### EMERALD DOWNS OPENING DAY A SUCCESS

With a white-capped Mt. Rainier looming over the sparkling teal-and-white grandstand, Emerald Downs yesterday ushered in the return of Thoroughbred racing to the Seattle area after a four-year hiatus. A capacity crowd streamed through the gates for the first live racing in Washington since the close of Longacres in 1992. Track President Ron Crockett, who, with his team of investors, bucked long odds to bring Emerald Downs to life, said yesterday, "We set out to save an industry. It's obvious now that we will. We'll make Emerald Downs work. It will be successful, and people will have fun." One new touch Seattle-area racing fans can enjoy is the U.S. debut of Hong Kong racecaller Robert Geller, who brings lively and insightful commentary to his calls. The stakes schedule includes the return of the \$200,000 Longacres Mile, August 18, and the inaugural \$100,000 Emerald Derby, September 1, and a full stable area housing 1,276 horses bodes well for the future of the 100-day meeting, which runs through November 4.

### FAIRPLEX UNVEILS PLAN FOR ENLARGED

**TRACK, NEW TURF COURSE** Fairplex Park officials transformed a routine discussion of proposed 1997 Southern California racing dates with the surprise announcement Thursday that the Los Angeles County Fair Association plans to build a seven furlong turf course and a one-mile main track around its existing five-eighths oval. Fairplex President James Henwood told the Dates Committee of the California Horse Racing Board that the fair board voted Tuesday to "proceed in developing and proceed to arrange financing" for the project, which Henwood speculated could cost as much as \$10 million. He said the fair association will be "going after governmental assistance." Henwood added that in the best of circumstances, construction would begin immediately after the upcoming race meet (Sept. 12-30) and would be completed in about 10 months, preferably in time for the 1997 meet. John Van de Kamp, president of the Thoroughbred Owners of California, said the Fairplex plan has "tremendous potential--if they can do it. It will provide year-round grass racing in Southern California." Henwood said the project "has been part of the long-range plan at Fairplex," but the timing was "prompted by the proposal for Hollywood Park to have some overlapping dates with our meeting in 1997." Due in part to the Fairplex announcement, the Dates Committee could now delay any decision on the 1997 racing calendar until August.

Sheer class overcame pure courage as Classic Cliche thwarted Double Trigger's bid to collect a second successive Ascot Gold Cup. Last year's winner set off in his usual front-running role and, although the pace was never exceptional, several others were struggling by the home turn. Classic Cliche, however, was always traveling smoothly and, the moment jockey Mick Kinane made his effort to overhaul the leader, the race was won. Classic Cliche quickened well about two furlongs from the post, grabbed an advantage 100 yards later, and kept on without being really hard-pressed. Sheikh Mohammed, head of the successful Godolphin team, said, "It was only a hope that he would stay. Nobody could be sure. But I did not think the pace was too strong, so that gave us a little extra confidence. I think we might bring Classic Cliche back to a mile and half next time. But he proved that a classy horse can stay and we will talk about future plans before making any definite decisions."

**MAGNIFICENT STYLE** (Silver Hawk) set off at a good gallop as she attempted to justify her position as favorite. It was soon clear, however, that she was not completely comfortable on fast going and Shemozzle (Ire) was always niggling at her heels. That filly took a narrow advantage two furlongs from home. But Tulipa, who had always been going nicely for her French jockey, soon grabbed the lead and was not seriously over-worked to hold off the late thrust of Key Change (Ire). Anthony Stround, racing manager to winning owner Sheikh Mohammed, said, "We're absolutely delighted with this performance. Our three-year-olds are limited in their ability this season, but it's always nice to win races here. Tulipa will have a break now and then we'll probably bring her back for the Prix Vermeille at Longchamp (September 15)."

Atraf, an improving three-year-old with two wins already under his belt this season, took advantage of his favorable stands-side draw to earn his first stakes win. Watch Me, from the number one stall, broke best from the gate and set a brisk pace. But Atraf, drawn two, and fifth-placed IKTAMAL (Danzig Connection), drawn three, were always chasing him. Atraf hit the front about 200 yards from home and quickened well to beat those on his side with a fair amount in hand. Ironically, Atraf was declared for this contest mainly because his last success, scored in a handicap at Newmarket, had seen his rating raised too high to give him any further chance outside this Group Three class. Trainer David Morley explained, "He's a typical son of Clantime--quite small--and it would not have been fair to ask him to carry too much weight in any more handicaps. But he loves this firm ground and six furlongs is definitely his best distance."

Tipsy Creek, unquestionably the most mature juvenile in this field, dominated the pre-race parade with his physical presence. For much of the event itself, though, he seemed likely to play second fiddle to runner-up Raphane, who shot out of the gate and quickly established a clear lead. At halfway, however, Raphane began to hang badly left towards the stands and Tipsy Creek, tight up against the far rail, gradually made up ground to lead inside the final furlong. Muchea, also outpaced early, stayed on strongly for third. Quoted at 6-1 in the early morning betting, the winner went to post the 7-2 favorite to follow up his previous victory in a Salisbury maiden event. No firm plans have so far been made for his next outing, but it is likely that he will be kept to sprint-distances in the near future.

**TAKEOUT LOWERED AT ONTARIO TRACKS**

The Ontario Jockey Club's Thoroughbred and Standardbred customers are once again winners, thanks to the recent Ontario government tax reduction on pari-mutuel wagering. The price reductions will take effect either July 1 or whenever the provincial budget is proclaimed, whichever comes later. The following are the changes regarding live Thoroughbred racing at Woodbine and Fort Erie:

*Win, Place and Show*—Takeout drops from current 18.3% to 17.2%.

*Triactor*—Takeout drops from current 29.8% to 26.7% on-track and at Greenwood, and to 28.7% at teletheatres.

*Other Pools*—Takeout drops from current 27.8% to 24.7% on-track and at Greenwood, and to 26.7% at teletheatres.

**STUKA SHUTTLES TO BRAZIL**

**Stuka** (Jade Hunter), winner of the 1994 Santa Anita H., has become the newest American-based shuttle stallion and the first for Ben P. Walden Jr.'s Vinery in Midway, Kentucky. As part of a three-year agreement, the six-year-old stallion will stand the Northern Hemisphere breeding seasons at Vinery and the Southern Hemisphere seasons at Haras Pirassununga in Brazil. "We're excited," Walden told the *Daily Racing Form*. "The deal is not signed yet, but we foresee no problems."
