ODD/EVEN BET DEBUTS A new way of betting on horse racing makes its debut this Saturday when the American Championship Harness Series presents the first-ever odd/even bet with a five percent takeout on its premier three-race broadcast, live on ESPN2 from 9-10 p.m. Eastern. The races offered in the broadcast will be the Sheppard Pace from Yonkers Raceway (9:09 p.m. post time), the Courageous Lady from Northfield Park (9:25 p.m.) and the \$1 million Meadowlands Pace (9:45 p.m.). The odd/even wager, which pays off to those selecting 'odd' if the 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9 horse wins; or to those selecting 'even' if the 2, 4, 6, 8 or 10 horse wins, mimics popular sports wagers, in which a theoretical half of the audience will win its wager. The wager will only be available through the Ladbroke phone-betting system. Accounts may be opened by calling 1-800-LADBROKE. To wager on the ACHS races, accounts must be opened by today. The odd/even wager will be parimutuel, and will be offered with a \$10 minimum bet. The early morning line for the wager: Sheppard Pace--Odd, 4-1, Even 1-5; Courageous Lady--Odd, 4-5, Even, 1-1; Meadowlands Pace--Odd, 4-5, Even, 1-1. The odd/even wager will be available on each individual race as will the standard betting menu (win, place, show, exacta, etc.) and a Pick Three at a 10 percent takeout.

CANADIAN HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

ANNOUNCED The 1996 inductees to the Canadian Racing Hall of Fame were announced yesterday. The inductions will take place Friday, August 16 at Woodbine in Toronto. The newest inductees include Charles Taylor, president of Windfields Farm and a founding director and vice president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. Taylor, 61, has also served as chairman and chief steward of Canada's Jockey Club and as a trustee of the Ontario Jockey Club. Others being honored are breeders John and James White, Thoroughbred stallion Terror, Thoroughbred foundation mare Yellow Rose, Standardbred mare Grades Singing and Harness trainer Allan Walker.

Anabaa's victory in the July Cup was a "dream come true" for French trainer Criquette Head. As a juvenile, Anabaa had shown considerable talent. However, he suffered an accident on the Chantilly gallops which left him hardly able to stand. Local vets dismissed him as a "wobbler" with incurable balance problems and his breeder Maktoum Al Maktoum told the handler that, if nothing could be done, his permission was granted to have the two-year-old put down. The Head family had become so attached to him, though, that they decided to rest him instead and, gradually, he recovered his health. Yesterday's victory was, therefore, a triumph for patience, but Anabaa demonstrated little of that as he burst out of the gate, grabbed a lead inside the first furlong and quite simply ran his rivals ragged. Lucayan Prince tried hard to make progress over the last quarter-mile and Hever Golf Rose stayed on steadfastly after chasing the winner throughout. But nothing was going to stop Anabaa, who was winning for the fifth consecutive time this year. Madame Head said, "I have been dreaming of this moment, but still cannot really believe it. It is a victory for all the family, especially for Freddie (her jockey brother), because it proves to all his critics that he can ride just as well in Britain as he does in France. Anabaa will probably be stepped up in distance a little now in the Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville (August 11) and we may try him over a mile later on. But I want to keep him to straight courses for now, so the Breeders' Cup Mile is not something I am even going to think about at this stage. Today, though, he has shown everyone he's the best sprinter in Europe."

RETAMA PARK'S RACE CARD CUT SHORT BY ELECTRICAL OUTAGE

Live racing was cut short just after the sixth race was declared official at Retama Park Wednesday night. A bolt of lightning hit a transformer in the area and Retama Park was forced to go to generator power. After power could not be restored in a reasonable amount of time, track management decided to cancel the remaining three races on the card. "It was in the best interest of the horses and the race fans that we cancel," said General Manager Larry Craft. "We wanted to make sure everyone was safe and this was the best thing to do." Power was back on at the San Antonio, Texas facility around 11:30 p.m. Wednesday night. Simulcast and live racing resumed Thursday.

GLOBAL TRADE AT TATTERSALLS JULY SALE

A cosmopolitan Tattersalls July Mixed Sale at Newmarket, England ended on a high note Thursday, registering the second best turnover ever for the auction. Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony said, "It was again an attractive catalogue and produced keen competition from all sectors of the domestic market, as well as buyers from a host of different countries throughout Europe and the rest of the world. Graduates from last year's July Sale have had great success, in particular in Macau and the Middle East, and to see these buyers return is proof of the global appeal of our horses in training sales and the high regard in which British racing is held." Topping yesterday's third and final session was **Punkah**, a three-year-old colt by Lear Fan--Gentle Persuasion (GB) (Bustino {GB}). Consigned by West Ilsley Stables, Punkah, a winner of two of six career starts, was purchased by Mr. J. Ryan for \$62,121. Punkah is a half-brother to Sharp Prod (Sharpo {GB}), the Highweight Colt at Two in Germany and the Highweight Older Horse in Germany from five to seven furlongs. Overall, 34 lots were sold during Thursday's session for a gross of \$420,213 and an average of \$12,359. During the sale's three sessions, 231 horses brought a gross of \$2,789,773 and an average of \$12,076, down 15.9 percent from last year's average of \$14,358.

DETTORI AIMING FOR YORK RETURN Dual British champion jockey Frankie Dettori, sidelined with a broken left elbow since mid-June, is aiming to be back in the saddle in time to partner last weekend's G1 Eclipse S. winner **Halling** (Diesis {GB}) in York's G1 Juddmonte International Aug. 20. The Italian-born rider suffered the injury when thrown onto a horse walkway before the start of a race at Newbury last month. But he was at Newmarket racecourse yesterday giving TV viewers his paddock comments and looking in good shape. He said, "I went to see my surgeon this week and he assured me everything was going well. I have to go back in two or three weeks and hope to start riding again soon after that. I'm hoping to be back for York. But, if that is not a possibility, my next big race will definitely be the St. Leger (at Doncaster Sept. 14)."
