CIGAR BREEZES FOR ARLINGTON CITATION CHALLENGE

Cigar (Palace Music) breezed an easy half-mile at Belmont Park Wednesday morning in :48.03 under jockey Jerry Bailey. The reigning Horse of the Year is scheduled to start in Saturday's Arlington Citation Challenge at 1 1/8-miles. Joining Cigar in the starting gate will be GI Florida Derby and GII Wood Memorial winner **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled). At Belmont Park yesterday morning, Dr. Jud Butler removed a 35-layer thick fiberglass patch protecting the quarter-crack on the three-year-old's left front hoof. Butler said a similar quarter-crack on Unbridled's Song's right front hoof, which is still covered by a patch, is progressing well. Owner Ernie Paragallo explained his reasoning behind sending Unbridled's Song to Arlington. "We want to see if the horse is back at his peak, and with three speed horses, the race in Chicago sets up well for him," Paragallo said. "I think on his best race he can beat Cigar, but he might run his best race and not beat him." Bill Mott, Cigar's trainer, was glad Unbridled's Song has joined the field. "I think it adds credibility to the race," Mott said. "There are some other good, legitimate horses in there." A field of seven is shaping up for the event, including **Eltish** (Cox's Ridge), **Dramatic Gold** (Slew o' Gold), **Honour and Glory** (Relaunch), **Tenants Harbor** (Badger Land) and **Jambalaya Jazz** (Dixieland Band). Runners considered possible for the race are **Dr. Banting** (Foligno), **Wild Syn** (Wild Again) and **Polar Expedition** (Kodiack).

CIGAR LICENSED Allen Paulson announced Wednesday that he has signed an agreement with CMG Worldwide, Inc. to handle the rights to champion Cigar (Palace Music)'s name, image, and likeness, with all profits from the venture going to charity. The charities selected to benefit are The Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation, the Jockey's Guild Disabled Riders Fund and the Don MacBeth Memorial Jockey Fund. "I wanted the offers we've been getting to be handled professionally," said Paulson, "and I wanted to make sure that all profits would go to charities that help horses or horsemen." CMG Worldwide representative Kelly McLane Jones added, "Everything about Cigar is of championship caliber, and we welcome him to the ranks of our roster of the greatest American legends of the century." Cigar joins fellow CMG Worldwide clients James Dean, Babe Ruth, Marilyn Monroe and Humphrey Bogart as well as equine stars Secretariat and Ruffian.

Sensation took her career record to four-for-four with this Group Two victory. **SARDONIC (GB)** (Kris {GB}), who had also gone into the race unbeaten, led early at a decent gallop. But Sensation was never far behind and, when jockey Michael Kinane began to nudge at her reins reaching the two furlong marker, the Criquelette Head-trained filly quickened smoothly and went clear. Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine Ta Rib tried to give chase but, with a Group One penalty forcing her to carry six pounds more than the winner, she was always fighting a losing battle. Donna Viola stayed on strongly to get third. Madame Head, who had described Sensation as "lazy, like me" before the race, was clearly pleased to see her charge retain her perfect record. "The filly was backward last year," she said, "so she wasn't entered in any of the big races earlier on this season. But she has progressed consistently since then."

STEEPLECHASE JOCKEY IN CRITICAL

CONDITION Steeplechase jockey Charlotte Brooks remained in critical condition Wednesday afternoon after a spill Tuesday at Delaware Park. The native of England was riding **Princess Tori** (Sham) in the second race. Ten lengths in front the second time down the stretch of the two mile race, the four-year-old filly swerved to the outside, hitting the jump hurdle and then the track's eighth pole. Brooks was taken to Christiana Hospital in Newark, Delaware, where a spokesman confirmed she was in critical condition with head injuries. A story in today's *Daily Racing Form* reports, according to Delaware General Manager John Mooney, the jockey suffered fractured C-2 and C-3 vertebrae. This was the second time in Princess Tori's four-race jumping career that the filly had raced erratically. In her first race over hurdles, April 20 at Tyron, NC, she bolted off the course. Princess Tori was uninjured in Tuesday's incident.

FIRST DAY OF FULL-CARD SIMULCASTING

ONLY AT CALDER A SUCCESS Track management at Calder Racecourse was pleased after Wednesday's first day of full-card simulcasting only (without a concurrently presented live card) proved a success. Attending the facility were 1,371 patrons, who wagered \$334,619. The per capita average was an encouraging \$244. Full cards of Thoroughbred races from Belmont Park, Monmouth Park, Laurel Park and Arlington International Racecourse were simulcast to Calder as well as a dozen intertrack wagering (ITW) facilities throughout the state of Florida for betting purposes. The total amount wagered at ITW sites yesterday was \$374,157, bringing the grand total to \$708,776.

SHARAF TOPS TATTERSALLS SECOND

SESSION Sharaf (Ire), a three-year-old bay colt by Sadler's Wells--Marie de Flandre (Fr) (Crystal Palace {Fr}), brought a final bid of \$71,929 to top Wednesday's second session of the Tattersalls Mixed Sale in Newmarket, England. Consigned by Castle Stables, Arundel, the colt, placed in four of seven career starts, was purchased by Mr. William R. Muir. Overall, 56 horses were sold during yesterday's second session for a gross of \$868,760 and an average of \$15,512. The three-day auction concludes today.

Pivotal is a hot favorite to follow up his recent Group Two victory at Royal Ascot with a win here. Sir Mark Prescott's charge, winner last time of the five-furlong King's Stand S., should not be inconvenienced by a step up in distance. But the French-based challenger **Anabaa** is unbeaten in four 1996 starts and will be a tough nut to crack. **Hever Golf Rose**, last year's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye heroine, is also approaching peak fitness after a relatively slow start to the season.

Sunday, The Curragh, Ireland:

IRISH OAKS-G1, 3yo, f, 1 1/2mT

The Aga Khan's decision to pay a \$40,000 supplementary entry fee for recent G2 Longchamp winner **Shamadara (Ire)** (Kahyasi) has certainly added an extra dimension to Sunday's Irish Oaks. In spite of her addition to the field, Epsom Oaks winner **Lady Carla (GB)** (Caerleon) is still favored here. Lady Carla completed her preparations for the race yesterday at Newmarket and trainer Henry Cecil seemed satisfied after both her final breeze and the news that ground conditions at The Curragh remain officially "good." Cecil said, "She has been fine since Epsom and is in good order." The prospective field of nine fillies also includes: **Camporese (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), fourth in the Epsom Oaks; **Dance Design (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), a Group Two winner last time out over Sunday's course and distance; **French Ballerina (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells); **Key Change (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}), second in last month's G2 Ribblesdale S. at Ascot; **Romanche (Fr)** (Galletto); **Story Line (GB)** (In the Wings); and **Tout A Coup (Ire)** (Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}), unbeaten in three starts this year.

BEL AIR H.-GII, \$100,000a, 3yo/up, 1 1/16m

Dare and Go (Alydar) breezed a half-mile in :49 at Hollywood Park Wednesday morning. "He went very well," said trainer Richard Mandella. "There's a good possibility we'll run (in the Bel Air). We just need to take it day by day since it's such a short time in between races." Dare and Go last raced in the June 30 Hollywood Gold Cup, in which he finished fifth. In other Bel Air developments, **Cleante (Arg)** (Kleight), second to Dramatic Gold in a Hollywood allowance June 19, worked five furlongs in 1:01 1/5 Wednesday. Working for the Bel Air Monday morning were a pair of Ian Jory trainees. **Flying Marfa** (Marfa) went six furlongs in 1:13 2/5, and **R Friar Tuck** (Religiously) covered the same distance in 1:13 1/5. **Bon Point (GB)** (Soviet Star) breezed a half-mile in :48 2/5 Tuesday and remains a possibility for trainer Bobby Frankel. Other probables for the Grade II event are **Dernier Empereur** (Tremolino) and **The Exeter Man** (Capote).

Capote Belle's only loss came in her first start May 11. Since then, the filly scored a six-length allowance triumph and followed that maiden-breaking win with a six-length tally in the GII Prioress June 23. The precocious miss set the early fractions here, then fought back the challenge of Rare Blend in the stretch to win by 1 1/4-lengths. Trainer Dan Peitz said the GI Test S. at Saratoga July 27 will be next for Capote Belle. "Shug's (trainer Shug McGaughey's) filly (Rare Blend) is a nice filly and this race was little harder than I wanted since she's going to come back in 17 days," Peitz said. "But if she comes out of this race as good as she's come out of her other races, she'll be fine." Other races looming as possibilities for Capote Belle are the Aug. 17 GI Ballerina and the Gazelle at Belmont Sept. 8.

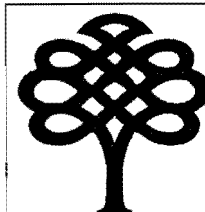

Local News, Belmont Park:

Trainer Leo O'Brien said that GI Mother Goose S. winner **Yanks Music** (Air Forbes Won), beaten favorite in Saturday's GI Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks, will skip the July 20 Coaching Club American Oaks and will not start again until Saratoga. The 1996 Saratoga meeting begins July 26. "I probably ran her back a little quick in wanting to get a race around two turns into her," O'Brien said. "I neglected to think the Mother Goose was as tough as it was on her--she really made a superhuman effort and needed three or four weeks between races instead of the two I gave her."

Local News, New York:

There will be no in-home simulcasting for New York bettors today, as legislation permitting the New York Racing Association to send its signal into New York homes was set to expire Wednesday night. Live racing calls without video will be heard on the racing channel, which will also show updated odds. Also halted due to the expiring legislation were night time simulcasts at the state's harness tracks. In addition, Off-Track-Betting must begin taking a surcharge out of any winning phone bets. The legislation could not be extended because the State Senate was not in session yesterday, and will not reconvene until a state budget is ready to be passed.

Rich Ground was a surprise winner--even to his connections--of this Group Three event. Starting at 40-1 after a win in what had seemed a moderate maiden at Newcastle on his previous run, he was the complete outsider in a field of nine, but his cause was assisted by two factors. CHECK THE BAND (Dixieland Band) did the eventual winner a big favor at the start by swerving right and hampering Juwwi, and then HULA PRINCE (IRE) (Lead On Time) set a suicidally fast early pace. The first three home were, consequently, in the back for the first three furlongs. However, when the early leader began to drop away, those in rear saw their chance and, under a strong drive from John Reid, Rich Ground just sneaked home in a finish of heads. Juwwi was probably unlucky once again inside the last 100 yards, as he was slightly tightened up when his jockey Willie Carson went for a narrow gap. The successful owners Tom and June Vickers could hardly believe their luck, saying in unison, "It is a dream come true. This is our first horse." The next important date for the fortunate couple's calendar will probably be August 18: Rich Ground is to be aimed at Deauville's Prix Morny that afternoon.

The five-year-old, who breezed a mile in 1:38 3/5 Saturday, has not raced since his sixth-place finish in an Aqueduct allowance sprint last November. "We operated on him to help him with his wind," said trainer Jim Ryerson. "He's trained well to date and we hope he'll come back to what he was as a three-year-old."

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

POSIDONAS (GB) (c, 4, Slip Anchor {GB}--Tamassos {GB}, by Dance in Time)

We are often asked if things a long way back in pedigrees can really make a difference. The answer is that they can, and do. We were reminded of a good example of this when the improving Posidonas showed he will be a middle-distance runner to watch in the second half of the season with a game victory in Tuesday's G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket.

Posidonas is out of a mare by Dance in Time, but his second dam is by Welsh Pageant--and here is the really remarkable thing--not only does Posidonas carry Welsh Pageant, but the only two foals by Slip Anchor out of Welsh Pageant mares are group stakes winners, and Slip Anchor's Oaks winner, User Friendly, traces in tail female line to Welsh Pageant's third dam, Picture Play.

If we compare the five generation pedigrees of Slip Anchor and Welsh Pageant, we find the only common ancestors are Nearco and Phalaris (both in the fifth generation). So, what is going on? The most likely answer appears when we examine the pedigree of Slip Anchor's maternal grandsire, the German Champion, Birkhahn. His second dam is Peregrine (by Phalaris--Clotho by Sunstar--Jenny Melton by Melton). Welsh Pageant's fourth dam is Amuse (by Phalaris--Gesture by Sunstar--Absurdity by Melton), which means that Peregrine and Amuse are seven-eighths genetic relatives.

Unless someone has a better explanation, it appears extremely likely that the success of Slip Anchor with Welsh Pageant and his family is principally down to the relationship between two mares--Peregrine and Amuse--who appear in the pedigrees of these successful runners no nearer than 5x6.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

A cross which seems to have been hotly pursued (including two in the upcoming Keeneland July Sale) since the success of Zafonic is that of Gone West with mares by The Minstrel. Zafonic's French-trained two-year-old brother, Zamindar (c, 2, Gone West--Zaizafon {The Minstrel}), scored by five lengths on his racecourse debut recently, and Tuesday, Dazzle (GB) (f, 2, Gone West--Belle Et Deluree {The Minstrel}) was installed as the early favorite for the 1997 British 1000 Guineas after a five-length triumph in the G2 Hillsdown Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket.

Kelly Kip (c, 2, Kipper Kelly--Marianne Theresa {John's Gold}), who scorched to victory in the GIII Tremont S., has a somewhat unfamiliar pedigree. He is from the second crop of his sire, Kipper Kelly, a Florida-based son of Valid Appeal. Kipper Kelly never won a stakes but was both fast and consistent, as he was only off the board once in 11 starts, and finished in the money in three stakes, including the GIII Palos Verdes H. Kipper Kelly has a rather unusual pedigree as he is inbred 3x3 to Intentionally, the sire of In Reality. There is also close inbreeding in the distaff side of Kelly Kip's pedigree, as his granddam, Chalk Lullah, is 3x2 to Native Dancer. Note that these two sets of inbreeding are linked as Intentionally and Native Dancer are both out of Discovery mares.
