HOLLYWOOD GOLD CUP NOTES GI Strub S. winner **Helmsman** (El Gran Senor) breezed six furlongs in 1:14 4/5 Wednesday at Hollywood Park in preparation for the \$1 million Hollywood Gold Cup June 30. "It was just a slow work," said trainer Wally Dollase. Working for the Grade I event Tuesday at Hollywood Park was GI Santa Anita H. winner **Mr Purple** (Deputy Minister), who went five furlongs in 1:01 2/5. In other Hollywood Gold Cup news, MGM Grand Hotel/Casino in Las Vegas has introduced a number of proposition wagers for the race. Visitors to the Las Vegas hotel and casino can wager on head-to-head match-ups, the final time of the race, the winning margin and the possibility of a photo finish. One of the more interesting wagers offered by MGM Grand is whether or not the exacta will be completed by trainers with last names beginning with the letter "M." Currently, three "M" trainers are pointing a total of five horses toward the 1 1/4-mile race: Richard Mandella (Soul of the Matter, Siphon {Brz} and Dare and Go); Ron McAnally (Mr Purple); and Bill Mott (Geri). The MGM Grand Hotel/Casino will offer a \$2 million bonus to a horse that sweeps the Santa Anita H., Hollywood Gold Cup and Pacific Classic, a \$500,000 Participation Bonus and a \$100,000 Jockey Bonus. The only horse who remains eligible for the \$2 million bonus is Big 'Cap hero Mr Purple.

EMERALD DOWNS OPENS TODAY Emerald Downs in Auburn, Washington opens its inaugural season today with an 11-race live card that features the \$60,000-added Auburn Breeders' Cup for three-year-olds and up at 1 1/16-miles. The race has attracted a field of 12 top competitors, including MGSW **Lykatill Hill** (Pilgrim), 1994 GI Secretariat S. winner **Vaudeville** (Theatrical {Ire}), 11-time stakes-winner **Sneakin Jake** (Table Run), 12-time stakes-winner **Military Hawk** (Colonel Stevens) and 10-time stakes-winner **Funboy** (Gumboy). Gates will open at 11:30 a.m. for the 2:30 p.m. first post. The inaugural season runs through November 4.

Jockey Olivier Peslier proved ice cool in a very hot renewal of this Group One classic. Dance Design set a good pace ahead of Poule d'Essai heroine TA RIB (Mr. Prospector). But Peslier always kept that leading duo in his sights and, after easing his mount out with a furlong to run, hit the front without resorting to his whip. Last Second lived up to her name by coming with a strong late flourish. However, the winning jockey simply pushed Shake The Yoke all the way to the line and won with something to spare. Connections of the successful filly admit she "is not an easy ride" and want to retain Peslier's services whenever they can. They will be hoping he is on board again when she runs next in Longchamp's Prix du Moulin Sept. 9 and after that in the Queen Elizabeth II S. back at Ascot Sept. 28. Peslier said, "Shake The Yoke is only small, but she has a very big heart. I have ridden her many times in the morning, so I know her really well. She is so strong in a finish that, although I saw the second coming, I was sure she would do enough to win. I was worried only for about two seconds."

Lucayan Prince, beaten on all three of his previous starts this year, started at 50-1 odds here. SANDHILL (IRE) (Danehill) set a decent gallop for six of the seven furlongs with eventual fourth ALMUSHTARAK (IRE) (Fairy King) just behind him. Ramooz hit the front next and seemed to have taken a winning advantage before Lucayan Prince, held back in the early stages, took off in the last 50 yards and won comfortably. MY BRANCH (GB) (Distant Relative), the favorite, was a huge disappointment, and ALL-ROYAL (IRE) (Royal Academy) encountered bad traffic congestion before finishing fast to take fifth. Winning trainer David Loder stated, "My horses have been so off form this year that they are sure to start at very big prices. But this one has plenty of ability and Richard gave him the perfect ride. You just have to wait and wait with him and then come with one big run--that's the only way he'll he show his best. But I knew if things went well he had a chance of winning."

Michael Kinane, who won last year's Queen Mary S. on European champion juvenile filly Blue Duster, staged a brilliant repeat performance when bursting through from last to first inside the final furlong on Dance Parade. RED GARTER (IRE) (Common Grounds {GB}) disputed the lead in the early stages with Moonshine Girl. The second of those took an advantage at halfway, but Kinane was beginning to switch for his run there and, once he got serious, Dance Parade quickened up impressively. "I liked her when I rode her last time out," the jockey said, "and thought that she might make a Queen Mary filly. She's lazy--certainly not the type to show up much at home--but the race was run to suit her. They went so fast that I was able to give her a chance to find her feet." Winning trainer Paul Cole, whose success here meant he has now won each of the Royal Ascot two-year-old events during his career, also saddled the second-place finisher and the disappointing favorite MORE SILVER (Silver Hawk). He said, "We've had bad vibes about More Silver over the past few days, although nothing's shown up in her blood tests yet. But this Queen Mary is a race I've always wanted to win and now I am hoping for a celebratory drink. Dance Parade is likely to have a little bit of a break now and then we will bring her back for something over six furlongs. She'll definitely stay a mile later on."

Double Trigger, winner of last year's Gold Cup, bids to land the G1 event for a second successive season this afternoon. Stamina is the Mark Johnston-trainee's strong suit and he usually wears down his opponents by setting a strong gallop from the start. But, if Godolphin's **Classic Cliche** can prove as effective at this extreme distance as he did when taking the 1995 St. Leger at Doncaster, another major event is likely to be claimed by the prolific Dubai operation.

Trainer Henry Cecil, who has dominated the top fillies events in Britain this year, attempts to lift another here with the lightly-raced **Magnificent Style**. Cecil's trainees Bosra Sham and Lady Carla (GB) are already winners of the Newmarket 1000 Guineas and the Epsom Oaks in 1996, so their handler obviously has a powerful distaff team. **Magnificent Style** is believed to be in the same class and, certainly, after beating the subsequent Prix de Diane heroine Sil Sila on her latest start at York, she is a guaranteed short-priced favorite in this G2 event.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin team, which won last year's Cork & Orrery S. with So Factual, relies on Isla Del Rey in an attempt to repeat. This four-year-old filly was successful on her initial British outing in a listed event at Lingfield last month and appears to have another good chance of figuring prominently today. **Rambling Bear** and **Iktamal** may be her strongest opponents. But, in this big field with runners likely to spread out across Ascot's straight six furlongs as they did 12 months ago, starting positions may again be a major factor.

LUKAS STARS BREEZE Several of the headliners in the barn of trainer D. Wayne Lukas took to the Churchill Downs track Monday. **Cara Rafaela** (Quiet American), second in the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. in her last start May 17, breezed five furlongs in 1:01. The three-year-old filly was scheduled to arrive in New York at 3 p.m. Wednesday for her engagement in Saturday's GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont. Also working Monday was GI Met Mile winner **Honour and Glory** (Relaunch), who covered five furlongs in 1:01 and is slated to start next in the July 6 GII Dwyer S. at Belmont. **Serena's Song** (Rahy), who won the GIII Pimlico Distaff H. and the GIII Fleur de Lis H. in her last two starts, worked six furlongs in 1:13 in preparation for Belmont's GI Hempstead H. June 29.

MACKIE RETIRED Mackie (Summer Squall), who was eased in Sunday's Dogwood S. at Churchill Downs, has been retired. The three-year-old filly ran poorly in her final race because of an entrapped epiglottis, according to trainer Elliott Walden. Walden, who owns Mackie along with his brother Ben Walden Jr. and Tom Van Meter, said the filly will hopefully be bred to Mr. Prospector next year. Mackie, a \$550,000 Keeneland November weanling, is out of 1993 Broodmare of the Year Glowing Tribute, and is thus a half-sister to graded stakes-winners Hero's Honor, Wild Applause, Glowing Honor, Sea Hero and Coronation Cup. Mackie herself won the GIII Busher S. at Aqueduct by 6½-lengths in February. She also placed in the GI Ashland S. and GIII Fair Grounds Oaks. She retires with three wins from eight starts for earnings of \$164,579.

Reigning Turf Champion **Northern Spur** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) drilled a bullet five furlongs in :59 1/5 Tuesday morning over a fast track at Hollywood Park, while last year's Caesars Int'l winner **Sandpit** (Brz) (Baynoun {Ire}) turned in a half-mile work in :49 1/5 over the same strip. Sandpit won the GI Hollywood Turf H. in his last outing May 27, defeating runner-up Northern Spur by 3½-lengths. The two California invaders landed at JFK Airport in New York Wednesday afternoon. **Diplomatic Jet** (Roman Diplomat), upset winner of the GI Early Times Manhattan S. at 29-1 odds at Belmont June 8, and Early Times Turf Classic S. winner **Mecke** (Maudlin), are due to ship to Atlantic City from New York today.

Heading the French team is the Criquelette Head-trained Le Triton, the impressive winner of the G1 Prix Jean Prat on French Derby day.

Twice the Vice (Vice Regent) drilled a half-mile in :47 4/5 Wednesday at Hollywood Park. "She went very well; it sets her up perfectly," said trainer Ron Ellis. The five-year-old mare will be trying for her third straight Grade I victory in the Milady after winning the Santa Margarita and Apple Blossom in her last two starts. Also working for the Milady yesterday was GII Hawthorne H. winner **Borodislew** (Seattle Slew), who breezed a half-mile in :50 1/5 at Hollywood. Hawthorne third-place finisher **Urbane** (Citidancer) prepped for the race Tuesday, going four furlongs in :47 1/5. Also confirmed for the race is MGSW **Jewel Princess** (Key to the Mint).

 King Heir won a pair of \$9,000 allowances at Remington Park in April and early May, then shipped to Churchill Downs, where he crossed the wire first in a \$48,600 allowance May 23, but was disqualified and placed second. Sent off the 2-1 favorite here, the consistent chestnut ducked out at the start bumping 27-1 longshot DAYBREAK EXPRESS (Dixieland Band) (4th), rushed up to contest the pace between rivals, reached the front after a half-mile, then drew off in the stretch for the victory.
