1:25.
