CIGAR OUT OF GOLD CUP Trainer Bill Mott made it official yesterday: Cigar (Palace Music) will not be at Hollywood to defend his title in the GI \$1 million Hollywood Gold Cup June 30. The six-year-old, who came out of his victory in the Massachusetts H. with a bruised right front foot, has not yet resumed training. "We're running out of time now," Mott said from his barn at Belmont Park. "It's nine days now, and we haven't had him back to the track. The problem is a little more than we bargained for. We feel he's doing better, but he's progressing slower than we'd hoped. He will be back. It's one of those things--he'll be fine. But you're delaying your training schedule, and you can't have too many delays when you're going for this type of race. For every day you lose, it takes two to make it up." Mott said he will instead send Geri (Theatrical {Ire}) to Hollywood.

OBS JUNE SALES RESULTS The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company completed their final two-year-old sale of the '96 season Monday, with 164 juveniles selling for a total of \$1,347,900 in the annual June Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training and Horses of Racing Age. The gross was down 18.5 percent from last year, when 157 two-year-olds sold for \$1,655,100. The '96 two-year-old average of \$8,219 was down 22 percent from a figure of \$10,542 a year ago. In addition, 11 older horses sold Monday for \$65,000, an average of \$5,909; the average showed a 135 percent increase over last year's result, when 10 older horses sold for \$25,100, an average of \$2,510. The sales topper was a colt by freshman sire The Prime Minister out of Silent Coup (Hatchet Man). Consigned by Eddie Woods, Agent V, the bay sold for \$72,000 to Richard Curtin. "The sale lacked depth in quality horses, and that was reflected in the prices," said Tom Ventura, OBS Director of Sales, but added, "The sale topper was a nice colt, and brought the highest price of any two-year-old for this sale in the '90s."

The victory of **Swing and Miss** (c, 3, Housebuster--Triple Strike {Secretariat}) gave her sire a second stakes winner, following the success last year of Houseafire. Housebuster is out of a mare by Great Above, he in turn a son of Minnesota Mac (by Rough'n Tumble) and Dr. Fager's half-sister Ta Wee (by Intentionally--Aspidistra). Houseafire's dam is by In Reality (by Intentionally out of a Rough'n Tumble mare) and Swing And Miss's third dam is by Dr. Fager (Rough'n Tumble--Aspidistra), so it looks like duplicating Tartan/Genter breeding is the way to go.

Winner of the Vodac 'Dash' H. over five furlongs at Epsom, **To The Roof** (GB) (c, 4, Thatching {Ire}--Christine Daae {GB} {Sadler's Wells}) follows German listed scorer Decamerone as the second stakes winner of the season by Thatching out of a Sadler's Wells mare. The significance of this combination is that it gives the brother and sister Thatch and Special (granddam of Sadler's Wells) 2x4.

Rubiano continues to enjoy a very promising start to his stud career. His third winner from three starters is **Gray Raider** (c, 2, Rubiano--Miss Creeker {Red Ryder}), who scored by four lengths at Belmont in his debut. Gray Raider's dam, multiple stakes winner Miss Creeker, is by Red Ryder. This is rather interesting since Red Ryder is an unraced brother to Rubiano's grandsire, Mr. Prospector, so the brothers appear 3x2. *Highflyer International, racing and breeding consultants, specialize in pedigree research and individualized matings. Stakes winners **Let Bob Do It** (Percifal) and **Broadway Beau** (Beau Genius) lead the list of 239 nominations to the Mid-America Triple, the \$1 million turf series for three-year-olds at Arlington. The Mid-America Triple begins June 30 with the GII \$200,000 Arlington Classic at nine furlongs, followed by the GII \$300,000 American Derby at a mile and three-sixteenths July 21, and the GI \$500,000 Secretariat S. at a mile and a quarter August 25. Let Bob Do It, winner of three of his six starts this year, captured the GIII Cinema H. at Hollywood last Saturday for his second graded win of the year; Broadway Beau, winner of the Crown Royal American Turf S. at Churchill in May, finished second in the Jefferson Cup in his most recent start.

Serena's Song--the hot air balloon, not the racehorse--will be at Thistledown to celebrate Ohio Derby Week, offering free balloon rides to disabled children Tuesday, June 18 and Wednesday, June 19. The track will sponsor two sessions of rides daily, from 6-9:00 a.m. and from 5-8:00 p.m. Founded by Gary Waldman of Correctionville, Iowa, the world's only FAA-approved wheelchair-accessible hot air balloon was named for Waldman's daughter, Serena, 12, who suffers from Cerebral Palsy.

Local News: England

A great race is in store for the G1 St James's Palace S. for three-year-olds over a mile at the Royal Ascot meeting June 18 when both the French 2000 Guineas winner, undefeated **Ashkalani (Ire)** (Soviet Star), and the Irish 2000 Guineas winner **Spinning World** (Nureyev) are due to renew rivalry and the race could have added spice with the participation of the Godolphin-owned English 2000 Guineas winner **Mark Of Esteem (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}), who had to miss last week's Epsom Derby because of a training setback. Trainers of both French colts, Alain de Royer-Dupre (Ashkalani) and Jonathan Pease (Spinning World) have confirmed that their charges will be at Ascot, but Royer-Dupre may have to look for another rider for Ashkalani if the Aga Khan colt's regular partner Gerald Mosse loses his appeal against a four-day suspension which he picked up in a modest claimer at Chantilly Sunday. That appeal is due to be heard on Friday; Michael Kinane will pick up the mount if the appeal is unsuccessful. Also a definite for the race is a fourth Group One winner, last year's Racing Post Trophy hero **Beauchamp King (GB)** (Nishapour {Fr}), who has subsequently finished fifth in the Guineas races at Newmarket and in Ireland. A spokesman for his trainer John Dunlop said: "He seems in top form and is an intended starter. But we could do with some rain."

Geoff Wragg, whose brilliant Pentire (GB) took last year's King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot, confirmed yesterday that he will bid to add to that win with **Prize Giving (GB)** (Most Welcome {GB}) when the 1996 renewal of the 12-furlong Group Two event is run June 21. Michael Hills, Pentire's regular partner and hero of last Saturday's Derby on Shaamit, will take the mount on Prize Giving as the chestnut colt attempts to improve on his second-place behind Don Micheletto (GB) in the Predominate S. over 10 furlongs at Goodwood last month. Wragg, never one to exude over-confidence, admits that his charge should have a decent chance next week following the form boost given to the Goodwood race when Don Micheletto later finished a close fourth in Chantilly's Prix du Jockey-Club. "It is working out reasonably well," the Newmarket trainer said. "So I hope we can win the King Edward again."

Classic Cliche (Ire) (Salse), winner of last year's St. Leger at Doncaster, is to challenge **Double Trigger (Ire)** (Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}) in the two-and-a-half mile Ascot Gold Cup, Britain's longest Group One event, June 20.

LSI GOLDEN OPPORTUNITY

"It just goes to show you how much the experts know," said Cari Rovner in the first flush of victory after winning the first-ever LSI handicapping contest at Belmont Park May 11. She had picked two winners from the five paper \$20 bets that were provided each of the more than 100 entrants, all members of the LSI Gold syndicate of horse owners.

Rovner scored with Runway Kyle, \$16.80, in the fourth race, and Sweetzie, 20.20, in the eighth for a total of \$379 in winnings.

"I picked Runway Kyle because I have a favorite cousin named Kyle," she said, "and Sweetzie is one of the names I have for my husband." So much for those armed with computer programs, speed figures and trip notes.

Her husband, a.k.a. Marc Rovner, is the president and guiding light behind LSI Gold. Rovner, a lawyer involved with securities and real estate syndication, used his expertise to become involved in his first love, horse racing. He organized LSI Gold, a syndicate of small investors, in 1991; it has grown to include more than 150 shareholders. The syndicate's first horse was Same Old Wish; it has now run more than 20 horses in New York, New Jersey and at Midwestern tracks.

Howie Teshler and claiming specialist Mitchell Friedman train the LSI horses in New York, Neil Kaufman handles the New Jersey string. The syndicate won 17 races on its best year and has already won eight this year, including its first stakes victory with Medusa at Garden State.

Rovner informs investors when their horses are running, provides them with passes to the track, puts out a newsletter and this year, instead of a Christmas party, instituted the handicapping competition.

There were 101 handicapping entrants. Forty-nine picked a winner in at least one race; 52 were shut out. The New York Racing Association's Steve Crist, an honorary entry, had only the \$6.80 winner Danseuse, while SportsChannel's Harvey Pack, another honorary entrant, was shut out. Three of the first four and five of the top 10 finishers were women.

Cari Rovner, a social worker, is expecting the Rovner's first child in August. Second-place finisher Stacy Turman, who won \$318, is a hospital social worker. Third-place finisher Robert Rotunno, \$242, is a security guard. The LSI roster includes doctors, lawyers, a women's college basketball coach, TV news correspondent Richard Vileriani and, at one time, a pro wrestler. Many of the partners met on the fourth floor of the Belmont Park clubhouse, while others sent faxes. They have invested from \$2,000 to \$40,000 to earn a piece of one or several horses.

A spirit of merriment prevailed May 11, the afternoon of the handicapping contest, as Marc Rovner presided over a chalkboard that kept a running account of the competition.
