CIGAR SHARP FOR MASSCAP Horse of the Year Cigar (Palace Music) worked seven furlongs in 1:26 at Belmont Park Monday morning and is on target for the \$250,000 Massachusetts H. at Suffolk Downs June 1. The six-year-old was clocked in fractions of :24 2/5, :48 1/5 and 1:00 1/5 with jockey Jerry Bailey in the irons. "We sent him out with a couple of other horses; I was amazed with how easily he passed them," said trainer Bill Mott.

DEATH OF SIMON WEINSTOCK Simon Weinstock, owner of 1980 King George & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. winner **Ela-Mana-Mou (Ire)** (Pitcairn {Ire}) and a string of other top-class horses, has died of cancer. He was 44. Weinstock, whose family's business was the giant industrial company General Electric, will be buried today after passing away in his sleep Saturday. Robert Sangster, a friend for many years, said: "He will be sadly missed. He had a wonderful knowledge of racing." Weinstock shared the great majority of horses with his father, Lord Arnold, and grandfather, Sir Michael Sobell. Their big-race successes included Troy (winner of the '79 Epsom Derby) and Sun Princess (heroine of both the Oaks at Epsom and the Doncaster St Leger in '83).

SWEET ALLIANCE DEAD Kentucky Oaks winner **Sweet Alliance** (Sir Ivor), the dam of European champion Shareef Dancer, was humanely destroyed due to complications after foaling a colt by Hansel at Brookdale Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. The 22-year-old took the 1977 Oaks carrying the colors of Windfields Farm. Her first foal, Shareef Dancer, was sold for \$3.3 million in 1981. She also produced stakes winner Zaffaran and War Deputy; her Hansel colt will be sold at Keeneland in November during the complete dispersal of Windfields breeding stock.

STERNS NAMED ITB CHAIRMAN International Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. has named Joel H. Sterns to replace Robert J. Quigley as chairman of the board. Quigley will continue as president and chief operating officer. Sterns is recognized as one of the foremost attorneys in the field of casino regulation and is the immediate past president of the International Association of Gaming Attorneys. In the 1960s he held posts in the U.S. Department of State and later served as Chief Counsel to New Jersey Governor Richard Hughes.

The final serious trial for the Epsom Derby June 8 has attracted a field of nine. The Listed event, won last year by subsequent G1 Irish Champion S. hero Pentire (GB), often has a bearing on Britain's major races later in the season and centre of attention today will be the Derby hope St. Mawes (Fr). But the John Dunlop-trained colt—currently a 20-1 shot for Epsom—lines up against stiff competition in this 10-furlong contest. His toughest rival may be Pentire's stablemate Prize Giving (GB), who does not hold a Derby entry but is unbeaten in two 1996 starts.

Friday, Garden State Park

JERSEY DERBY-GII, \$150,000, 3yo, 8.5fT

The first three finishers from the Garden State S. are expected to renew their rivalry Friday night. Ed Coletti, trainer of the Fitz (Waquoit), the winner of that race, confirmed his colt as a runner over the weekend. He will ship to the track from his barn at Philadelphia Park today. "We just want to him to get used to the surroundings and he'll just gallop before the race," said Coletti. Also expected are **Value Investor** (Cahill Road), runner-up in the Garden State S., and **Majestic Jazz** (Majestic Light), third in the event; and five-time SW **Devil's Honor** (Devil's Bag).

BRITAIN IN SATELLITE TALKS Representatives of Britain's racecourses are discussing the possibility of linking-up with Australian media moguls Kerry Packer and Rupert Murdoch to broadcast a 24-hour international racing channel. John Sanderson, set to take over early next month as vice-chairman for the Racecourse Association, has confirmed that talks have already begun. "It's a very exciting time," he said. "The RCA's view is that the future lies in the global exploitation of media rights." An agreement with Packer and Murdoch would virtually guarantee an increase in income for Britain's racing, which has recently been hit by competition from the weekly televised National Lottery. Plans would include broadcasts to countries such as China, India and Russia, but the main targets will be the high-rolling gambling centres of the Far East.

SEATTLE DANCER FOR JAPAN Seattle Dancer (*Nijinsky II), whose son Taiki Fortune won the G1 Niik Mile Cup in Tokyo nine days ago, has joined the increasing total of European stallions to be sold to Japan. The former Vincent O'Brien trainee--who as a yearling set what was a then a record auction figure when purchased for £13.1 million (almost \$20 million)--has now been sold by Ireland's Coolmore Stud for an undisclosed sum. His new home will be the East Stud in Hokkaido, which already houses the 1994 Epsom Derby winner Erhaab. Seattle Dancer, twice successful at the Group Two level over 10 furlongs in his own racing career, has sired Group One winners in England (Seattle Rhyme the Racing Post Trophy hero) and Australia (Derby winner Dance The Day Away).

APRIL TOBA OWNER OF THE MONTH AWARDED TO WALTER FAMILY TRUST The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association Owner of the Month Award for April goes to Barbara and Robert Walter, racing under the stable name of Walter Family Trust. Walter, a cattle broker in the Midwest, relocated to California in the 1950s and purchased a large ranch north of San Francisco. He turned his attention to Thoroughbred breeding in 1969, then sold his first ranch and purchased Vine Hill Farm in the early 1980s. Barbara Walter determines the matings for the broodmare band. During the month of April, Walter Family Trust started 16 horses and collected two wins, four seconds and three thirds; their homebred **Cavonnier** (Batonnier) captured the \$1 million GI Santa Anita Derby, and **Argonnier** (Batonnier) was second in the San Pedro S. The Walters own the stallion Batonnier, who stands at Longview Stud in central California; they also have more than 55 horses of racing age, 50 broodmares, three other stallions and 60-plus weanlings and yearlings.

PREAKNESS RATINGS ON THE RISE Following the trend which started with this year's Kentucky Derby, the preliminary television ratings for the 1996 Preakness showed a marked increase over the all-time low figures registered for last year's program featuring the second leg of the Triple Crown. According to ABC, the '96 telecast drew a 4.4, up 15.9 percent over 1995, and a 12 share, a slight rise over last year's 11 share. The final figures will be out later this week.

New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. has announced their split-vote decision to terminate their business relationship with Robert Fierro's Old Empire Thoroughbreds, Ltd, which has been the association's media consultant for the past 10 years. "I'm proud of what we have accomplished and extremely grateful to all the friends I have made through my personal association with the organization as long-time director and former president," Fierro said in a statement released Monday. "I wish all the best of luck to the organization on the new course its new leadership has charted for it."

**East Report Cont.****Local News: Philadelphia Park**

Racing at Philadelphia Park was canceled Sunday and Monday due to a contract dispute between the track's owners, Greenwood Racing Inc., and the Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association. The two sides have failed to come to terms on the issue of the right to arbitration. Acting on a protest by the PTHA, a judge had ruled that Philadelphia Park could no longer simulcast after noon yesterday; track management responded by cancelling the races and notifying the horsemen that they would have to vacate the backstretch by noon of May 27. Negotiations are ongoing.

◆ MIDWEST ◆

Local News: Turfway Park

Turfway Park and its Race Book simulcast facility had its best Preakness Day ever Saturday when 5,318 fans wagered \$1,203,446 on the 12 tracks offered. It was the second-best simulcast-only handle at Turfway; only the \$1,548,352 bet Derby Day was higher.

Local News: Paris, Kentucky

Lillie F. Webb, the owner of Xalapa Farm near Paris, Kentucky, suffered a stroke May 17 and died at a local hospital the next day. Webb bred 13 stakes winners on her farm, including 1991 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner **Suave Dancer** (Green Dancer).

Local News: Trinity Meadows

Joe Meyers, an attorney from Fort Worth, Texas, has filed a temporary restraining order against the transfer of Trinity Meadows stock to track vice president Jack Lenavit. Meyers has attempted to purchase stocks and notes making up some 27 percent ownership in the Willow Park, Texas track offered for sale by former partner Jack Johnson. Lenavit, as an existing stockholder and owner of some 9 percent of the track, was trying to exercise his first right of refusal to purchase shares offered for sale to outside investors. However Lenavit, a resident of Toledo, Ohio, would then have majority ownership in the track and The Texas Racing Act dictates that majority ownership in an track in the state must be held by Texas residents.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

Local News: Bandera Downs

Bandera Downs Racetrack will liquidate its entire facility at Public Auction May 23. The track, which closed last summer, will offer all of its equipment for sale with no minimum or reserve. Track officials will use some of the money raised to pay horsemen more than \$500,000, money that was supposed to be in the purse account when the track closed.

Dr. Massini (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) has become the latest in a series of leading candidates for this year's Epsom Derby to become involved in an injury scare. The Michael Stoute-trained colt, installed the 5-1 favourite for Britain's premier Classic after his decisive win at York last week, was found to be lame before morning exercise yesterday. A statement issued via Stoute's stable in Newmarket read: "Dr. Massini pulled out lame on his off foreleg this morning and the lameness is being investigated. We will issue another bulletin as soon as we are in the position to do so." Doubts over Stoute's colt participating in the Derby June 8 follow setbacks to **Dushyantor** (Sadler's Wells), lame last week but seen cantering at Newmarket yesterday, and **Nash House (Ire)** (Nashwan), whose prospects of running at Epsom depend on tests being carried by vets at Peter Chapple-Hyam's Manton base.

Bijou d'Inde (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), third in a driving finish to the 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 4, is on target to head England's challenge for the G1 Irish equivalent at The Curragh next Sunday despite suffering a setback in his training schedule. The colt was found to be sore after having a hoof trimmed before shoeing Friday and therefore missed an intended workout at the weekend. But trainer Mark Johnston said: "We did not gallop him on Saturday, but that should not be a problem because he is in great form and only just above his weight for the Newmarket Guineas. I'm pretty confident of him running in Ireland." Bijou d'Inde could be accompanied for the Curragh Classic by **Beauchamp King (GB)** (Nishapour {Fr}), a disappointing fifth at Newmarket following his win over Europe's champion juvenile Alhaarth (Ire) on his reappearance in the G3 Craven S. A spokesman for handler John Dunlop stated: "Beauchamp King will do a piece of a work in the morning (Tuesday) and a decision will be made after that."
