BREEDERS' CUP BACK TO WOODBINE

Officials of Breeders' Cup Ltd. and the Ontario Jockey Club announced yesterday that the Breeders' Cup Championship has been reinstated at Woodbine Race-track October 26. "We have now received letters of assurance from the Premier of Ontario, the Ontario Federation of Labour, Service Employees International Union (Local 528) and the Ontario Jockey Club, verifying that the dispute between the OJC and the pari-mutuel clerks has been settled," said James E. Bassett III, president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. "Furthermore, we have promises from all parties that neither the Breeders' Cup, nor any of the venues, locations or services related to it, will be targeted for labor action during the time the Championship is scheduled. Therefore, we are delighted to announce that the 1996 Breeders' Cup Championship will be run at Woodbine as planned." OJC Chairman George Hendrie added that "the OJC is overjoyed that Breeders' Cup have seen fit to reinstate the 1996 Championship at Woodbine Racetrack."

SAID SHUFFLES STARS Wafic Said, already owner this year of two British Classic winners, will be shuffling his pack full of aces over the next couple of months. The Syrian businessman has seen **Bosra Sham** (Woodman) overcome a foot injury to capture the Newmarket 1000 Guineas and **Lady Carla (GB)** (Caerleon) run away with the Epsom Oaks so far during 1996 and, this weekend, he might be fortunate enough to witness another of his powerful team setting himself up for future Group One honors. **King Alex (GB)** (Rainbow Quest), runner-up to one-time Epsom Derby favorite Dr Massini (Ire) at York last month, races in a conditions event at Leicester Saturday and, depending on the colt's show, Said will be taking a definite decision about his Classic prospects. Bosra Sham, still recovering from soreness after her Guineas victory, looks certain to wait for Goodwood's Sussex S. July 31 for her next race. But both Lady Carla and King Alex are entered in the Budweiser Irish Derby June 30 and, if the latter fails to impress this weekend, the filly may take his place at The Curragh in just over six weeks' time. Roger Charlton, the always cautious handler of King Alex, said, "We'll know more about his Irish Derby chance after he has run at Leicester." But Henry Cecil, obviously confident that his training colleague can call the tricks, added, "Lady Carla's next race will probably be the Irish Oaks (also at The Curragh) July 14."

KEENELAND CATALOGS 219 FOR JULY SALE

Keeneland's 53rd annual July Selected Yearling Sale will offer a total of 219 horses, 112 colts and 107 fillies, during the two-day auction July 15-16. Mr. Prospector, whose yearlings have averaged more money in July than any other sire the last four years, has 12 yearlings in the sale. Other top sires represented are Danzig with 12, Nureyev with 13, Seattle Slew with 10, Storm Cat with 13 and Sadler's Wells with nine. Included in this year's catalog are a full brother to champion Pleasant Tap, who is also a three-quarter brother to Kentucky Derby winner Go for Gin; a half-brother to Horse of the Year Lady's Secret; a full sister to 1994 Breeders' Cup Classic winner Concern; and a half-sister to 1991 Classic winner Black Tie Affair (Ire). Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent, has the largest consignment with 26. Last year's July Sale sold 188 horses for \$46,450,000, an average of \$247,074.

CIGAR MEMORABILIA INCLUDED IN TIME

CAPSULE A set of Allen Paulson's red, white and blue silks, immortalized by superstar Cigar (Palace Music), as well as photographs of the Horse of the Year's victories at Gulfstream and an official program from his 1996 triumph in the GI Donn H., will be among the historic mementoes included in the Miami Centennial 1996 Time Capsule. Coordinated by the Greater Miami Chamber of Commerce, the items contributed for the Time Capsule, which also a Gulfstream media guide, and a Florida Derby program and commemorative saddlecloth, will be on display during the Chamber's Goals Conference at Turnberry Resort & Country Club from June 14-16. The Time Capsule, part of Miami's 100th birthday celebration, will be buried July 28 in Bicentennial Park. It is slated to be unearthed in the year 2096.

Local News: Florida

With his victory in the GII True North H. at Belmont Park Saturday, champion **Not Surprising** (Medieval Man) became the 42nd Florida-bred millionaire. The six-year-old gelding, who was bred in Ocala by Willard and Claire Rhodes' Ravenbrook Farm, has won 21 of his 45 career starts and \$1,026,892. He was named last year's champion Sprinter and Florida-bred Horse of the Year.

Local News: Calder Race Course

Three-year-old **Built for Pleasure** (Homebuilder), 143-1 winner of the GII Fountain of Youth last February, is getting ready to return to the track for the first time since coming down with a virus following his last-place finish in the Kentucky Derby. "He got very, very sick after the Derby and it may have been there when he ran," said owner/trainer Thomas Heard from his barn at Calder. "He was full of mucous and his lips turned purple, he was so sick. But he's a big, strong horse and survived it, and now he's about ready to go back to training here."

Another Florida-based three-year-old, Federico Tesio winner **Tour's Big Red** (Tour d'Or), unplaced in the Preakness and Calder's Carry Back S. in his last two starts, is on vacation. "He's fine, but we've decided to turn him out for a couple of months," said trainer Enrique Alonso. "He's had a hard campaign and I think, in the long run, it will be the best thing for him. I think he can come back to be a better older horse if we give him time now." Alonso said he expects the colt to return to action in September.

John Perrotta, vice president and general manager of Due Process Stable, yesterday announced he would be leaving that position July 1 to begin a project management venture to be known as Star Thoroughbred Management (STM) for private representation in racing and breeding partnerships and syndications. WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

EDITOR'S NOTE (c, 3, Forty Niner--Beware of the Cat, by Caveat)

It never seems to fail: send a stallion to Japan and he will almost immediately be represented by a major winner in the country he has just left. The latest example of the "Japan Syndrome" is Forty Niner. Although far from a failure in North America, the absence of an absolutely top-class colt in Forty Niner's first four crops made an offer from Japan irresistible.

Now the inevitable has come to pass, the game victory of Editor's Note in the GI Belmont S., crediting Forty Niner with his first Grade I-winning son.

When reviewing the Jim Beam win of Forty Niner's son Roar, we mentioned that Forty Niner does extremely well with mares which carry Ribot (Forty Niner is out of a mare by Tom Rolfe, a son of Ribot). That Ribot inbreeding or linebreeding works particularly well for Forty Niner was underlined this weekend, not only by Editor's Note's Belmont victory, but also by the success of Forty Niner's son, Gold Fever, in the Riva Ridge S. (GIII). Both are doubled to Ribot through a son and a daughter.

Another name which appears with unusual frequency in Forty Niner's best--in five of his nine graded winners including Editor's Note--is Turn-to. Forty Niner, although inbred to Nasrullah, three-parts-brother to Turn-to's sire, Royal Charger, himself doesn't carry Turn-to. This is probably not the key. Forty Niner's broodmare sire, Tom Rolfe, likes to pick up Turn-to and the significant link is Tom Rolfe's broodmare sire, Roman. Roman is by Sir Gallahad III--son of the great broodmare Plucky Liege--out of a mare by Buchan. Turn-to's maternal grandsire, Admiral Drake, is by Craig-an-Eran (three-parts brother to Buchan) and out of Plucky Liege. This Roman/Turn-to combination is potent and works especially well when Turn-to is represented by Hail to Reason.

Editor's Note is out of a stakes-winning mare from the burgeoning family of Hennessy, Family Style and Lost Kitty, and looks an interesting prospect as a stallion. His broodmare sire Caveat is by Cannonade (out of a daughter of Cosmah, who is not only dam of Halo, but also half-sister to the dam of Northern Dancer), so it looks as if the cross of Editor's Note with mares carrying Northern Dancer or Halo has tremendous potential.

Incidentally, Editor's Note reminds us that Caveat should be marked down as a broodmare sire to note. He had another stakes winner in that role over the weekend (by Polish Numbers, a grandson of Northern Dancer) and he is also broodmare sire of Cavonnier, who came within inches of winning the Kentucky Derby.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...We sometimes hear comments that too much inbreeding is damaging to the breed. If that is so, either no one has told Fred Hooper, or he has chosen not to listen. Hooper's Early Times Manhattan S. (GI) winner **Diplomatic Jet** (c, 4, **Roman Diplomat--Precious Jet {Tri Jet}**) has five crosses of Hooper's brilliant sprinter Olympia (the nearest 4x4), along with an extra daughter cross of Olympia's sire, Heliopolis.

Shaamit (Ire) (c, 3, **Mtoto {GB}--Shomoose {Ire} {Habitat}**), winner of England's premier classic, the G1 Vodafone Derby, on only his third lifetime start, is clearly a horse of tremendous potential, but in conventional terms owns a somewhat less than prepossessing pedigree. His sire Mtoto was a top-class runner, but has been a disappointing sire, and his first four dams have produced only one listed scorer between them. What is more, the pedigree is a complete outcross. A possible answer to the conundrum appears when one realizes that Shaamit has as his fifth dam Folie Douce, a mare imported into the U.S. by Greentree Farm (while carrying the dam of Greentree champion Stage Door Johnny). French-bred Folie Douce has a pedigree which very closely resembles that of the 1957 English Derby winner Crepello, and Crepello just happens to be grandsire of Mtoto, which means that Shaamit has the closely related Crepello/Folie Douce 3x5. Significantly, Shaamit, the best horse from the family for four generations, is only the second foal from the family to be sired by a stallion carrying Crepello. *Highflyer International, racing and breeding consultants, specialize in pedigree research and individualized matings.
