ABC'S JACK O'HARA KILLED IN TWA CRASH

Jack O'Hara, the executive producer of ABC Sports, his wife, Janet, and their 13-year-old daughter, Caitlin, were among the 230 passengers aboard TWA Flight 800, which crashed into the waters off Long Island Wednesday night. The other two O'Hara children, 12-year-old twins Brian and Matthew, were not on the flight. O'Hara, 39, joined ABC Sports in 1983 after three years as a producer with Major League Baseball Productions. A five-time Emmy Award winner, O'Hara was in charge of ABC's Triple Crown telecasts, as well as "Monday Night Football," "Wide World of Sports," college football and basketball, the PGA Tour, the Indy "500" and World Figure Skating Championships. Appointed executive producer in 1991, O'Hara led ABC Sports to Eclipse Awards in 1992, 1994 and 1995.

WILD ZONE PROBABLE FOR NUNTHORPE

Canadian sprinter **Wild Zone** (Wild Again) looks set to make a trans-Atlantic challenge for York's G1 Nunthorpe S. August 22. The six-year-old broke Woodbine's six-furlong course record when winning the Nearctic H. on the grass last week and trainer Frank Passero Jr. seems to have no doubts about his charge dropping down in distance for York's \$155,000-added event. No decision has yet been made over a jockey for the Canadian raider, but whoever rides will be faced with strong opposition. The five-furlong test has already been earmarked as the probably next start for **Pivotal (GB)** (Polar Falcon) and **Mind Games (GB)** (Puissance {GB}), who finished first and second in last month's G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot, and **Hever Golf Rose (GB)** (Efisio {GB}), winner last year of the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp and third on her latest outing in Newmarket's G1 July Cup.

NUMBERS UP AT FASIG-TIPTON JULY With 46 percent more horses sold this year than last, the Fasig-Tipton July Selected Yearling Sale, which concluded yesterday, was expanded to two sessions and saw a total of 259 hips gross \$10,013,500, up 52 percent from 1995's single session, when 177 yearlings brought in \$6,580,500. The 1996 average was \$38,662, up 3.9 percent from last year's figure of \$37,178. There were 134 yearlings listed as not sold. The high bid for the sale came during Thursday's second session. W. S. Farish paid \$300,000 for a colt by Red Ransom--Now That's Funny (Saratoga Six). The bay, consigned by Brereton C. Jones, agent, is a half-brother to stakes winner Akiba (Tejano).

NYRA TO RAISE PURSES Overnight purses will be raised 7 ½ percent across the board at New York Racing Association tracks beginning with the opening card at Saratoga, next Friday, July 26. "If we can be fortunate enough to have good weather and continued good racing this summer, we might look at adjusting the fall and winter stakes programs," said NYRA Chairman and President Kenny Noe Jr.

FALTAAT TO MARGAUX FARM Margaux Farm has announced that champion Faltaat (Mr. Prospector), who stood his first season at Westbury Farm in New Zealand this year, will travel to Kentucky to stand his first season in America at the Midway stud. Voted the 1995 highweight older horse from five-to-seven furlongs in the United Arab Emirates, Faltaat won 13 of his 20 UAE starts. Out of 1987 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Epitome, he sold for \$600,000 at the 1991 Keeneland July Sale. A fee has not yet been set for the six-year-old, owned jointly by Margaux and Westbury.

MACK MILLER, ALLEN PAULSON AND CIGAR WIN NTWA AWARDS Hall of Fame trainer Mack Miller, who retired last year after a stellar 50-year career; superstar Cigar and his owner/breeder Allen Paulson; and turf writer Ed Schuyler have all been honored by the National Turf Writers' Association. Miller, who saddled the 1993 Kentucky Derby winner Sea Hero as well as conditioning three turf champions, earned the Mr. Fitz Award for typifying the spirit of horse racing. Allen Paulson and Cigar were recognized for meritorious service to horse racing with the Joe Palmer Award. Ed Schuyler, who covers racing and boxing for the *Associated Press*, won the Walter Haight Award for outstanding achievement in turf writing. The awards will be presented at the NTWA's 37th annual awards dinner Wednesday, October 23, in Toronto.

FIRST PURSE INCREASE FOR RETAMA PARK Retama Park yesterday announced its first-ever purse increase. Effective Wednesday, July 24, overnight purses will be raised 10 percent. "This has been a long time coming and we are pleased that south Texas has supported racing so we may do this," said Retama's General Manager and Director of Racing Larry Craft. "As business improves and if records continue to be broken, like this past weekend, we will review our purse structure and respond accordingly." Retama Park fans set a wagering record for the 1996 Thoroughbred season last Saturday, betting \$1,286,212. The purse increase brings Retama's daily distribution to approximately \$60,000 per day.

DOUG BREDAR NAMED WOODLANDS RACING SECRETARY Doug Bredar, currently the assistant racing secretary and stakes coordinator at Hollywood Park, has been named racing secretary for The Woodlands in Kansas City, Kansas. Bredar, 34, has served in the past as assistant racing secretary at Atlantic City, Hoosier Park and Sportsman's Park, as well as working as stakes coordinator at Arlington International, Calder, Gulfstream and Hialeah. Bredar will continue his duties at Hollywood Park, which closes for the spring/summer meet July 22. He heads to Kansas next week to get ready for The Woodlands 20-day meet, August 29-September 22, then returns to Hollywood for that track's fall meet. The native of Illinois will also continue as a stakes coordinator and placing judge at Gulfstream.
