STAR STANDARD TO MISS BROOKLYN

HANDICAP Star Standard (Risen Star), expected to be the favorite in Saturday's GII Brooklyn H. at Belmont, will miss the race due to problems with bruised feet. "He bruised both of his feet and we're concerned about it," said trainer Nick Zito. "It's on the bulbs of his feet. Fortunately, the X-rays were negative." Zito was unsure when Star Standard, who has not run since his victory in the GI Pimlico Special May 11, will return to the races. "Any race is possible," he said. "I'm going to play it by ear." With Star Standard out, Gulfstream Park H. winner **Wekiva Springs** (Runaway Groom), fourth in the Pimlico Special, may be an odds-on favorite in the Brooklyn.

MARIA'S MON IN SHARP WORK Eclipse Award winner **Maria's Mon** (Wavering Monarch) took another significant step on the comeback trail yesterday, working five furlongs in :59. Robbie Davis was aboard for the work over the main track at Belmont. Elated with the progress his colt has made since being sidelined last year with a fractured left front cannon bone, trainer Rick Schosberg said the three-year-old colt should be ready to run around the end of June. "He's coming back great," Schosberg said. "Robbie said he never, never moved on him. He changed his hold at the top of the stretch and he went into another gear." Schosberg tentatively plans to run Maria's Mon in an allowance, the Jim Dandy and then the Travers. The trainer also reported that 1994 Pimlico Special winner **As Indicated** (Czaravich) has been retired. The gelding had run just once since his Pimlico Special win, finishing second in an allowance race at Belmont last year. "It just wasn't worth it to keep trying with him," said Schosberg, citing lingering problems. As Indicated will be sent to Schosberg's farm in Muttontown, New York.

TAX DEDUCTION FOR HORSE OWNERS

PRESERVED Kentucky Senator Mitch McConnell announced yesterday that the Senate Finance Committee has approved his request to maintain the federal income tax expense deduction for horses. The tax deduction had been repealed as part of the Small Business Job Protection Act, a tax bill passed by the House of Representatives earlier this year. McConnell pointed out that since tax deductions were retained regarding other forms of livestock, they should be retained for horses as well.

Sunday, Golden Gate Fields:

GOLDEN GATE H.-GII, \$200,000, 3yo/up, 11fT

Beau Temps (GB) (Mtoto {GB}), fourth in the GI San Juan Capistrano H. in his last outing April 21, has been added to the cast for the Golden Gate H. Trainer Brian Sweeney declared the four-year-old a starter after watching him work a half-mile in :47 3/5 Wednesday at Santa Anita. "He worked well," Sweeney said. "I had him galloping out five-eighths in :59 3/5 and three-quarters in 1:13 and change. I think the time off since the San Juan has done him good." Also working for the Grade II event yesterday was **Bon Point (GB)** (Soviet Star), winner of the Bo Derek S. and the Grand Flotilla H., both over the Hollywood turf, in his last two starts. The six-year-old breezed five furlongs in 1:03 2/5 at Hollywood Park. Also pointing to the race are French stakes-winner **Sand Reef (GB)** (Reference Point {GB}); **GSW Party Season (GB)** (Shirley Heights {GB}); **Tzar Rodney (Fr)** (Assert {Ire}), a GSW in the U.S. and France; and 1994 G1 Italian Derby winner **Time Star** (Manila).

Saturday, Churchill Downs:

STEPHEN FOSTER H.-GII, \$150,000a, 3yo/up, 1 1/8m

Tejano Run (Tejano), third as the favorite in the GII Washington Park H. at Arlington May 26, will miss Saturday's Stephen Foster H. because of a bruised foot. The four-year-old sustained the injury to his left front foot during a routine morning gallop earlier this week. "He's been walking the shedrow, but is still a little tender on it," said trainer Kenny McPeck. "I could probably make the race, but we're better off just skipping it." **Knockadoon** (Dixieland Band), who won Keeneland's GIII Ben Ali S. two starts back, breezed a half-mile in :49 3/5 over a sloppy Churchill Downs track Tuesday morning in preparation for the Stephen Foster. Both GIII National Jockey Club H. winner **Prory** (Procida) and MGSP Tenants Harbor (Badger Land) worked over a surface labeled "good" at Churchill Wednesday. Prory went a half-mile in :50, while Tenant's Harbor covered the same distance in :52 4/5.

ROAR CHANGES HANDS Roar (Forty Niner), winner of this year's GII Jim Beam S. and GIII Swale S., has been sold by Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider to William S. Farish and John J. Greely III, according to a story in yesterday's *Blood-Horse Online Daily Edition*. The three-year-old colt, who has won four races and \$487,507, will leave trainer Shug McGaughey's Belmont Park barn this week and ship to Southern California to be conditioned by Richard Mandella. Out of the Northern Dancer mare Wild Applause, Roar is a half-brother to Grade I winner Eastern Echo (Damascus) and Grade III winner Blare of Trumpets (Fit to Fight).

TOBA AWARDS DINNER SLATED FOR

SEPTEMBER ESPN broadcaster Chris Lincoln will emcee the 1996 National Breeders Awards Dinner of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' Association (TOBA). The Dinner, scheduled for Friday, September 6 at Gainsborough Farm near Lexington, Kentucky, will feature a special performance by recording stars Aaron Neville and The Neville Brothers Band. "When the Nevilles performed at our dinner in 1993," explained TOBA Executive Director John Hamilton, "it was truly a memorable evening. Despite the Nevilles recent surge in national popularity, I am very pleased we were able to book them again." At its Dinner, TOBA annually presents the "Breeder of the Year" awards from its affiliate state breeders and owners associations around the country. New to the event this year will be an auction of 1997 stallion seasons for some of the leading sires in the industry. Invitations and ticket information will be mailed August 1.

HAWTHORNE RELEASES STAKES SCHEDULE

The 60th running of the Hawthorne Gold Cup is the centerpiece of Hawthorne Race Course's \$1.9 million stakes schedule, unveiled Tuesday by Hawthorne President Thomas F. Carey and Racing Secretary Frank Arsenault. The \$300,000 Gold Cup, a Grade II event for older horses at 1 1/4-miles, will be run Saturday, November 16, three weeks after the Breeders' Cup. The Hawthorne Gold Cup is one of four races to receive a \$50,000 purse increase from 1995. Also boosted are the purses of the Oct. 19 GIII Hawthorne Derby to \$200,000; the Nov. 2 Robert F. Carey Memorial H. to \$150,000; and the Nov. 17 Hawthorne Juvenile to \$150,000. An expanded Illinois Festival of Racing is slated for Saturday, Nov. 9, featuring six races restricted to Illinois-breds with total purse money in excess of \$400,000. Hawthorne's 67-day Thoroughbred meet runs from October 14 through December 31.

DUBAI TEAM PLANS ASCOT RAID Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin team is compiling a powerful challenge for next week's four-day Royal Ascot meeting. The Dubai operation, with Saeed bin Suroor as its trainer, will open up Tuesday with the four-year-old colt **Charnwood Forest (Ire)** (Warning) in the G2 Queen Anne S. over a mile. He finished runner-up in Newbury's G1 Lockinge S. last time out and is on target for a rematch with his conqueror Soviet Line (Ire) (Soviet Star) next week. **Mark Of Esteem (Ire)** (Darshaan), successful in last month's British 2000 Guineas, is being prepared for the G1 St James's Palace S., but will need to show connections he is fully recovered from his recent setback before being given the go-ahead to take on other top three-year-old milers. **Kumait (Danzig)**, an unraced juvenile, will bid to collect the G3 Coventry S. over six furlongs next Tuesday. **Russian Revival (Nureyev)**, second in last year's Coventry, is the Godolphin hope for Wednesday's G3 Jersey S. over seven furlongs. **Classic Cliche (Ire)** (Salse), winner of last season's St. Leger, tackles Thursday's G1 Ascot Gold Cup over 2 1/2-miles, and **Easy Option (Ire)** (Prince Sabo {GB}) will bear the team's now famous blue silks in the G2 King's Stand S. at five furlongs just one week from tomorrow. All these are to be partnered by dual British champion jockey Frankie Dettori.

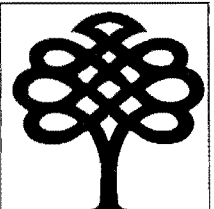
