### CAREER OVER FOR NORTHERN SPUR?

Last year's champion turf horse **Northern Spur** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), third in the GI Caesars International at Atlantic City in his last start June 22, came out of the race with a slab fracture of his right knee and will likely be retired. The five-year-old, a Group 2 winner in France before he was purchased by owner Charles Cella, won three of eight U.S. outings and capped off his Eclipse Award-winning campaign with a game neck victory over a boggy Belmont course in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf; he has won six of his 15 career starts and \$1,616,792 to date.

**ALBERT BROCCOLI DEAD** Albert R. "Cubby" Broccoli, the producer of the James Bond films and a prominent Thoroughbred owner, died Thursday at his home in Beverly Hills of a heart-related ailment. He was 87. A native of New York, Broccoli first ventured into racing in the 1950s, purchasing Derisley Wood, a farm near Newmarket, England, with film partner Irving Allen, but it was 30 years before his first major winner, **Dontstop Themusic** (Stop the Music), who captured 10 stakes, including the GI Vanity H. and GI Spinster H. in 1985. Broccoli began concentrating on the two-year-old market in 1990, when he was the leading buyer at the inaugural Barretts select sale; he was also the leading buyer at that auction in 1991 and 1993, and the leading American buyer in 1994, spending more than \$1 million each year. His purchases included 1993 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and 1994 GI Santa Anita Derby winner **Brocco** (Kris S.), GII Del Mar Oaks winner **Suivi** (Diesis {GB}) and GII Del Mar Debutante heroine **La Spia** (Capote).

**KING RANCH UP FOR SALE** King Ranch, Inc., announced yesterday that it will be selling its Kentucky Thoroughbred farm. The farm, located on Old Frankfort Pike near Lexington, consists of 670 acres in the heart of Bluegrass country. Originally part of Colonel E. R. Bradley's Idle Hour Stock Farm, it became home to many of King Ranch's 89 stakes winners in the years following its purchase in 1946. In recent years, it has been operated as a boarding and breaking operation, and was the leading consignor on average at the 1993 and 1994 Keeneland July sales.

**EPSOM CONFIRMS SATURDAY DERBY** Christopher Spence, chairman of the company which runs Epsom racecourse, has confirmed that next year's Derby will again be run on a Saturday. June 7 has been chosen as the date for the 1997 renewal of Britain's premier Classic. A powerful body of opinion—including British bookmakers, who estimate huge decline in betting turnover on the race—had been seeking to have the Derby returned to its traditional place on the first Wednesday in June. But Spence said yesterday: "We've taken this decision after wide consultation with interested parties. We don't, at this stage, need to commit to a date beyond 1997." Lord Wakeham, chairman of the British Horseracing Board, welcomed the choice of a Saturday spot. "Longer-term planning has triumphed over short-termism," he stated. "I believe it's important this national event should be available to a newer and larger weekend audience."

**EVRY TO CLOSE** Evry, one of French racing's most modern and attractive courses, is to close at the end of this season. France-Galop, the country's ruling body for equine sports, made the decision at a meeting yesterday and, although many trainers are against the move, it now appears sure to go ahead. Evry was opened in the mid-1970s and is considered one of the fairest tracks in France, but as there is no nearby training centre and it is rarely well-supported by spectators, it has proved expensive to run. Said Paris-based trainer Pascal Bary: "It's madness to get rid of Evry"; while Criquelette Head argued: "A plan to cut expenses, but keep the race-course open should be drawn up as an alternative."

**ASCOT MISHAPS UNDER INVESTIGATION** Britain's Jockey Club has launched an inquiry into injuries sustained by three horses running at Royal Ascot. **Electon Day (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), trained by Michael Stoute, plus **Leonine (Ire)** (Danehill) and **Merit (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest), from Paul Cole's stable, all returned home from the meeting sore after jumping paths used by spectators to cross the Berkshire course. Action is being planned to cover crossings--which become uneven and discoloured and can cause horses to spook--with suitable synthetic materials. Britain's National Trainers' Federation is also lobbying the Jockey Club about the positioning of the starting stalls at major fixtures such as Ascot. Last week it became clear that the stands' side had a distinct advantage over the straight course, when the starting gates were in the centre of the course and fields frequently split into two distinct groups; handlers believe it would be fairer to have the gate against one side's running rail. Peter Cundell, president of the NTF, has written to the Jockey Club requesting action. "It's all a bit of a lottery at the moment," he said.

**SWINBURN DECISION IMMINENT** Three-time Epsom Derby winning jockey Walter Swinburn should know within a week if Britain's Jockey Club will allow him a license to make a return to race-riding following his fall in Hong Kong in February. Swinburn visited the Club's medical adviser Dr. Michael Turner on Wednesday and consulted a London neurosurgeon on Thursday. All that is needed now to complete his file is evidence from the doctors who treated him immediately after the Sha Tin fall, which left him with head injuries and fractures to his shoulder and ribs. The 34-year-old jockey has been riding work in Newmarket for more than two weeks and is keen to make a comeback in time to partner Godolphin's **Halling** (Diesis {GB}) in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown a week from today. Swinburn has won the last two runnings of the 10-furlong event.

The three-year-old filly will remain under the care of trainer Elie Lellouche to the end of the season; she is expected to make her next start in the Prix du Moulin at Longchamp in September, with the Breeders' Cup Mile as her ultimate goal.
