CIGAR BACK ON TRACK Cigar (Palace Music) went back to the track yesterday morning for the first time since the June 1 Massachusetts H. The 1995 Horse of the Year, recovering from a bruised right front foot, jogged around the Belmont main track and could breeze by next week, according to trainer Bill Mott. "If everything goes well, we'll work him in another week," said Mott. "He made it to the track today and it looks like things are going well." Mott said that if progress continues to be smooth, a July 13 or 14 date for the proposed \$1 million race at Arlington Park would be ideal.

JAPANESE OFFER FOR UNBRIDLED Japanese buyers, who have taken home many of Europe's top stallions recently, have now put **Unbridled** (Fappiano) on their shopping list. The 1990 Kentucky Derby and Breeders' Cup Classic hero is currently subject of an offer amounting to \$13 million from a syndicate of Japanese breeders hoping to secure the nine-year-old to stand next year in Hokkaido. Unbridled won eight of 24 races and has been making a major impact on American racing since going to stud. His best products to date are Unbridled's Song, last year's juvenile champion, and Grindstone, this May's Kentucky Derby winner.

SANDPIT TOPS CAESARS INTERNATIONAL WEIGHTS According to Atlantic City Director of Racing Ed Vomacka, "The 1996 Caesars field could be the best ever gathered together for the Grade I turf fixture. The institution of the bonus by Caesars, joining Atlantic City and Hollywood Park's two premier turf races, has increased the depth of quality tremendously." Last year's winner of the GI Caesars International H., **Sandpit (Brz)** (Baynoun {Ire}) tops the weights for this year's renewal, set for June 22, at 122 pounds. Owned by La Sierra Thoroughbreds, the six-year-old captured both legs of the first-ever East/West Challenge, also winning the 1995 Caesars Palace Turf H. at Hollywood. The co-highweight is last year's turf champion **Northern Spur (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). **Labeeb (GB)** (Lear Fan), winner of last year's GI Hollywood Derby, gets in with 118. All three winners of this year's Early Times series races, Classic hero **Mecke** (Maudlin), Dixie winner **Gold and Steel (Fr)** (Shining Steel {GB}) and Manhattan victor **Flag Down** (Deputy Minister), are at 117 on the list. The Caesars International will be televised live on ESPN from 6-7:00 p.m. EDT.

LADY CARLA HEADS IRISH DERBY MARKET

Irish bookmakers have installed **Lady Carla (GB)** (Caerleon) as 6-4 favourite for the Budweiser-sponsored Irish Derby June 30 after news that her owner Wafic Said is now considering that race as her next target. Said's filly won Epsom's Oaks by nine lengths last time out and was quickly earmarked for the Irish equivalent July 14. However, now his original Irish Derby hope **King Alex (GB)** (Rainbow Quest) has suffered a setback, Said will be discussing a switch for Lady Carla with her trainer Henry Cecil. Tim Bulwer-Long, racing manager for Said, stated: "The original plan was to go for the Irish Oaks, but now we are considering the Derby. We will make a definite decision after talking to Henry Cecil this weekend." A rescheduling for Lady Carla would mean an exciting clash with Epsom Derby hero **Shaamit (Ire)** (Mtoto {GB}). He is 2-1 second favourite for the Irish event.

YORKSHIRE OAKS AIM FOR SILA Sil Sila (Ire)

(Marju {Ire}), winner of Sunday's Prix de Diane at Chantilly, will have her next outing in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks August 21. Bryan Smart, the former jump jockey who trained her to win the French event on his first professional visit to that country, has already indicated that the filly will not be supplemented for the Irish Oaks June 30 as the cost--£25,000 (approximately \$37,775)--is considered too high a price to pay to test her stamina at more than the 10 furlongs of the Diane. Smart said: "We will see at York is she gets a mile and a half. I think she will, Ray (Cochrane, her regular rider who missed out on the French success through injury) thinks she will and, if she does, we will be thinking about the Prix Vermeille and the Arc later on. If she doesn't, then we'll prepare her for either the English or Irish Champion S. (both at 10 furlongs)."

Two of the top candidates for the June 30 GI Hollywood Gold Cup prepped for the \$1 million event Friday morning. Trainer Richard Mandella sent out his Gold Cup duo of **Soul Of The Matter** (Private Terms) and **Siphon (Brz)** (Itajara {Brz}) to go in company, with Soul Of The Matter completing seven furlongs in 1:24 4/5 and galloping out the mile in 1:37 1/5, and Siphon working a flat mile in 1:36 1/5. "They both worked very well," said Mandella. At Santa Anita, Gold Cup possible **Luthier Fever** (Mt. Livermore) went seven furlong in 1:27, handily.

Talloires (Tremolino), out since February with a splint injury, worked a half in :51 4/5 on the turf Thursday and could return to action in a month, according to trainer Richard Mandella. The six-year-old finished second in both the GI Hollywood Turf Cup and the G1 Gran Premio Brasil last year.

Local News: Del Mar

Del Mar work crews have completed more than \$1 million in renovations and improvements for this year's summer season. The upgrades include a new barn, a new inner safety rail on the main track, a sundeck for the jockeys' room, an infield playground, fully renovated restrooms in the barn area and the infield, and the planting of 420 trees and bushes on the backstretch. "For the past several years we put almost everything into the frontside as we went through our rebuilding, but now we're catching up on projects in the barn area," said Del Mar Thoroughbred Club President and General Manager Joseph W. Harper.

Local News: England

Even Top (Ire) (Topanoora {Ire}), a gallant second in Newmarket's 2000 Guineas but injured when 13th of 20 in last weekend's Epsom Derby, is not likely to be in action again until he tackles a Pattern event at York August 20. The Mark Tompkins-trained colt had an interrupted preparation for Epsom and, in what proved a very rough race for several runners, was struck into during the mile-and-a-half Classic. "He came back very sore," Tompkins said yesterday, "and his blood count was all wrong after the Derby. That was probably due to the poison he had in his foot during the week before the race. We shall be giving him a break now and then prepare him to run at York. The G1 Juddmonte International or the G2 Great Voltigeur S. are possible targets."

Local News: France

Texan Cash Asmussen, who came in for the ride on French Oaks winner Sil Sila last weekend after the filly's regular partner Ray Cochrane was injured in Sweden, has been chosen by trainer Elie Lellouche as the new partner for his Prix Lupin winner Helissio (Fr) (Fairy King), who was a disappointing fifth as favourite in the French Derby. Asmussen replaces Dominic Boeuf, who has also lost the mount on the Lellouche-trained filly Shake The Yoke (GB) (Caerleon) in next Wednesday's G1 Coronation S. at the Royal Ascot meeting. Olivier Peslier takes the mount. Boeuf has been blamed for both Helissio's defeat in the French Derby and Shake The Yoke's defeat in the French 1000 Guineas. Helissio is due to make his next start in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris over a mile and a quarter at Longchamp June 23.

French trainer Criquelette Head has confirmed that her sprinting ace Anabaa (Danzig) is a definite runner in the G1 Darley July Cup over six furlongs at Newmarket July 11. The four-year-old has won all his four starts this year in France, including the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene at Deauville.

Pascual Bary, trainer of Prix du Jockey Club winner Ragmar (Fr) (Tropular {GB}) has announced the colt is set to take on older horses in the mile-and-a-half G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud June 30.
