NORTHERN SPUR OFFICIALLY RETIRED Northern Spur (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), the 1995 Breeders' Cup Turf winner and Eclipse Award-winning Champion Turf Male, has been officially retired to stud. "He's resting comfortably in his stall," said trainer Ron McAnally of the five-year-old, who suffered a slab fracture of his right knee while finishing third in the GI Caesars International at Atlantic City June 22. A MGSW in both France and the U.S., Northern Spur retires with six wins in 15 career starts for earnings of \$1,614,955. Out of the stakes-placed mare Fruition (Ire), he is a half-brother to Kneller (GB) (Lomond), a MGSW in England of \$186,719; and Great Marquess (GB) (Touching Wood), a MGSW in England of \$172,627. No plans for stud duty have been finalized at this time.

HONOUR SEEKS GLORY AT ARLINGTON Met Mile winner Honour and Glory (Relaunch) will pass Saturday's Dwyer S. at Belmont in order to take on Cigar (Palace Music) in the July 13 Arlington Citation Challenge. Stablemate Victory Speech (Deputy Minister) will fill in for Honour and Glory in the Dwyer. "I just think (Honour and Glory) is awfully good right now and it's a \$1 million race with a small field," Lukas said. "We have championship aspirations with him and it's a good time to step out of our division. We'll be getting 12 pounds from Cigar and eight pounds from the rest of the older horses." Also considered definite for the Citation Classic is Jambalaya Jazz (Dixieland Band), six-length winner of the GIII Sea O'Erin H. at Arlington in his last start June 1. In a related development, trainer Jim Ryerson said the current plan is to run Unbridled's Song (Unbridled) in the Dwyer. Ryerson had said Tuesday that the Arlington race was being considered for the three-year-old colt.

HOLLYWOOD GOLD CUP ROUNDUP Siphon (Brz) (Itajara {Brz}), winner of Sunday's \$1 million Hollywood Gold Cup, will now be pointed to the GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar Aug. 10, along with third-place finisher Helmsman (El Gran Senor) and Tinnors Way (Secretariat), who ran sixth. Trainer Richard Mandella indicated fifth-place finisher Dare and Go (Alydar) could come back in the GIII San Diego H. at Del Mar July 27. Mandella added that Soul of the Matter (Private Terms), who was not entered in the Hollywood Gold Cup due to a bruised heel, is recovering from that setback and will also be pointed to the Pacific Classic. "He's going pretty sound right now," Mandella said. "He's barefoot and we'll shoe him in a couple of days."

The Godolphin-trained four-year-old is reported "in good form" by racing manager Simon Crisford. But, with last year's Eclipse hero **Halling** (Diesis {GB}) having booked his place in the Eclipse field with some useful recent workouts, the Dubai team has decided to keep **Charnwood Forest** to a distance he knows and aim him at Goodwood's G1 Sussex S. July 30 before considering stepping him up to ten furlongs in the Juddmonte International S. at York in August. **Valanour (Ire)** (Lomond) is an intended runner as long as the going remains fast at Sandown. BARYSHNIKOV TO SERVE AS DUAL

HEMISPHERE STALLION Arrowfield Group announced this morning that, in association with Haras d'Etreham of Normandy, France, arrangements have been finalized for 1995 G1 Australian Guineas winner **Baryshnikov (Aus)** (Kenmare {Fr}) to shuttle from Australia to France commencing with the 1997 Northern Hemisphere breeding season. **Baryshnikov**, a Southern Hemisphere foal of 1991, is out of the Nureyev mare **Lady Giselle (Fr)**. **Lady Giselle**, Australia's 1995 Broodmare of the Year, is also the dam of champion first-season sire **Zabeel** (Sir Tristram). **Baryshnikov** becomes the first Australian-bred stallion to enter a long-term shuttle agreement between two international studs. John Messara, chairman of Arrowfield, said, "We are most excited about this development. It represents the coming of age of the Australian breeding industry. When we imported the likes of Kenmare and Danehill, our aim was to breed international stallion prospects capable of reversing the shuttle trend. **Baryshnikov** is the first of these." **Baryshnikov** will serve his first Southern Hemisphere book of mares at Peter and Rick Woodard's Yallabee Stud in Victoria at a service fee of A\$7,500 (U.S. \$5,954) before travelling to France in late December.

WEDNESDAYS NO LONGER DARK AT CALDER

The gates at Calder will swing wide open on Wednesdays, normally a dark day, beginning Wednesday, July 10 for full-card simulcasting. Granted approval to do so by Florida's Division of Parimutuel Wagering July 2, Calder will begin simulcasting races from four tracks beginning next Wednesday, with the "live" racing program to continue on a Thursday through Monday schedule.

SUBOTICA'S FIRST RUNNER WINS IN DEBUT

The 1992 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner **Subotica** (Fr) (Pampabird {Ire}) sired a winner with his very first runner when his two-year-old filly **Sweet Defense** won the 5½-furlong Prix de la Marne for unraced two-year-old fillies in France Wednesday. Owned, trained and ridden by the same trio as were associated with that 1992 Arc win--Olivier Lecerf, Andre Fabre and Thierry Jarnet respectively--Sweet Defense, one of seven two-year-olds by Subotica owned by Monsieur Lecerf, a retired concrete magnate, won by a short head. Finishing third in the same race, beaten another four lengths, was **Arazienne**, the first-ever runner for Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner **Arazi** (Blushing Groom {Fr}).

THE VID CONTINUES COMEBACK Joseph Sullivan's turf star **The Vid** (World Appeal) breezed an easy half-mile in :50 1/5 at Calder Tuesday morning, his second work back after surgery for a fractured sesamoid in February. The six-year-old is making good progress, but trainer Marty Wolfson said he is taking it one day at a time regarding mapping out a campaign for the chestnut. The Vid, a seven-time graded stakes-winner of \$937,626, had won his last three starts prior to his injury, the GIII Tropical Turf H. at Calder in November, GIII Appleton H. at Gulfstream Jan. 6 and GII Canadian Turf H. at Gulfstream Jan. 27.

FULL-CARD SIMULCASTS RESUME AT

KEENELAND SUNDAY Wagering will be available on an expanded menu of tracks, both Thoroughbred and Standardbred, when full-card simulcasting resumes Sunday at Keeneland. Up to seven Thoroughbred tracks will be offered during July and, for the first time at Keeneland, Standardbred races will be simulcast starting Wednesday night. Initially, Keeneland will simulcast six days a week--Tuesdays through Sundays--starting at 1 p.m. The schedule will be expanded to seven days a week when Saratoga opens later this month.

PARTY MANNERS TO HERMITAGE FARM

Party Manners (Private Account) has been purchased by Carl F. Pollard to stand stud at his Hermitage Farm in Goshen, Kentucky beginning with the 1997 breeding season. The five-year-old horse, previously owned by Ogden Mills Phipps and trained by Shug McGaughey, won six of 10 starts, including the GIII Widener H. at Hialeah in March, 1995, for career earnings of \$227,640. His dam, the Nijinsky II mare **Duty Dance**, was a multiple graded stakes-winner of \$432,114. His stud fee has not yet been established.

Windsharp, a five-year-old mare, has already defeated males twice this year in the GI San Luis Rey S. and GII San Luis Obispo H.
