**LUKAS PAIR WORK FOR BELMONT** Editor's Note (Forty Niner) and **Prince of Thieves** (Hansel), expected to be the only representatives of the D. Wayne Lukas stable in the June 8 Belmont S., both turned in half-mile works at Churchill Downs Tuesday. Over a track labeled "good," Preakness third Editor's Note breezed in :50 2/5, while Kentucky Derby third Prince of Thieves covered the distance in a bullet :48 2/5.

**SOUTH SALEM TO BELMONT STAKES** South Salem (Salem Drive), trained in England by David Loder, is to challenge the best three-year-olds the U.S. can muster in the June 8 Belmont S. The Newmarket-based colt, owned by Virginia Kraft Payson, was beaten by eight lengths when finishing runner-up in his last start in a conditions event over 10 furlongs, 60 yards at Doncaster Saturday. But he scored twice as a two-year-old and Loder, whose **Overbury (Ire)** (Caerleon) dead-heated for first in the GII American Derby at Arlington in 1994, knows all about stateside raids. A spokeswoman for the handler's stable said yesterday, "We are as certain as anybody can be that South Salem will run in the Belmont. He is booked to fly out Saturday, but will come back to us after the race."

**QUEST FOR FAME SCORES WITH FIRST RUNNER** Freshman sire **Quest For Fame (GB)** (Rainbow Quest), winner of the 1990 Epsom Derby, sired his first winner from his first runner when **Dame d'Harvard** won her debut at Chantilly, France yesterday in the Prix de la Reine Blanche for unraced juvenile fillies over five furlongs. Owned and trained by Robert Collet, the two-year-old filly, who is out of Bridge Table (Riva Ridge), won by two lengths, quickening up a quarter of a mile out and drawing away on the outside. Nine-year-old Quest For Fame stands at Gainesway in Lexington, Kentucky.

**MASSACHUSETTS H., \$250,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/8m**  
 The field of six, from the rail out, is as follows:  
**Prolanzier** (Copelan), 109 pounds; **Will To Reign** (Cox's Ridge), 109; **Cigar** (Palace Music), 130; **Northern Ensign** (Blue Ensign), 109; **Personal Merit** (Turkoman), 111; **Hogan's Goat** (Spanish Drums), 108.

Allen Paulson's Cigar was installed the 1-9 morning-line favorite to defend his title in the 57th Massachusetts H. The six-year-old drew post position three and will carry regular jockey Jerry Bailey and 130 pounds. "It's a lot of weight to be giving away, 18, 19 or 20 pounds to some of the other horses," said trainer Bill Mott from his Belmont Park base. "It's definitely a factor and you have to expect it to bring the field closer together." How much closer together this field can be brought is questionable. While none of Cigar's five challengers have won their last races, the reigning Horse of the Year himself is currently riding a 14-race winning streak. The second highweight in the race at 111 pounds, Personal Merit, has not visited the winner's circle since May 20, 1995 when he took an allowance at Suffolk Downs. Cigar is scheduled to arrive under state police escort in Boston Friday afternoon.

**CALIFORNIAN S.-GI, \$250,000a, 3yo/up, 1 1/8m**  
**Helmsman** (El Gran Senor), winner of the GII San Fernando S. and GI Strub S. in his first two starts this year and most recently second in the GIII Inglewood H. over the Hollywood turf May 12, breezed five furlongs Tuesday in 1:00 4/5. "There aren't many better than him," gushed trainer Wally Dollase. "He's a wonderful racehorse and a pleasure to train." Also working for the Californian Tuesday was Santa Anita H. winner **Mr Purple** (Deputy Minister), who went a mile in 1:39 1/5 over a fast main track. Other probables for the Grade I event are **Del Mar Dennis** (Dixieland Band), **Siphon (Braz)** (Itajara {Braz}) and **Tinners Way** (Secretariat). **Score Quick** (Northern Score) is a possible starter.

**SETBACK FOR ESTEEM** An already muddled Epsom Derby picture was stirred up still further yesterday after Newmarket 2000 Guineas winner **Mark Of Esteem (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}) was forced to miss his routine early morning exercise. A problem with the Godolphin-trained colt first came to light Tuesday when he was found to have a high temperature and, even though connections say that has now normalized, there remains some doubt over his Classic participation. "He seems bright and we are still hopeful of getting him to Epsom," said Simon Crisford, racing manager for the Godolphin team, "but we thought it best that we gave him another day without exercise under tack and, inevitably, any sort of temperature, no matter how slight, is a cause for concern." Even if the Guineas hero fails to make the June 8 deadline, Sheikh Mohammed's Dubai-based operation will definitely have one contender in Britain's premier Classic because **Mick's Love (Ire)** (Law Society), for whom a trip to France for the Prix du Jockey-Club had been the original plan, is now set to take his chance in the Epsom Derby.

**WEIRD AL YANKOVIC INVESTS IN A FILLY**

Weird Al Yankovic, the irrepressible comedic musician, is about to become a 20 percent owner of a Thoroughbred. Yankovic will become a partner in a four-year-old unraced filly owned by Michele Bateman, who races horses in Ontario. Bateman is a publicist for Attic Records, Yankovic's record label. The Canadian-bred filly, by the sire Medieval Fashion, is currently named Fashions Best, but will have her name changed in a contest which will begin May 27 and be titled "Horse With No Name." A Toronto radio station is being approached about running the contest. Ten percent of any purse monies earned by the filly will be donated to charity. Yankovic, who will receive no monies from her earnings, will visit the Woodbine backstretch this Sunday for a photo opportunity with his horse.

**VINERY NAMES GENERAL MANAGER**

Marcus L. Takacs has accepted the position of General Manager of Mr. and Mrs. Ben Walden Jr.'s Vinery, near Midway, Kentucky. He will begin his new duties June 1. A native Kentuckian and 1970 graduate of Centre College in Danville, Takacs has served as farm manager for Big Sink Farm since 1986. "Marty's extensive knowledge, experience and excellent reputation in the Thoroughbred industry made him a logical choice to head up our expanding stallion and commercial sales operations," said Ben Walden Jr. "We're extremely happy to have him with us."

**BOSRA SHAM 50-50 FOR ASCOT**

**Bosra Sham** (Woodman), who overcame a last-minute foot problem to win the 1000 Guineas at Newmarket three weeks ago, has only a 50-50 chance of being fit to run in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 19. Tim Bulwer-Long, racing manager to the Classic heroine's owner Wafic Said, is still hoping that trainer Henry Cecil can work another miracle by nursing the filly back to a peak in time for next month's fixture. But, although he was happy enough after seeing her canter yesterday morning, he admitted that, as she was very sore after her Guineas success and is only now easing back into exercise, it would be touch and go as to whether she will make it. Inevitably, as Britain's racing program makes finding suitable alternatives virtually impossible, Bosra Sham may be obliged to take on colts if she loses her battle to get to Ascot. "There are few opportunities for fillies over a mile after the Coronation," Bulwer-Long said. "So we would have to consider events such as the Sussex S. (at Goodwood July 31). But, right now, we aren't thinking that far ahead. We'll know a lot more in a week's time."

**FRANCE TO END COUPLED BETS**

Players of France's Pari-Mutuel betting system look set to benefit from a change in the rules concerning horses whose odds are coupled because they are running for the same owner. Louis Romanet, director of the country's racing ruling body France-Galop, will submit a recommendation next month that, beginning September 1, horses in linked ownership will be treated separately for betting purposes. He also proposes to make it compulsory for trainers to declare before any given race which horses will be running as pacemakers. "One factor in making the changes," Romanet revealed, "is that there have sometimes been several runners owned by Sheikh Mohammed in the same race. In the case of Luso (employed as a pacemaker for Lammtarra in last year's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe), he would have to have been named as pacemaker at the declaration stage, or the trainer would face a fine."

France's premier Classic, the Prix du Jockey-Club, looks certain to be kept at home, with only the Peter Chapple-Hyam-trained pair **Polaris Flight** (Northern Flagship) and **Astor Place** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) remaining of the English entries after Wednesday's forfeit stage. Polaris Flight, one-for-one in France after taking last year's G1 Criterium de Saint Cloud, is a likely starter, according to Chapple-Hyam. Polaris Flight is one of 15 colts remaining, including all the best of the French, including probable favorite **Helissio** (Fr) (Fairy King), **Ragmar** (Fr) (Tropular {GB}), **Arbatax** (Ire) (Mtoto), **Dark Nile** (Riverman), **L'Africain Bleu** (Fr) (Saint Cyrien {Fr}), **Grape Tree Road** (GB) (Caerleon) and **Loup Solitaire** (Lear Fan). Others remaining are: **Radevore** (GB) (Generous {Ire}), **Water Poet** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), **Halcon** (GB) (Rainbow Quest), **Le Destin** (Fr) (Zayyani {Ire}), **Oliviero** (Fr) (Vaguely Pleasant {Fr}) and **Hoist To Heaven** (Alleged).
