TAKE "NOTE"--TEAM LUKAS TAKES THIRD STRAIGHT BELMONT STAKES

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas barely missed a beat. After seeing his string of Triple Crown race victories end at six in the Preakness three weeks ago, the Hollywood horseman set his sunglassed sights on a new record, sending out **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner) to win yesterday's GI Belmont Stakes for Lukas' third consecutive victory in the third jewel of the Triple Crown. It was once thought that no one would get within shouting distance of trainer Woody Stephens' incredible mark of five straight Belmont victories (1982-86); it might be time to think again, but Lukas, for once, is downplaying his success. "Woody's got five and we're only at three," he said. "That's only a little more than half-way. The record is safe--Woody can sleep tonight." Editor's Note picked an opportune time to pick up his first win as a three-year-old. The temperamental chestnut, third in the Preakness last time out, had not visited the winner's circle since taking the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile last September. With jockey Rene Douglas subbing for the sidelined Gary Stevens, the colt settled comfortably near the back of the 14-horse field through honest early fractions; he made steady progress to reach contention at the top of the stretch, then found himself in a dog-fight to the wire as **Skip Away** (Skip Trial), who had taken the lead at the quarter-pole, dug down deep for the drive. It wasn't until the final strides that Editor's Note took the lead for good and edged away to win by a length as the 5-1 second choice, following in the hoofsteps of Team-mates Tabasco Cat ('94) and Thunder Gulch ('95). "They had told me that he sometimes plays in his races," said Douglas, aboard the colt for the first time. "I said 'this is the Belmont Stakes--it's no time for playing.' I switched to a left-handed whip and he stopped playing and started to draw away." The race was marred when 3-1 favorite **Cavonnier** (Batonnier), racing sixth at the time, took a bad step on his right front leg as they straightened for home and was pulled up by jockey Chris McCarron. "It's a high bowed tendon," said trainer Bob Baffert after the game gelding had been examined back at the barn. "It's not as disastrous as we first thought. When I get him back to California, we'll scan it and see how bad it is." As for the future, he said, "Those things take about six months. You can bring them back, but they're not going to be at the same level--and I don't see (owners Robert and Barbara Walter) bringing him back as a claimer."

On the board in three of six starts this year but looking for his first win of the season, Editor's Note was sent off the crowd's second choice after taking the show spot in the Preakness last out and finally rewarded his staunch supporters. Rating kindly under new rider Rene Douglas, the red colt had just two horses beaten after a half but had reached midpack by the mile marker. He joined Preakness runner-up Skip Away on the lead at the top of the lane and the two battled head-and-head to the final yards. "I had made the comment that I thought this one had his number on it," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "If it turned into a streetfight--and that's what it turned into--this was the horse we wanted in the fight." After drawing far outside post positions in all three Triple Crown races, Skip Away fought on bravely to be easily second. "He tried everything to do what he had to do to win," said jockey Jose Santos, who picked up the mount from Shane Sellers, now out with a fractured wrist. The top two are scheduled to meet again in the Haskell at Monmouth August 4 and then in the Travers at Saratoga August 24. "Hopefully we will get better posts in those races," said Skip Away's trainer, Sonny Hine. My Flag, the lone filly in the field, rallied to be third, while Preakness winner LOUIS QUATORZE (Sovereign Dancer) ran an even fourth. British invader SOUTH SALEM (Salem Drive) pressed the pace briefly but faded badly and was eased. "He didn't like that dirt in his face," said trainer David Loder. A Belmont Stakes Day record total handle of \$38,712,983 was wagered on the Belmont card.

WOODBINE SETTLES LABOR DISPUTE; BACK IN BREEDERS' CUP PICTURE?

The Ontario Jockey Club yesterday announced that they have come to an agreement with Service Employees International Union, Local 528, the union which represents its mutual workers, and are hoping that the resolution of their labor woes will result in a return of the '96 Breeders' Cup to Woodbine. The OJC has entered into a Memorandum of Agreement with the union, which will recommend that its members vote to accept the contract in a meeting at 3:30 p.m. today. Premier Mike Harris as well as Gord Wilson, president of the Ontario Federation of Labour, have confirmed that they will be contacting Breeders' Cup Ltd. to provide the necessary assurances that the championship event could be conducted at Woodbine without disruption. According to Jim Gluckson, a spokesman for Breeders' Cup Ltd., "The door is open again, however, we are looking for written assurance from the Premier of Ontario, from the Division of Labour, from the OJC and from the union that there will be no further problems. At the same time, we will continue to look at alternate sites. We are sticking by our original announcement that we want to have the site set by mid-June."

ROCKINGHAM PARK OPENS TODAY Rockingham Park in Salem, New Hampshire opens its gates today for its 90th anniversary season. Everyone 18 and older will receive a free grandstand pass good for the entire 100-day season with paid admission. Rockingham will race Mondays, Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays at 1 p.m. and Fridays at 7:30 p.m. Stakes featured during the meet, which ends October 16, include the GIII New Hampshire Sweepstakes June 16, the \$100,000a Rockingham Breeders' Cup July 7 and the \$100,000 Spicy Living S. August 4.

Shaamit (Ire) made sure that Britain's premier Classic was won for the second successive occasion by a colt making his first appearance as a three-year-old with a great burst of speed approaching the quarter-mile pole. JACK JENNINGS (GB) (Deploy) broke best from the gate and took the field along at a decent, if not spectacular, pace. He was still in the lead at the top of the famed Tattenhill Hill. But the other 19 were queuing up behind and until Shaamit found his feet after showing inexperience on the descent, the prospect of a bunch-finish loomed large. Michael Hills on Shaamit, however, overcame a bad bump to make his challenge wide and, from the moment the pairing took the lead, a clear-cut winner was a certainty. Runner-up Dushyantor, the favourite in the field of 20, made some late progress along with third-placed Shantou, but GLORY OF DANCER (GB) (Shareef Dancer), who had beaten the runner-up in York's G2 Dante S. last time and was always prominent here, did not quite stay the mile and a half and faded back into fourth close to home. Shaamit, forced out of the Dante after cutting a foot badly with an overreach at home, thereby emulated the feat of last year's hero Lammtarra by scoring a Derby win on his first race in his Classic season, and only his third start overall. But trainer William Haggas was not altogether surprised by the success. "I really thought he could win," the Newmarket-based handler said. "He's a very good horse and has beaten most of the other fancied contenders when he has galloped with them." Successful jockey Michael Hills was, along with Haggas, taking his very first Epsom Derby. He was clearly high on the result and enthused: "It's an amazing feeling--one I've dreamed of all my life--but that last 100 yards must have been the longest I have ever experienced. It was a very rough race and I only just managed to hold my position in all the barging. He didn't come down that hill particularly well. But he's got so much speed that, as soon as I hit the front, I was confident." Winning owner, Dubai-based Khalifa Dasmal, was virtually overcome by emotion. "It's wonderful," he grinned. "I never expected to win the Derby. I have just three horses and thought I'd be lucky to win a Listed race."

Swain (Ire) gave French trainer Andre Fabre his third consecutive win in the Coronation Cup by making all the running. But after setting only a very steady pace, last year's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe third had to work very hard inside the last quarter to hold off the persistent challenge from Michael Stoute trainee Singspiel (Ire). Neither of the other two contenders ever made an impact in this slowly-run race, but it was very close between them, too, when the photo-finish equipment decided third spot. Swain's jockey, twice British champion rider Frankie Dettori, said: "It was always going to be tricky with only four runners and I was rather surprised when Mr. Fabre suggested I make the running. My horse simply wouldn't go any faster in front--he was a bit green and really didn't know what to make of the track-- but, when Mick (Kinane, on the runner-up) came to me, Swain got into fifth gear and would not give in. I think he would be even better with a decent pace and with drop of rain. He's a serious horse for the Group One races later on and, although I don't make the plans, I should think he will go for the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. (at Ascot July 27)."

Diplomatic Jet's last victory came in the GIII Knickerbocker H. over a yielding Belmont turf course in October '95. Although the chestnut had not won in seven starts since, he showed life in his last two outings, a handicap at Belmont and the \$100,000 Red Bank H. at Monmouth, finishing third in both. Dismissed at 29-1 here, the homebred raced in second early behind frontrunner Kiri's Clown's soft early fractions of :24.96, :49.13 and 1:13.10, put a head in front at the top of the stretch and drew clear for his first Grade I victory. Winning trainer Jimmy Picou said, "Mr. (Fred) Hooper was surprised to see the horse at 29-1, but I told him not to worry about a thing. I was very confident going into the race. He likes this course, always has. He had a lung condition over the winter, but that's behind him now. It took some work, but he's back. As for what's next, I'll talk to the boss. We have the (Arlington) Million in mind." **SIGNAL TAP** (Fappiano), trying for his third straight graded stakes win, rallied late to be fourth as the 7-2 favorite.
