LITE THE FUSE TO VINERY IN 1997 Mr. and Mrs. Ben P. Walden, Jr.'s Vinery announced yesterday the purchase of a one-half interest in the five-year-old **Lite The Fuse** (Buckaroo), who will enter stud at the Midway, Kentucky farm in 1997. The top sprinter will race for owner/breeder/trainer Dick Dutrow through 1996. A multiple Grade I stakes winner of \$789,185, Lite The Fuse finished in a dead-heat for second in the GI Met Mile in his last start May 27. Plans call for him to point for the GII Tom Fool S. July 7 and the GII DeFrancis Memorial Dash July 20, both of which he won last year. "Racing class and genuine talent is what Vinery looks for in a stallion prospect. Lite The Fuse is at the very top of his class at a mile or less in America and has the most remarkable shoulder and conformation of any racehorse we have brought in," said Ben Walden, Jr.

HORSESHOES A FACTOR IN FATAL EQUINE INJURIES? The annual report from the University of California at Davis on the postmortem program funded by the California Horse Racing Board indicates that certain types of horseshoes can either increase or decrease the likelihood of catastrophic injury to racehorses. According to spokesman Dr. Albert Kane, "Toe grabs increase the risk of these injuries by a magnitude of 16 times, and the larger the toe grab, the greater the risk. On the other hand, we've determined that rim shoes improve the odds of avoiding these injuries by one-third over flat shoes. Rim shoes are a safer alternative while providing a traction advantage." The postmortem program was established by the CHRB in 1990 to determine the nature of catastrophic injuries to racehorses and the reasons for those injuries, and to develop prevention strategies. Efforts are continuing to disseminate all information learned from the program to horsemen and veterinarians, so it may be used to reduce the number of catastrophic injuries in the future.

Oscar Schindler, already successful in Group Three company this year, added a win at an even higher level with a strong late run. **LEAR WHITE** (Lear Fan) was quick to take the lead, with **Annus Mirabilis** and **Posidonas** close behind. They stayed in that order until the home turn, where **Annus Mirabilis** took over and Oscar Schindler began to make ground from the rear. Two furlongs from home the eventual winner finally hit the front, but he had to fight all the way to the post and, in making his winning move, slightly crossed **PHANTOM GOLD (GB)** (Machiavellian), who beat a hasty retreat soon afterwards, causing a brief stewards' inquiry which saw no changes to the placings. Oscar Schindler's owner Oliver Lehane said: "I've had several offers for this horse, but I wanted to come here. It's the thrill of a lifetime. But whenever I have a winner there is a stewards' inquiry, so I was very nervous. I'd like him to come back for the King George (July 27)."

Epsom Derby form was left in tatters when Amfortas, off the board on his three previous starts, made virtually all the running to take his first stakes win at 66-1. Brett Doyle, partnering Amfortas, jumped his mount quickly out of the gates, set a steadily increasing pace and poached a three-length lead turning into the short home stretch. Desert Boy set off in pursuit with two furlongs left to run, dragging Shantou in his wake, but neither could peg back Amfortas, who fought like a tiger to keep the prize. Trainer Clive Brittain, renowned for taking on big guns with what other trainers consider to be only small bore ammunition, was delighted. "I read the comments such as 'won't cut much ice here' but I knew he was a nice horse," he insisted. "He has always had plenty of improvement in him, but didn't make it as quickly as I thought he would do. Now he'll go for the Irish Derby. I've already booked the ferry!"

Pivotal, impressive in winning twice last year but having his first start of 1996 in this, raced just off the pace early while G2 Temple S. winner Mind Games, racing out on his own up the far rail, made his move from the halfway point. However he could not quite sustain his effort inside the final 100 yards and Pivotal, whose trainer considers he might be even better at six furlongs, narrowly won the battle under maximum driving from jockey George Duffield. Winning handler Mark Prescott said: "I had decided that the (six-furlong) Cork & Orrery S. would be the best option, but the owners said they'd rather go for this one. Jack Berry's horse (Mind Games) was definitely at a disadvantage over on the far side. But to be fair to Pivotal he was out there on his own for a very long time and I was impressed with the way he travelled."
