BREEDERS' CUP MOVES SITE OF 1996

CHAMPIONSHIP Officials of Breeders' Cup Limited announced Thursday that the 1996 Breeders' Cup Championship, scheduled for October 26, will be moved from Woodbine Racetrack. "We deeply regret this decision to move the Breeders' Cup Championship from Toronto, but without the necessary assurances that the event can be run free of labor disruption, we have no other alternative," said James E. Bassett III, president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. "We have no guarantees that services at the racetrack as well as in the metropolitan Toronto area will not be impaired by labor action during the time we plan to be in the city, and prudent management dictates that we not expose our Championship and our visitors to such an environment. This is a great disappointment not only because of the substantial work and planning already accomplished, but also because of the tremendous support we have received from the Ontario Thoroughbred breeders and owners throughout the years. However, the necessity of making preparations for the event dictate that a change of the host site is mandatory at this date. We also wish to acknowledge and thank the Ontario Jockey Club, as well as government and business leaders from Toronto and the province of Ontario, all of who worked hard to bring the Breeders' Cup Championship to Canada." Tuesday, the Ontario Jockey Club accepted the recommendation of a mediator to settle the labor dispute. However, mutual clerks voted down the mediator's proposal Wednesday. The mediator suggested that the mutual clerks receive \$18 an hour, but they wanted \$20 an hour. Breeders' Cup Ltd. plans to announce the new site for the 1996 Championship by mid-June, but it is believed that the frontrunner is currently Churchill Downs.

GARY STEVENS TO UNDERGO SURGERY

Jockey Gary Stevens will undergo surgery on his left shoulder and will be sidelined indefinitely. According to Dr. James E. Tibone of the Kerlan-Jobe Orthopaedic Clinic, Stevens has a "subluxing/dislocating left shoulder." Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who uses Stevens as one of his stable's regular riders, said, "His injury is something that's been nagging him for a long time. He's had shoulder trouble before. It's his rotator cuff; he can't raise his left arm to use his whip. He's sick about it. He's having a world-class year." Stevens is currently ranked second nationally in purse earnings behind Jerry Bailey with \$6,550,090 (including Dubai races) through June 1.

BILINSKI FINDINGS RELEASED The New York State Ethics Commission has released a report stating that there is reasonable cause to believe that New York State Racing and Wagering Board Chairman Jerry Bilinski violated Public Officers Law on 30 separate occasions. The findings will be sent to Governor Pataki, who must decide whether he will resubmit Bilinski's nomination for a second term. Bilinski's first term ended Feb. 28, and his nomination for a possible second term had been on hold during the investigation. Before being nominated to the NYSRWB, Bilinski was a breeder and veterinarian. Due to a possible conflict of interests, he was forced to sever his ties with his breeding and veterinary ventures in order to assume his position with the NYSRWB. However, suspicions arose that he had not severed all ties when a magazine ad for a stallion he once stood at his farm included his office number at the NYSRWB. He was cleared of all charges involving the ad, but the Ethics Commission ruled that there was reasonable cause to believe that Bilinski had continued to sell seasons in the stallions Go and Go and Cormorant and was still involved in partnerships in various horses, both of which are violations.

ATLANTIC CITY OPENS TONIGHT Atlantic City Race Course will spring into action for its 51st season of racing tonight; first post is at 7:35 p.m. Racing will be held four nights weekly, Wednesdays through Saturdays, through August 31. A special race card will be presented Saturday, June 22 for the seventh running of the G1 Caesars International H. First post, that evening only, is 5 p.m., with post-time for the Caesars at 6:40 p.m. Other graded stakes during the meeting include the GII Vinery Matchmaker July 24 and the GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup June 14.

DOUBLE ECLIPSE INJURED Double Eclipse (Ire) (Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}), unbeaten in three starts this season and a leading candidate for the G1 Ascot Gold Cup, appears virtually certain to miss the June 20 event after suffering a leg injury. The four-year-old, whose last two victories have been achieved in Longchamp's Prix de Barbeville and Prix Vicomtesse Vigier, had been due to clash with his stablemate and full-brother Double Trigger in Ascot's showpiece contest. But he was found to have a problem with his right foreleg late last month and connections now believe that, despite some recent progress, Double Eclipse is very unlikely to be ready to run in less than two weeks. Trainer Mark Johnston said, "We will be continuing with a course of Bute over the next few days. But it is the risk of injury that is the worst worry (with the Gold Cup) coming so soon after his problem. I originally rated his chance of recovering at 50-50, but I would say it is a lot worse than that and there must now be serious doubt about his participation."
