BOLD RUCKUS DEAD Bold Ruckus (Boldnesian), Canada's leading sire for the last six years and second on the all-time leading Canadian sire list to Vice Regent, died July 2 from complications of laminitis at Guelph University, according to a story in today's *Daily Racing Form*. The 20-year-old stallion had been treated for laminitis in recent weeks and has been plagued with chronic foot problems. As a racehorse, Bold Ruckus won eight races, including two stakes, for earnings of \$201,913. As a sire, his best progeny include Canadian champions King Ruckus, King Corrie and Bold Ruritana, 1995 GI Kentucky Oaks and Canadian Oaks winner Gal in a Ruckus, Grade I winning millionaire Beau Genius, and graded stakes-winners Demaloot Demashoot, D'Or Ruckus and Hail the Ruckus. Through this year, Bold Ruckus has sired 47 stakes-winners from 12 crops of racing age, his latest being Minshall Farms' Spider Wire, winner of last weekend's Victoria Park S. at Woodbine. Bold Ruckus stood his entire stud career at Park Stud in Ontario, Canada.

REPORTS OF CAVONNIER'S RETIREMENT

PREMATURE? Barbara Walter, who along with her husband Bob owns Kentucky Derby runner-up Cavonnier (Batonnier), has told the *Associated Press* that the three-year-old gelding may race again. After suffering a bowed tendon in the June 8 Belmont S., it was announced that Cavonnier would be retired to the Walters' California farm. However, hope for a comeback has been fueled by a new drug called beta-aminopropionitrile, or BAPN-F, which has yet to receive FDA approval. The drug has shown great success in repairing tendon damage when followed by a prescribed rehabilitation program. "Doctors at the University of California at Davis tell us he's an ideal candidate for the treatment," Barbara Walter told the *Associated Press*. Dr. Bill Davis, who heads the research team for the new drug, said, "In excess of 75 percent of the horses who suffer medium to severe bows will come back and perform at the same level as before their injuries in at least four races." One success story with BAPN-F belongs to a horse named Onion Roll, who recovered from a severe bowed tendon to equal the world record for a quarter mile in :20 4/5. The recovery process takes a minimum of 10 months, and the soonest Cavonnier could return to the races would be in early 1997. Cavonnier has won six of 16 starts for earnings of \$1,139,397. His victories include the GI Santa Anita Derby and GIII El Camino Real Derby.

Wekiva Springs, handy winner of the GII Brooklyn H. in his most recent outing, picked up two pounds for this event and made it two in a row, sweeping to the lead on the far turn and easily holding Mahogany Hall safe in the drive to the wire. The runner-up was also second in the Brooklyn. Said winning trainer Bill Mott, "You can't knock him--he's competitive from a mile to a mile and a quarter, and he won sprints before I had him. There was a new shooter in this race--L'Carriere added some pizzazz. It was a bit tougher race (than the Brooklyn)." Mott added that the gray will be on vacation for the rest of the summer, then point to a fall campaign culminating with the Breeders' Cup Classic. Third-placed L'Carriere, making his first start since finishing third in the March 27 Dubai World Cup, dueled with 84-1 LIBOURNE (ARG) (Payant) early and had a head in front after three-quarters, but tired in the stretch. "Jorge (Chavez) shouldn't have gone with that horse," said trainer H. James Bond. "He shouldn't have been on the front end with a longshot going in :23 1/5. It won't happen again."

Labeeb, winner of his last two starts, the GI Hollywood Derby Nov. 26 and a Hollywood turf allowance May 12, made it three in a row here as the 8-5 bettors' choice. Ridden by regular jockey Eddie Delahoussaye, the bay closed from mid-pack to defeat GII Early Times Dixie winner Gold and Steel by ½-length. "He's an easy horse to train, very willing and forward," said winning trainer Neil Drysdale. "He had a little bit of a cough after the last race, but it didn't set him back too much. If all goes well, the Eddie Read (at Del Mar Aug. 4) is next and then Chicago (referring to the Aug. 25 Arlington Million)." Labeeb's American H. victory was Drysdale's 200th career win at Hollywood Park. The crowd's second choice, last year's American H. runner-up ROMARIN (BRZ) (Itajara {Brz}), set quick early fractions of :22 3/5, :45 2/5 and 1:09 3/5, then tired to finish seventh in the eight-horse field.

Halo America was looking for her first win since starting the season with a victory in the Pippin S. at Oaklawn February 18. Second in three of her four subsequent starts, the gray missed by only a half-length to Serena's Song in the GIII Fleur de Lis H. at Churchill in her latest but faced no such rival here and posted an easy front-running victory under new jockey Pat Day. "This was a competitive field, but there was no Serena's Song to run against today," said Day. "I was encouraged with how easy she went about her business. I don't know the final margin of victory, but it could have been more if I asked her." Trainer Bobby Barnett said the mare would ship back to her home base in Louisiana.

News Continued.**BRITAIN'S OWNERS PUSH FOR FEWER**

RACING DATES Britain's racehorse owners believe the country stages too much racing and have called for cuts--particularly on Sundays--in the number of meetings. Wednesday's annual general meeting of the Racehorse Owner's Association, held in London, heard concerted complaints from prominent members that, because of the recent increase in fixtures, prize money has become too thinly spread and betting turnover has dropped from lack of public interest. Thoroughbred owner Nicholas Browne, who has horses with three trainers, said, "There is too much racing. There is overkill which has become boring for most people. Punters in betting shops cannot cope with it and something needs to be done." Sunday racing, introduced only in the past two years, has not been attracting the crowds it did during 1995 and several owners are now suggesting the sport requires time off in the week to compensate for the additional day. Peter Cundell, an ROA council member and also president of Britain's National Trainers' Federation, argued, "Ireland brought in too many meetings and there they have now cut back on Sundays. They have their serious racing on a Sunday (rather than the many minor cards introduced in England) and we must do the same." Lady Burnham, president of the ROA, agreed. "There's too much Sunday racing," she reasoned. "It will need looking into very carefully."

SOUTHERN HALO STARS IN ARGENTINE

"BREEDERS' CUP" Southern Halo (Halo), the champion stallion in Argentina for the past two years, shone once again at the sixth running of the Carreras de las Estrellas, the Argentine equivalent of the Breeders' Cup, held at Palermo in Buenos Aires June 29. The Carreras de las Estrellas consists of six races, and three of them were won by Southern Halo's progeny. **El Compinche (Arg)** won the richest race, the \$129,155 Copa TyC Sports. Southern Halo's other winners were the two-year-old filly **Southern Spring (Arg)** and sprinter **Wally (Arg)**. Thirteen-year-old Southern Halo, second in the GI Super Derby and GI Swaps S. in 1986, stood his first North American season at stud in 1996 at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky.

MGSW **Exotic Wood** (Rahy) won her first start around two turns Wednesday, taking a 1 1/16-mile allowance at Hollywood by three lengths. "She dominated like I wanted her to," said trainer Ron Ellis. Ellis said the four-year-old filly could make her next start alongside stablemate **Twice the Vice** (Vice Regent) in the July 21 Vanity H. "They don't really compromise each other stylewise," he said. "If we have to run against **Serena's Song** (Rahy), then we'll need them both."

Dramatic Gold (Slew o' Gold) drilled six furlongs in 1:11 3/4 Thursday at Hollywood. The five-year-old gelding will take on Cigar in the July 13 Arlington Citation Challenge.

Local News, England:

Tomorrow's G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown--already depleted by the withdrawals of Epsom Derby hero **Shaamit (Ire)** (Mtoto {GB}) and Queen Anne S. winner **Charnwood Forest (Ire)** (Warning {GB})--saw another significant defection last night when the connections of **Singspiel (Ire)** (In the Wings {GB}) decided to bypass the event. Singspiel finished second in the 1995 Eclipse, but, after discussions with owner Sheikh Mohammed, trainer Michael Stoute has decided to target the four-year-old for Newmarket's G2 Princess of Wales's S. next Tuesday.

Connections of **Sorbie Tower (Ire)** (Soviet Lad), third in Royal Ascot's G1 St. James's Palace S. last month, hope to aim their fast-improving colt for the Breeders' Cup Mile at Woodbine Oct. 28. Trainer Gay Kelleway has already mapped a summer program for her three-year-old stable star, but admits that Toronto is Sorbie Tower's "main objective". Ms. Kelleway said, "The horse lost hardly any weight after Ascot and is in brilliant form. His next race will be the Sussex S. (at Goodwood July 31) and then we plan to return to Ascot for the Queen Elizabeth II S. (Sept. 28)."

Royal Applause (GB) (Waajib {Ire}), unbeaten juvenile winner of last year's Middle Park S., will miss next Thursday's G1 July Cup over six furlongs at Newmarket because he is suffering from a skin condition. The colt will now be pointed to the G3 Phoenix Sprint S. at Leopardstown Aug. 11. Joe Mercer, racing manager to owner Sheikh Maktoum, disclosed, "The horse has got some spots around his hock and won't be ready for Newmarket."

Spectrum (Ire) (Rainbow Quest), winner last year of two Group One events but unsuccessful in both his 1996 starts, is being prepared for the G1 Juddmonte International over 1 1/4-miles at York Aug. 20. The Peter Chapple-Hyam-trained colt, successful as a three-year-old in the Irish 2000 Guineas and Newmarket's Champion S., has not been seen since he ran third in the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury May 18 because, along with some of his stable companions, he has been troubled with a cough.

Vladivostock had taken two in a row at this distance at Keeneland, including the GIII Elkhorn S. April 26, before shortening up to a mile and three-eighths and finishing second in two straight at Churchill. Stretching out the extra eighth once again, the chestnut trailed for a half but made steady progress to reach contention at the top of the lane and finished fastest of all to snatch the victory from front-runner Raintrap in the final stride. The runner-up, odds-on after taking the GI San Juan Capistrano in his most recent appearance April 21, set the pace through leisurely fractions of :51 4/5, 1:17 2/5 and 1:42 2/5 but couldn't hang on in his first start in more than two months.

Smooth Runner was making his first start outside of California and his first in a graded stakes but responded well to the change of scenery. The lightly raced five-year-old, usually with the pacesetters early, sat last after a half in a rapid :45.75 but cruised into contention as they straightened for home and wore down the leaders to win going away. "I never knew he had the ability to come from that far back," said trainer Richard Mettee. "I was a little concerned, but once I saw him swing out I knew we were in good shape." Mettee said the dark bay would return to the Golden State and make his next start in the GI Eddie Read H. at Del Mar August 4. The 2-1 favorite DARNAY (GB) (Darshaan {GB}), a G2 stakes winner in Ireland who had finished second by a neck in his first two U.S. starts, including the GIII New Hampshire Sweepstakes last out, made a bid around the far turn but flattened out and finished seventh.
