FASIG-TIPTON CATALOGUES 233 YEARLINGS

FOR SARATOGA SALE Fasig-Tipton has catalogued 233 yearlings for its 76th annual Saratoga Summer Yearling Sales, to be held August 6-8, 1996. During the sale's three sessions, 125 colts and 108 fillies will be offered; the sessions will begin at 8 p.m. each evening. Yearlings will be featured by leading lifetime sires Danzig, Mr. Prospector, Nureyev and Seattle Slew. Heading the 12 first-crop yearling sires of 1996 at Saratoga is Strike the Gold, winner of the 1991 Kentucky Derby. Catalogues for the 1996 Saratoga Sale will be available from all Fasig-Tipton offices July 1.

DOUBLE TRIGGER SOLD TO MIDDLE EAST

Double Trigger (Ire) (Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}), winner of last year's G1 Ascot Gold Cup, appears to have run his final race in Britain. Owner Ron Huggins has accepted "an offer too good to refuse" from interests in Saudi Arabia. The sale, for an undisclosed sum, is dependent on a veterinary inspection. The check is considered "a formality" by present connections, despite a foot problem caused when the five-year-old ripped off a shoe while running second to **Classic Cliche (Ire)** (Salse) in last week's Gold Cup renewal. Double Trigger has served Huggins and his trainer Mark Johnston remarkably well in his four-year British career. He has won nine races, eight at the Group level, for a total of over \$600,000 in prize money. Johnston admitted, "It will obviously leave a huge gap in the stable. But the offer just couldn't be refused. It was simply too good to turn down."

KNOCKADOON UNDERGOES EMERGENCY

SURGERY Knockadoon (Dixieland Band), winner of the GIII Ben Ali S. at Keeneland April 25, underwent emergency colic surgery June 21 in Lexington, Kentucky. Trainer Tony Reinstedler told the *Daily Racing Form* Tuesday that the four-year-old colt was "doing just okay" after veterinarians discovered a scrotal hernia had caused an intestinal blockage. Surgery was performed at Hagyard-Davidson-McGee equine clinic late Friday.

HOLLYWOOD GOLD CUP H.-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up,
1 1/4m

Trainer Wally Dollase, already scheduled to saddle **Helmsman** (El Gran Senor) in the Hollywood Gold Cup, doubled his chances Wednesday with the announcement that he will also enter **Nonproductiveasset** (Stalwart) in the race. "He's been training great and I know he can get the distance," said Dollase, who claimed Nonproductiveasset for \$40,000 in 1993. "I know he will like the 1 1/4-miles. He got beat a nose in the (1994) Strub, and lost the Big 'Cap by only 3 1/2-lengths a couple years ago (in 1994). It's a very competitive race. When the winner gets there, whoever it is, you'll know there's a reason why he's there first." Nonproductiveasset gets into the Gold Cup with the light impost of 114 pounds, and will be ridden by Rene Douglas. The six-year-old prepped for Sunday's test by working seven furlongs in 1:26 Monday at Hollywood. In other Gold Cup developments, trainer Ron McAnally has named Corey Nakatani to ride Santa Anita H. winner **Mr Purple** (Deputy Minister). Also, GI Californian S. winner **Tinners Way** (Secretariat) breezed six furlongs in 1:14 2/5 Wednesday morning, and GI Oaklawn H. winner **Geri** (Theatrical {Ire}) arrived at Hollywood at 1 p.m. yesterday; the Bill Mott-trainee was bedded down in Bill Shoemaker's barn.

Saturday, Belmont Park:

HEMPSTEAD H.-GI, \$200,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/16m

Serena's Song (Rahy), highweighted at 125 pounds for the Hempstead, came out of Monday's five-furlong breeze in 1:01.44 at Belmont in good shape. "She's done very well since she arrived here from Churchill Downs," said George Weaver, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "She's a happy camper." Last year's Champion Three-Year-Old Filly jumps up to Grade I company after winning the GIII Pimlico Distaff and GIII Fleur de Lis H. in her last two starts. **Clear Mandate** (Deputy Minister), three-length winner of the GI Shuvee H. May 25 at odds of 23-1, breezed a half-mile at Belmont Monday in :49.15. "She trained good going into the Shuvee and she's trained excellent going into the Hempstead," said trainer Rusty Arnold. "She will run her race, but I don't know if she can beat Serena's Song." Clear Mandate will carry 116 pounds for the assignment.

Dushyantor (Sadler's Wells), second in the Epsom Derby and the early favorite to win the Irish equivalent, completed his preparation for the Group One event with a pleasing workout at Newmarket yesterday. The Henry Cecil-trainee exercised with two stable companions on a strip of turf known as the 'Watered Gallop', and eased well clear under jockey Willie Ryan. Pat Eddery will be on board Dushyantor Sunday, with Ryan expected to ride the Roger Charlton-trained colt **Private Song** (Private Account).

Three English-trained horses--Paul Cole's recent Gran Premio di Milano winner **Strategic Choice** (Alleged), David Loder's Italian Derby winner **Bahamian Knight** (Ascot Knight) and Paul Kelleway's **Lear White** (Lear Fan)--are among the 13 still engaged in Sunday's Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud after Wednesday's first forfeit stage. Also engaged are Pascal Bary's French Derby winner **Ragmar (Fr)** (Tropular {GB}), Andre Fabre's Coronation Cup winner **Swain (Ire)** (Nashwan), Elie Lellouche's Prix Lupin winner **Helissio (Fr)** (Fairy King) and Corinne Barbe's 1995 French Oaks heroine **Carling (Fr)** (Garde Royale {Ire}). TRPB VICE PRESIDENT RETIRES Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau Vice President Donald C. Krause is retiring after more than 31 years of service to the investigative subsidiary of the Thoroughbred Racing Associations. Krause joined the TRPB March 8, 1965 and worked as an agent in more than 11 states before being named its Secretary-Treasurer in 1984. He was promoted to TRPB Vice President in 1988. He retires to his home in Westbury, Long Island.

REMINGTON PARK RELEASES FALL STAKES SCHEDULE

A total of 27 added-money events with gross purses in excess of \$1.2 million will highlight Remington Park's 1996 Fall Meeting, which begins Sept. 13 and runs through Dec. 1. Remington Park Director of Racing and Racing Secretary Mike Anifantis announced the stakes schedule for the 54-day Fall Meeting Wednesday. With the success of full-card simulcasting, the daily purse distribution at Remington will also rise to an all-time high of approximately \$100,000 per day. "We're looking forward to the best quality of racing we've ever had at Remington Park because of the proceeds from full-card simulcasting," Anifantis said. "We're at an all-time high for purses and we've added a couple of stakes races and increased the purses on a few more." The staple of the 1996 Fall Meeting will once again be the \$300,000-estimated Mathis Brothers Remington Futurity, the richest sprint race in the country for juveniles. This year's event will be held Oct. 20. The main prep for the Mathis Brothers, the Prevue S., has been increased from \$25,000 to \$35,000 and will be run Oct. 6. Other highlights of the stakes schedule are the \$150,000 Remington Green H. Oct. 5, up from \$75,000 last year; and the \$100,000 Red Earth Derby Oct. 12.

Local News, Hollywood Park:

Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms) breezed a half-mile in :51 3/5 Tuesday morning at Hollywood Park. The four-year-old colt is scheduled to run in Sunday's GIII Triple Bend Breeders' Cup H. at seven furlongs. "He's naturally gifted with freakish speed," said trainer Richard Mandella. "It's got nothing to do with what I'm doing. It's something I've tried to teach several others and they're not responding." Regarding Afternoon Deelites' future plans, Mandella added, "The long-range goal is the Breeders' Cup Sprint. It's just a question of how we are going to get there."

Trainer Wallace Dollase saddled his 200th career winner Wednesday when first-time starter **She's an Allstar** (Mister Wonderful {GB}) proved to be just that, taking the sixth race at Hollywood Park, a maiden claiming event for California-bred fillies and mares, by 1/2-length. Dollase obtained his trainers license in 1967, but owned and operated Rio Vista, a commercial breeding farm, from 1969 to 1984, when he resumed his training career. Dollase, who is having one of his best years ever in 1996, will saddle **Helmsman** (El Gran Senor) and **Nonproductiveasset** (Stalwart) in Sunday's \$1 million Hollywood Gold Cup.

Local News, Maryland:

Harold H. Ferguson, who managed Alfred G. Vanderbilt's Sagamore Farm in Maryland for nearly 30 years, died June 19 from a diabetes-related illness, according to a story in today's *Daily Racing Form*. He was 84 years old. Native Dancer (1950-67) dominated the Maryland stallion roster during Ferguson's early years there. The stallion's stud fee rose to \$20,000, the highest ever for a Maryland stallion up to that time.

Local News, Monmouth Park:

Champion filly **Serena's Song** (Rahy) was highweighted at 125 pounds for the GII Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup H., to be run at Monmouth July 4. **Serena's Song** is expected to skip the race and run instead in the GI Hempstead H. at Belmont this Saturday. Other top fillies and mares weighted for the Molly Pitcher include **Twice the Vice** (Vice Regent), 122 pounds; **Exotic Wood** (Rahy), 120; **Golden Bri** (Gold Alert) and **Halo America** (Waquoit), 117; **Alcovy** (Salutely) and **Rogues Walk** (Ends Well), 116.

YANKS MUSIC (f, 3, *Air Forbes Won--Traipsing, by Darby Creek Road*)

Beaten favorite when odds-on for the GI Acorn S.--the only defeat of her five-race career--Yanks Music fulfilled the promise of her early efforts with a game victory in the GI Mother Goose S.

Yanks Music's sire, the Wood Memorial winner Air Forbes Won, has never been a particularly fashionable stallion, but he is a more than competent one with over 30 stakes-winners in his first 10 crops, among them Mercedes Won, Cool Air, Air Worthy and Through Flight.

Traipsing, the dam of Yanks Music, is by Darby Creek Road (a grandson of Hail to Reason) out of Boasting (a daughter of the mare Bebopper). This makes her pedigree rather similar to Air Forbes Won's Grade II winner Through Flight, who is out of a mare by Stop the

Music (by Hail to Reason out of Bebopper).

Yanks Music is inbred to Bold Ruler 4x4 and Heliopolis 5x5, both of these ancestors appearing in the pedigree via genetic relatives. In the case of Bold Ruler, the horses in question are Irish Castle (grandsire of Air Forbes Won) and Boasting (granddam of Yanks Music). Irish Castle is by Bold Ruler and his second dam is by Menow. Boasting is by Bold Lad (a son of Bold Ruler) and her dam is by Menow's son, Tom Fool.

The Irish Castle/Boasting pairing is very similar to that found in the good filly Birr. She is by Farma Way, who is a grandson of Foolish Pleasure (by What a Pleasure, the three-parts brother to Bold Lad, out of a mare by Tom Fool), and her dam is by Irish Castle's son Irish Tower.

There are plenty of ways of attempting similar matings combining permutations of Foolish Pleasure, Irish Castle (also in Irish Open and Saratoga Six, for example) and numerous female carries of the Bold Ruler/Menow combination. One note of warning, however: the combination of Menow's grandson, Buckpasser, with Bold Ruler was an almost total disaster. This was not because of the pedigree, which was promising on paper, but was down to physical factors, principally knee problems. If Bold Ruler/Menow is sourced via Bold Ruler and Buckpasser, make sure that animals with sound combination and pedigrees with sound elements are utilized.

The second combination of relatives in Yanks Music's pedigree is Summer Tan and Olympia. This pair are both sons of Heliopolis, and Summer Tan's second dam is by Stimulus, while Olympia is out of a Stimulus mare. If we may be allowed a note of whimsey in closing, we would like to note that three of the horses mentioned above--Bold Ruler, Menow and Heliopolis--are linked. Heliopolis and Menow both go back to the same mare, Santa Brigida, and Menow's fourth dam, Ste. Claire (out of Santa Brigida), has a sister, Bridge of Sighs, who is in the pedigree of Bold Ruler.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

We pinpointed **Gold Star Deputy** (c, 2, **Silver Deputy--Andrea Ruckus**, by **Bold Ruckus**) as a juvenile to watch when he broke his maiden at the beginning of June. This past weekend, he became the fourth stakes-winner (from a total of nine for the sire) bred on the Silver Deputy/Bold Ruckus cross when taking the Clarendon S. (GIIC). The Silver Deputy/Bold Ruckus combination gives 4x4 inbreeding to Raise a Native through a son and a daughter, so the offspring are entitled to be speedy and precocious.

The GI Prioress S. triumph of **Capote Belle** (f, 3, **Capote--Rythmical**, by **Fappiano**) meant that five of Capote's 18 stakes-winners (28%) have been sired out of mares by Mr. Prospector or sons of Mr. Prospector. Capote's sire, Seattle Slew, and Mr. Prospector have some pedigree links which make them look a promising combination, but a Capote/Mr. Prospector affinity might also be linked to pedigree similarities between Capote's broodmare sire Bald Eagle and Mr. Prospector's dam Gold Digger.
