### NEW TRAINER FOR UNBRIDLED'S

**SONG** Nick Zito is the new trainer of **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled), replacing Jim Ryerson, who was dismissed Monday by owner Ernie Paragallo. Unbridled's Song, still recovering from a non-displaced fracture of a splint bone incurred during the running of the July 13 Arlington Citation Challenge, was transferred to Zito's barn at Saratoga yesterday. The decision to bring in Zito was made during a two-hour meeting between the trainer and the owner Monday. The trainer switch is the latest development in Unbridled's Song's topsy-turvy career, which has included victories in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, Florida Derby and Wood Memorial, high-profile defeats in the Kentucky Derby, Peter Pan and Arlington Citation Challenge, and numerous physical problems and other setbacks. Zito said Wednesday his only priority is to nurse the three-year-old colt through his many problems. Zito vowed the horse will not run again until he is completely free and clear of injury, probably not until next year. "This is a new chapter in his life," said Zito. "This is a new beginning and if anything goes wrong with him my name is on it. I've signed my name to Unbridled's Song. I pledge that I will do the best for him, period. Hopefully, he'll come around and we'll get him straightened out mentally and physically." Meanwhile, Ryerson admitted that while it was not always easy to train Unbridled's Song, he'd rather have the horse than not have him. "If you do this for a living you want an Unbridled's Song," Ryerson said. "If you train, you'd much rather have this kind of horse. I can't say this comes as a relief. When you don't get an abundance of really well-bred or talented horses to work with and then get a chance to work with a horse like this, you want to make the most of it." Ryerson added that he was not given any reason for his dismissal, but the move was "no surprise." Paragallo could not be reached for comment.

#### SCHUYLERVILLE S.-GII, \$100,000a, 2yo, f, 6f

The field of 11, in post position order, is as follows: **How About Now** (Pentelicus), Migliore; **Move** (Forty Niner), Sellers; **Bingo Lil** (Time for a Change), Day; **Perfect Dame** (Hamza), C. Velasquez; **Lost Cat** (Lost Code), Davis; **The Lady's Unreal** (Unreal Zeal), Cordova; **City College** (Carson City), Bailey; **Exclusive Hold** (Phone Trick), Smith; **Classic Approval** (With Approval), J. Velasquez; **Frosty Lady Love** (Manastash Ridge), Perret; **Last Two States** (Alaskan Frost), Santos.

Exclusive Hold won her only career start, a five-furlong maiden special weight at Belmont June 22, by 1 ½-lengths. "This is probably the one time where it's possible to send a maiden winner right into a stakes race, since the allowance races don't always fill at this time of the year," said Exclusive Hold's trainer John Kimmel.

### Saturday, Ascot, England:

#### KING GEORGE VI & QUEEN ELIZABETH DIAMOND S.-G1, \$778,452, 3yo/up, 1 ½mT

Jockey Michael Hills will now be able to continue his successful partnership with **Pentire (GB)** (Be My Guest) Saturday after his riding ban was reduced from three days to two at a British Jockey Club hearing yesterday. Hills was handed the suspension, which would have included Saturday, due to an incident at Doncaster last week. John Robertson, Hills's agent, said, "To be honest, we weren't all that optimistic. But this great news." Hills and Pentire have won six of the seven races they have contested together.

### Saturday, Maisons-Laffitte, France:

#### PRIX ROBERT PAPIN-G2, 2yo, f, 5 ½fT

**Hanan** (Twilight Agenda) and **Ocean Ridge** (Storm Bird) are among the seven fillies scheduled to go postward for this event. G3 Cherry Hinton S. runner-up Ocean Ridge, who is also entered at Ascot Saturday, will work today before trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam decides where she will run. Facing the English pair will be Criquelette Head's **Sheer Reason** (Danzig) and Alain de Royer-Dupre's **Nombre Premier (GB)** (Kendor {Fr}), who both look to be out of the top drawer of French juveniles this year.

### RECORD PURSES FOR KEENELAND FALL

**STAKES** Record stakes purses totaling \$2,610,000 will be offered at Keeneland's 1996 fall meeting, to be held Oct. 5 through Oct. 26. The two Grade I races at the fall meeting have both received substantial purse hikes. The Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup's purse has been increased from \$250,000 to \$400,000, and the Three Chimneys Spinster has gone from \$300,000a to \$500,000a. Keeneland's seven graded stakes this fall also include the Alcibiades, Breeders' Futurity and Fayette, all Grade II, and the Keeneland Breeders' Cup Mile and Thoroughbred Club of America, both Grade III. The purses for the Alcibiades and Breeders' Futurity have each been increased from \$200,000a to \$250,000a; the Fayette has been hiked from \$150,000a to \$175,000a; the Keeneland Breeders' Cup Mile has gone from \$175,000a to \$200,000 and the Thoroughbred Club of America has been boosted from \$75,000 to \$100,000. Mr. and Mrs. Robert N. Clay's Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Kentucky has entered into a multi-year commitment to sponsor the Spinster, which will be run as the Three Chimneys Spinster for the first time in its history. On Spinster day, Oct. 6, each supporting race on the Keeneland program will be named in honor of a Three Chimneys stallion.

**ELLIS PARK INCREASES PURSES** Ellis Park in Henderson, Kentucky announced yesterday that purses for all races, excluding stakes, will be increased 10 percent, beginning with the Friday, July 26 card. The Ellis Park meet opened July 2 with an average daily purse distribution of \$170,000, meaning a level of \$190,000 per day is within reach. The first three weeks of the current 55-day meet have seen a six percent increase in attendance and a 67 percent increase in total handle. At over 200 simulcast outlets around the country, fans are wagering over \$1.2 million daily on the Ellis Park racing program. "The positive reaction to the quality of our racing and the enjoyment created by our fans has generated more purse money than ever before in Ellis Park history," said the track's General Manager Richard T. Schnaars. "Our horsemen have put on the best show the tri-state has ever seen and they deserve this increase. While our on-track handle has seemed to be impacted by the nearby riverboat casino, all our other sources of wagering have seen dramatic growth." The Ellis Park meeting runs through Labor Day, Sept. 2.

**AMERICAN INVASION OF AUSTRALIA** A large contingent of "shuttle" stallions will be leaving North America for the Southern Hemisphere next week. Heading for Coolmore Stud's Australian base is Kentucky Derby and Belmont S. hero Thunder Gulch and Eagle Eyed, while former juvenile champion Dehere goes to Segenhoe Stud in New South Wales. Others scheduled on the International Racehorse Transport flight out of Chicago to Sydney are Brocco, Personal Hope, Chief's Crown, Geiger Counter, Quest For Fame, Regal Classic, Mister Frisky, Is It True, Wild Harmony, Supremo and Muhayaa. Among those flying from Chicago to Auckland, New Zealand are Prized, Wallenda, Senior Pete, Defensive Play, Housebuster and Honor Grades. Cigar's sire Palace Music flies from Japan to Australia, accompanied by Danehill and Royal Academy. Other 1996 shuttle stallions include Fairy King, Last Tycoon, Sri Pekan, Bluebird, Brief Truce, Grand Lodge, Lake Coniston, Night Shift, Barathea, Catrail, Namaqualand, Soviet Lad and Mukaddamah from Ireland; and Suave Dancer, Vettori and Johann Quatz from England.

**SWINBURN HAS RETURN DATE** Jockey Walter Swinburn, the three-time Epsom Derby winner sidelined by injury since February, has been told he will be able to return to race riding August 11--exactly six months after he suffered multiple fractures in a fall at Sha Tin Racecourse in Hong Kong. The 34-year-old was granted permission to renew his distinguished career in the saddle following discussions in London yesterday with the British Jockey Club's Licensing Committee. Swinburn stated, "I'm very pleased to be coming back. It has been a trying time both for me and my family. I accept the reason for the delay. I have been given a fair hearing and the Jockey Club has been enormously helpful. I can't wait to get back, so three more weeks will be hard. But riding is my life and I'm glad it's sorted out."

**MOODY'S CAT TO CALIFORNIA** **Moody's Cat (Ire)** (Alzao), third to subsequent Epsom Oaks winner Lady Carla (GB) in the Champagne Ruinart Oaks Trial at Lingfield Park May 11, has been purchased by Earle Mack and will make her next start in Mack's colors in the GI Del Mar Oaks Aug. 18. In her most recent outing June 7, Moody's Cat set the pace for over 11 furlongs in the G1 Epsom Oaks before crossing the wire fifth. The three-year-old bay filly will be trained in Southern California by Ed Gregson. Her sale to Mack was negotiated for a reported \$250,000 by Michael Hirsch's Global Thoroughbreds Ltd.

**BUICK HASKELL INVITATIONAL H.-GI, \$750,000, 3yo, 1 1/8m**

**Victory Speech** (Deputy Minister), winner of the GII Dwyer S. and GII Swaps S. in his last two outings, has been weighted at 121 pounds for the Haskell by Michael P. Dempsey, Monmouth Park director of racing and racing secretary. "I have spoken to (trainer) D. Wayne Lukas and he's expressed an interest in running Victory Speech in the Buick Haskell," Dempsey stated. Lukas added, "We want to consider the Buick Haskell as an option for Victory Speech. We want to see how he comes out of (last Sunday's) Swaps S. He's 50-50 for the race." **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner) and **Skip Away** (Skip Trial), first and second respectively in the Belmont S., are the expected starting highweights for the Haskell at 124 pounds.

**Devil's Honor** (Devil's Bag), runner-up in the July 14 Long Branch S., breezed a mile Wednesday at Monmouth in 1:38 2/5. "It was what I expected him to do," said trainer Walter Reese. "He's been racing and we don't really need to do too much. Just keep him on edge and his mind on business." Devil's Honor, winner of three stakes this year, was assigned 117 pounds for the Haskell. **Foolish Pole** (Polish Numbers), winner of the Deputed Testimony S. June 8 at Pimlico, drilled five furlongs in :59 4/5 Tuesday and is considered a possible starter for the Haskell.

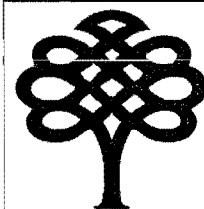
