CIGAR WOOERS ABOUND Horse of the Year Cigar (Palace Music), recovering from a bruised right front foot, will have plenty of options for his next start. Owner Allen Paulson reported at a teleconference yesterday that the June 30 Hollywood Gold Cup still looms a possibility. "I just got off the phone with (trainer) Billy (Mott), and it's going to take a little time to really know --another four or five days to tell whether we can make the Gold Cup or if too much training time was lost. I'd say he'd have to make a decision in the next five or seven days." Offers for the champ's presence have come in from tracks around the country. Paulson revealed that Arlington International Racecourse has offered to stage a million dollar race for Cigar. "I don't know when he'll be ready to run," Paulson said. "But if it can be worked out, I'd like to see him go to Arlington." The date of the Arlington race would be flexible outside of the Aug. 25 Arlington Million. "We'd be jumping up and down and flattered if they'd consider running at Arlington," said the track's Chairman Dick Duchossois. "Cigar has come along at a time when racing needs every bit of help it can get. We want to promote racing, Cigar and racing in the Midwest." Also vying for the Cigar camp's attention is Sam Houston Racetrack. A tentative race date of Oct. 5 has been put on the table by the Texas track. "This is something that would be important to Texas racing," said Allen Gutterman, a Sam Houston consultant. "There's no other attraction like Cigar." The Meadowlands has also offered to change the conditions of its \$750,000 Meadowlands Cup Oct. 4 to entice a Cigar performance at the New Jersey track. But Paulson left little doubt about who would determine when Cigar was ready to run. "I am going to let Billy call the shots on the condition of the horse. I am not going to overrule anything he says. He's the expert and he's done an excellent job."

APALACHEE PENSIONED Graham Beck's Gainesway announced yesterday that champion **Apalachee** (Round Table) has been retired from stud duty at the age of 25. Apalachee, who raced for John A. Mulcahy, was Horse of the Year in England in 1973, the only two-year-old ever to be awarded the honor. In his five races at ages two and three, he recorded four victories and one placing. Apalachee has sired 45 stakes winners and the earners of over \$20 million, including champions Dance for Donna and Lubicon and millionaire Pine Tree Lane. In 1988, Apalachee was awarded Chef-de-Race status, an exclusive category reserved only for the great sires of the breed.

BELMONT S.-GI, \$500,000a, 3yo, 1 1/2m

Editor's Note (Forty Niner) and **Prince of Thieves** (Hansel) arrived at Belmont Wednesday afternoon. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, looking for his third straight Belmont win, said the pair had an uneventful trip from Churchill Downs and would gallop into Saturday's race. "Editor's Note needs to step up and have a win," the trainer said. "He's a talented horse and needs to have his day in the sun. We're waiting for that day." As for **Prince of Thieves**, third in the Kentucky Derby, Lukas said, "He's a very talented horse and may be coming up to his best effort."

Appealing Skier (Baldski), nominated to both the Belmont and the Riva Ridge, worked a half-mile in :46.02 Wednesday under jockey Joe Bravo. "He's ready to do anything we want him to do," trainer Ben Perkins said. "If he is in the Belmont, you can bet I think he can win."

Trainer Walter Reese confirmed that **In Contention** (Devil's Bag) would run in the Belmont. "We are running and Joe Bravo will ride."

Latin Reign (El Gran Senor)'s Belmont status is still questionable. "We don't know for sure," said trainer Frank Alexander. "But I'm not putting up \$5,000 unless I am 100 percent sure."

EPSOM DERBY FAVORITE LAME AGAIN Dr Massini (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), favored for Saturday's Epsom Derby after an impressive win at York last month, now looks certain to miss Britain's premier Classic. The Michael Tabor-owned colt, 4-1 in last week-end's Derby betting, has already had one setback to his training schedule this year and yesterday trainer Michael Stoute released another anxious bulletin on his condition. A fax issued via Stoute's Newmarket base read, "Dr Massini is lame on his near fore foot. It is highly unlikely that he will be able to run in the Derby, but I will issue a further statement Thursday." Dr Massini, who staked his Epsom claim when winning the Michael Seely Memorial Glasgow S., appears to have suffered a problem similar to one which caused connections alarm two weeks ago. That problem was overcome in only a few days--but, being so close to the Derby, this one is obviously more troublesome.

BILL INTRODUCED TO BRING SLOTS TO NEW JERSEY TRACKS An amendment to the New Jersey state constitution that would allow slot machines at four of the state's five racetracks was introduced Monday. The same bill was introduced last year, but never advanced. Assemblyman Gerald Zecker told the *Newark Star-Ledger* that he envisions 3,000 slot machines at the Meadowlands, 3,000 at Garden State Park and 1,500 each at Monmouth Park and Freehold Raceway. The one racetrack excluded would be Atlantic City Race Course. It is expected that the Atlantic City casino industry will oppose the bill. John Samerjan, director of public affairs for the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, which runs the Meadowlands and Monmouth Park, said, "I think everybody is mindful of the situation in Delaware, where they have provided an enormous boost to their revenue structure and purses with slots. Certainly, the Delaware experience and the possibility or probability of slots at tracks in Maryland, Pennsylvania and New York is something that the racing administration at the Sports Authority is closely monitoring."

NYRA TESTS HOME COMPUTER BETTING The New York Racing Association announced Wednesday that it has signed an agreement with You Bet! Inc. of Los Angeles, California to test a new system that will allow racing fans to access information and place telephone wagers through NYRA-One accounts from their home computers. The test will be conducted in 400 households later this year, starting with the Belmont Park fall championship meeting. If successful, the system could be made widely available early next year. "Computers and handicapping are a natural daily double," said NYRA Vice President Steven Crist. "The outstanding You Bet! Inc. software offers fans a way to exploit the information potential of personal computers and to build and place wagers electronically through our existing telephone wagering system. We're hoping that the entertainment factor of the computer will help extend the reach of the track." Users of the system will be able to access real-time odds, complete and customizable Equibase past-performances and audio-video feeds.

HOUSEBUSTER NEWEST SHUTTLE STALLION Two-time Champion Sprinter **Housebuster** (Mt. Livermore) has joined the list of shuttle stallions. The nine-year-old dark bay will ship to New Zealand to stand the Southern Hemisphere breeding season as part of a two-year lease between his owners and the Haunui and Ra Ora studs in New Zealand. Housebuster, whose first foals are three-year-olds of 1996, will continue to stand at Jonabell Farm in Lexington, Kentucky during the Northern Hemisphere breeding seasons. According to a story in today's *Daily Racing Form*, the deal to use Housebuster as a shuttle stallion was arranged by Ron Chitty, managing director of Haunui Stud, and Noel Robinson, chairman of Ra Ora, in a cooperative venture. Housebuster's stud fee in New Zealand will be \$17,500.

RAKEEN OFF TO STRONG START Rakeen (Northern Dancer)'s first South African crop are currently two-year-olds, and the stallion already has three winners to date. **Al Sheba** won her debut over six furlongs, then placed third in the Owners & Trainers Nursery S. **North Spruit** won over a mile May 25, and **Erin Song** won at a mile June 2. Nine-year-old Rakeen was acquired from South Africa by Northview Stallion Station in Maryland before the 1996 breeding season. The only graded or group winner by Northern Dancer standing in the Mid Atlantic, Rakeen is out of Canadian Horse of the Year Glorious Song, and is thus a half-brother to top sire Rahy. Upon his arrival at Northview, Rakeen was fully syndicated in less than a week. He will be bred to a full book of 50+ mares in 1996.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

To the ever growing band of major winners inbred to Northern Dancer can be added the name of **Fusaichi Concorde (Jpn) (c, 3, Caerleon--Ballet Queen {Ire} {Sadler's Wells})**, winner of the Japanese Derby. Fusaichi Concorde is inbred 3x3 to Northern Dancer, with the only other duplication in his pedigree being a 4x5 cross of Hail to Reason. There are two significant factors to note here. First, the number of times Nijinsky II (sire of Caerleon) appears in the pedigree of good winners with double Northern Dancer is truly remarkable. Second, this is the first really top-class performer out of a Sadler's Wells mare. Given that there are going to be a lot of Sadler's Wells mares out there, the pointer that a Nijinsky II/Sadler's Wells combination might work is an important one.

A two-year-old debutante winner whose pedigree marks him as one to watch is **Gold Star Deputy (c, 2, Silver Deputy--Andrea Ruckus {Bold Ruckus})**. He is inbred 4x4 to Raise a Native, but he also has another clever duplication. His fourth dam, the notable producer Victory Chant, is by Victoria Park out of a Menetrier mare. Silver Deputy's grandsire, Vice Regent, is out of Victoria Regina, a Menetrier half-sister to Victoria Park. If that is not enough, the Silver Deputy/Bold Ruckus cross has produced stakes winners Scotzanna, Early Blaze and Sermon Time, three of Silver Deputy's top four earners.
