INNOVATIVE CONTRACT FOR GULFSTREAM AND FHBPA

Gulfstream Park and the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association are on the verge of entering into a revolutionary new contract. Both sides are calling the agreement currently on the table a "revenue-sharing contract," in which the horsemen and the track will split the revenue from all pari-mutuel sources 50-50. In the past, Florida law dictated the percentage of each betting dollar that went to the horsemen. Gulfstream President Doug Donn has been promoting the idea of revenue sharing for a couple of years; over the last six months, he and FHBPA President Scott Savin worked out the preliminary details of the contract, which was then fine-tuned by the FHBPA's executive board. The contract was unanimously approved at a recent FHBPA meeting. "Doug Donn has been talking about a sports partnership between the track and the horsemen for a long time," said Savin. "This is an opportunity for the two groups to work together toward a common goal. It's as fair a deal for both sides as possible." The plan calls for all pari-mutuel revenue to be split in half, no matter where the money is generated. "What this allows Doug to do is sign the best simulcast contracts possible," said Savin. "And if he feels dropping the take-out will produce the best revenue, then he can lower the take-out (on simulcasting contracts). We asked for a one-year contract, with a two-year extension, so our board could review the results without being bound by a long-term contract. But I'm confident we will be in this for the full term." The contract is expected to be signed by Friday.

FRED HOOPER NAMED JUNE TOBA OWNER OF THE MONTH

Fred W. Hooper, the 98-year-old owner/breeder of last month's GI Early Times Manhattan winner **Diplomatic Jet** (Roman Diplomat) has been honored by the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association as their June Owner of the Month. The award, sponsored by Gainsborough Farm, highlights an owner, farm or partnership who experiences an outstanding month at the races. Hooper, who has been in racing for 51 years and won the 1945 Kentucky Derby with Hoop Jr., had three winners from 14 starters in June; his **Ms. Mostly** (Copelan) ended the month with a victory in the GI Pucker Up S. at Arlington June 29. A three-time Eclipse Award winner, Hooper resides in Florida, where he owns the 912-acre Hooper Farms Inc. in Ocala. He will be featured on ESPN's *Racehorse Digest*.

BRITISH STEEPLECHASE RIDER KILLED Steeplechase jockey Richard Davis, 27, died Friday after his mount, Mr. Sox, fell on him at the first fence in a race at Southwell in Nottinghamshire, England. Davis was taken to the Queen's Medical Center in Nottingham but died after undergoing surgery for internal bleeding, according to a report by the *Associated Press*.

JOCKEY TODD KABEL INJURED Canadian jockey Todd Kabel, winner of that country's Sovereign Award last year, at first seemed to escape serious injury when involved in a spill at Woodbine Saturday, but X-rays have revealed a fractured bone below his left knee, and the rider will be out at least eight weeks. Kabel, now in a temporary cast, will be re-examined Wednesday to see if surgery will be necessary. The meet's leading jockey with 82 wins was thrown when his mount, the two-year-old first-time starter **Ticket To Fly** (Deposit Ticket), broke down and fell while vying for the lead in Saturday's seventh race. **Miswakaway** (Miswaki), with jockey Ricky Griffith aboard, jumped the fallen filly but appeared to step on Kabel as he attempted to roll under the rail. "I was on the track when I heard Ricky yell," said Kabel. "He did one heck of a job angling his mount away from me when she jumped. It could have been a lot worse." Griffith was also unseated but was not hurt. Ticket To Fly was humanely destroyed.
