**GRINDSTONE HEADS HOME** Kentucky Derby winner **Grindstone** (Unbridled) will be returning home Monday, June 3 to Overbrook Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, where he was foaled and raised and will stand at stud beginning with the 1997 breeding season. To be accompanied by trainer D. Wayne Lukas, Grindstone is scheduled to arrive by van from Churchill Downs at 1:30 p.m. at the Overbrook Farm stallion complex. Media representatives are expected to attend the three-year-old's homecoming, as is Grindstone's jockey in the Derby, Jerry Bailey.

**TWO SUPPLEMENTED FOR FRENCH DERBY** Chester Vase winner **High Baroque** (Ire) (High Estate {GB}) and Predominate S. winner **Don Micheletto** (GB) (Machavellian) were both supplemented Thursday morning for Sunday's Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby) at Chantilly. A notable absentee from the list of those still engaged in the mile and a half classic is Daniel Wildenstein's **Loup Solitaire** (Lear Fan). The Andre Fabre-trained colt was a three-quarter length runner-up to the probable Derby favorite **Helissio** (Fr) (Fairy King) in the recent G1 Prix Lupin at Longchamp.

**NORTHERN SPUR HEADS ARLINGTON MILLION NOMINEES** Eclipse Award-winning turf horse **Northern Spur** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and the top two finishers in last year's Arlington Million, **Awad** (Caveat) and **Sandpit** (Brz) (Baynoun {Ire}), head an impressive lineup of 108 nominees to Arlington Million XVI, which will be contested at Arlington International Racecourse Sunday, Aug. 25. The list of North American nominees also features GII Early Times Dixie H. winner **Gold and Steel** (Fr) (Shining Steel {GB}), GI Early Times Turf Classic winner **Mecke** (Maudlin) and main track specialist **Soul of the Matter** (Private Terms). The 23 foreign nominees are headed by **Halling** (Diesis {GB}), winner of the G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp Monday. The Grade I Arlington Million will be contested at 1 1/4-miles on the turf.

**BELMONT S.-GI, \$500,000a, 3yo, 1 1/2m**  
**JAMIES FIRST PUNCH TO BELMONT** A smiling Bobby Barbara reported Thursday morning that "all was well" with **Jamies First Punch** (Fit to Fight), winner of Sunday's GII Peter Pan S., who will start next in the Belmont S. "We have nine days to go and if he stays like he is right now, he'll be there," said the trainer.  
**MY FLAG A POSSIBLE STARTER** Shug McGaughey, who conditions top three-year-old filly **My Flag** (Easy Goer), said he will make a decision Saturday following an easy work whether to send the GI Ashland S. winner against colts in the Belmont. "There's a possibility she might run--she's being pointed toward the Mother Goose (June 22), but I'm not shutting the door on the Belmont," McGaughey said.

**HINE LEANS TOWARD BELMONT** Trainer Sonny Hine reported from Monmouth Park yesterday that he is leaning toward sending Preakness runner-up **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) in the Belmont S. instead of the June 23 Ohio Derby. "If he works good Sunday I'm looking at New York," Hine said. "It's right down the road and it's certainly more prestigious than the Ohio Derby. Of course, I won the Ohio Derby with his daddy and went on to win the Haskell and the Pegasus with him. But we just got the blood chemistry back on Skip Away and everything is perfect."

**SECRETO DE ESTADO "70 PERCENT" FOR CLASSIC** **Secreto de Estado** (General Assembly), ninth of 12 in the Preakness, came out of that race with a cut and a quarter crack on his right front hoof and is "70 percent" for the Belmont, trainer Alfredo Callejas said Thursday. "He had three days off after the race and has been galloping with a bar shoe since then," said Callejas. "He will have a patch put on it tomorrow. He was injured when he stumbled in the gate at the start of the Preakness. But he has no pain and we'll see what happens with him."

### CIGAR CAMP READIES FOR SECOND BOSTON MASSACRE

Horse of the Year **Cigar** (Palace Music) traveled to Suffolk Downs last year in the midst of a seven-race win streak. He left the East Boston track with his eighth straight win, a four-length "Boston Massacre" in the words of track announcer Larry Collmus, and a growing reputation as a horse to be reckoned with. Seven wins later, Cigar returns to Suffolk Downs Saturday looking for win number 15. In a teleconference yesterday, trainer Bill Mott recalled last year's MassCap experience and the decision to enter the race again this year. "I think in particular before the horse ran it was touching, because when we were on our way over to the races, on the way over to the paddock, the backside help was coming out of the barns, getting a peek at him on the horse path. As they were passing in front of the clubhouse and grandstand, they were lined up to get a glimpse of him. A lot of people were calling his name and my name and thanking me for bringing him up there. I think I probably signed more autographs there than I have in my whole life." Mott remembered the warm response when it came time to decide where Cigar would make his next start. "It's a very good feeling that there was so much appreciation for him just being there and for people to recognize him as the star he was and the star he was going to become. And that played a part in his coming back." Jockey Jerry Bailey also enjoyed his Boston sojourn last year. "It was a very personable atmosphere. Coming from New York, things are black and white and a little impersonable as far as fans go. I think the people sense something special in him and it was very nice. I like that down-home feeling." Cigar will be spotting his five MassCap rivals between 19 and 22 pounds. "If we're going to run at all in the next 60 or 90 days, all the races are handicaps," Mott said. "We've got a horse who came back from Dubai, he's fresh, he's ready to go. He's telling us he's ready for a race. We've got to go ahead and take the challenge." Bailey doesn't see the added weight as a major obstacle to repeat success in the MassCap. "He didn't seem to have a problem with the 128 at Gulfstream (in the Donn H.); he's done a few things in the meantime--like travel around the world. That's the price you pay for success." Cigar is scheduled to leave Belmont Park by 10 a.m. Friday and arrive in Boston in the early evening.

**FUTURE UNSURE FOR KING'S THEATRE** Plans for **King's Theatre (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) are up in the air following his defeat in a conditions event at Newbury Wednesday evening. The five-year-old, winner of the 1994 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. but unsuccessful when trained by Bill Mott in the U.S. last year, started favorite for the Newbury 400th Charter Anniversary S. He appeared fit for his return to British racing but was beaten a head in a driving finish by **Murajja** (Silver Hawk). Simon Crisford, racing manager for the Godolphin team which has supervised the former G1 winner's build-up in Dubai over the winter, said, "We ran him here to see if it was worth running him in Group events and, if he runs again, it will be at that level. Whether we persevere or not will now be up to Sheikh Mohammed, but all is not lost and he is in everything."

**BLUE DUSTER DELAYED** **Blue Duster** (Danzig), top-rated juvenile filly in Europe last year, has had her 1996 reappearance delayed again. Last year's five-time winner, who signed off with a comfortable victory in the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket in September, was expected to have her first run of this season in the British 1000 Guineas. A back injury prevented her participation in the classic and has now forced her out of contention for her next intended target, Royal Ascot's G1 Coronation S. June 19. Trainer David Loder said, "The problem has taken longer to clear up than we had anticipated, so Blue Duster is not going to make Royal Ascot. But we'll keep her entered and, when she's right, we'll run her."

**THISTLEDOWN REPORTS 391% INCREASE IN OUT-OF-STATE WAGERING** Thistledown concluded its opening Summit Meeting Monday with an enormous increase in off-track wagering, while the on-track numbers in attendance and handle were affected by an unusually cold and rainy spring. For the meet, there was a 391 percent increase in out-of-state wagering on Thistledown's racing product. The money handled on the track's races from out-of-state was \$2,923,553, compared with only \$748,099 in 1995. The on-track numbers did not fare as well. Bogged down with cancellations and shortened race cards, total attendance was down 5.4 percent and total handle was down 5.1 percent. Originally scheduled for 57 racing dates, the 1996 Summit Meeting consisted of 56 days after Thistledown was forced to cancel the March 3 card due to snowy road conditions. Jockey Michael Rowland successfully defended his riding title with 48 victories. Shirley Girten repeated as top trainer with 17 wins, and Mark Yagour, with 12 victories, was the meet's top owner.

Trainer John Kimmel said yesterday that "everything looks okay" for **Traffic Circle** (Cahill Road)'s engagement in the Belmont. "We do feel he's a horse who can run 1 1/2-miles," Kimmel said. "The three-year-olds who have been competing in the Triple Crown might be showing a bit of wear and tear now, and it's not out of the question for a fresh horse to come in and be competitive. The owners felt he should be given a chance and I agree. There's only one shot to find out if your three-year-old can go 1 1/2-miles and that's a week from Saturday." Traffic Circle has won his last two races, allowance events at Aqueduct and Belmont.
