SOLID SARATOGA OPENING Despite the heavy rains which washed five races off the grass, the New York Racing Association saw a solid opening day at the 128th Saratoga meeting yesterday. Heavy rains hit the area Thursday, and gray, humid skies persisted much of yesterday morning, but that didn't discourage 22,322 fans from turning out. That figure was a substantial increase from last year's opening attendance of 19,052. Total handle was \$10,577,782, off from last year's \$11,817,795. However, due to a delay in reaching a contract with Nevada casinos, all monies bet there yesterday were booked by the casinos and not included in the parimutuel pool. "The crowd was good and we got a lot of positive comments from people, said NYRA Vice President Steven Crist. "Everyone seemed happy to be back." The three turf races carded for Saturday have already been taken off the grass, prompting Crist to note that after today's card, NYRA will have lost more turf races this year than it did during the entire 1995 Saratoga meeting.

FIVE-DAY WEEK FOR ILLINOIS? Arlington International Racecourse's Chief Executive Officer, Scott Mordell, said Friday that the track will make another request to the Illinois Racing Board for a five-day week, this time with the backing of the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association. Earlier petitions were rejected at last fall's Illinois dates hearings and again prior to the start of the current May 12-Oct. 13 Arlington meeting. However, the new accord between Arlington and the ITHA is expected to persuade the Board to approve the new request. With the Board's blessing, Arlington would bring back the five-day week (introduced last year on an experimental basis) the week of Aug. 4, with Monday and Tuesday the proposed dark days. "There was no way we could continue paying present purses with the revenue being generated," said Mordell. "Rather than reduce purses, we will reduce opportunities a bit." The Racing Board is scheduled to meet Tuesday to address the request.

Kelly Kip broke his maiden at first asking for a \$35,000 tag over a sloppy Belmont track June 21, then returned to take the GIII Tremont S. over a fast track July 5. Sent off the 7-5 choice here to maintain his unbeaten record, the rags-to-riches colt, whose sire Kipper Kelly, by Valid Appeal, stood the 1996 breeding season for free in Florida, sprinted to an early lead and set blistering fractions of :21 3/5 and :45 en route to a handy 10 1/2-length score. "That was such fun," said winning rider Jean-Luc Samyn. "He's just a very, very fast horse with a lot of class. He's not a big horse but he's got a great heart and he tries his best all the time." Trainer Allen Jerkens indicated the GI Hopeful S. Aug. 31 will probably be next for Kelly Kip.

How About Now, an 8 1/4-length winner of her only previous start, a maiden special weight at Calder June 16, was making her first start for trainer Michael Hushion here. Sent off at 9-1 odds along with entrymate **LAST TWO STATES** (Alaskan Frost), she was unhurried early while saving ground, angled out and closed ground on the turn then finished determinedly to wear down the leaders in the final sixteenth. Winning jockey Richard Migliore said, "For a two-year-old filly to get that much dirt in her face and to weave her way through the field like she did is really an amazing performance. I went through five pair of goggles and horses don't get to wear goggles. I was very impressed that she overcame the one post and the speed bias." Hushion added that the filly's next race will probably be the GII Adirondack S. at Saratoga Aug. 12. Previously undefeated **MOVE** (Forty Niner), winner of the GIII Debutante S. at Churchill Downs in her last start, finished eighth as the 4-5 favorite. "She didn't handle the track," said her jockey Shane Sellers. "It was a drying out track and she struggled. She was continuously switching leads down the backstretch. It's disappointing to see her lose. She's a much faster horse. It wasn't her day to run. Just throw out this race; she'll be back."

FORMER RACEHORSE WINS OLYMPIC

BRONZE Out and About, a nine-year-old Thoroughbred who captured the bronze medal in the Olympic individual equestrian competition Friday, is better remembered at Rockingham Park as Judge Tomaselli. The horse raced at the New Hampshire track as a three-year-old in 1990, but never finished in the money. That prompted his owner, Dominic Shippole of Worcester, Massachusetts, to sell him for around \$500. The horse's new owner, 34-year-old Kerry Milliken of Westport, Massachusetts, gave him a new name and a new career as a show horse. The former Rockingham claiming horse and Milliken won the bronze medal in the individual three-day eventing and were the only Americans to medal in the event.

SUSSEX STAKES NEXT FOR ALHAARTH

Alhaarth (Ire) (Unfuwain), rated last year's European champion juvenile but still without a victory in 1996, will wear blinkers for the second time when he lines up for the start of Wednesday's Sussex S. Hamdan Al Maktoum's colt was unbeaten in five two-year-old starts, but has yet to add to that score in four races this season. He was fitted with headgear on his latest run in the Irish Derby and, despite his ninth-place finish behind **Zagreb** (Theatrical {Ire}), connections plan to persist with the addition of blinkers. Opposition next week is certain to be strong, because **Charnwood Forest (Ire)** (Warning {GB}) and **First Island (Ire)** (Dominion), both winners last time out at Royal Ascot, have been confirmed as definite challengers in the G1 event at Goodwood. Other Sussex probable starters are **All-Royal (Ire)** (Royal Academy), **Mistle Cat** (Storm Cat) and **Sorbie Tower (Ire)** (Soviet Lad).

ELLIS PARK ALLOWANCE PURSES TO BE

RAISED Only two days after announcing a 10 percent purse increase, Ellis Park and the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association are at it again. Beginning with the July 30 card, allowance purses will be increased from between \$500 to \$1,800 per race. The track and horsemen got together to adjust the allowance race purse structure to further compliment the rest of the purses at Ellis Park. The newest increase amounts to an added three to nine percent on top of Wednesday's boost. "Now that we're seeing such a significant influx of quality horses running at Ellis, both management and the H.P.B.A. felt it was necessary to address a concern of horsemen regarding purses for non-Kentucky-bred allowance horses," commented Ellis Park and H.P.B.A. spokespersons.

TOBA SEASON AUCTION SET The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association has announced the roster of stallion seasons to be auctioned at its National Breeders Awards Dinner Sept. 6 at Gainsborough Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. No guarantee 1997 seasons to 12 selected stallions will be sold at the auction, which will feature both live and telephone bidding. The stallions are Broad Brush, Capote, Dehere, Grindstone, Holy Bull, Kris S., Meadowlake, Phone Trick, Red Ransom, Relaunch, Rubiano and Theatrical (Ire). "We are deeply appreciative of this overwhelming response from the owners and syndicates of these stallions," said TOBA Executive Director John Y. Hamilton. TOBA President Drew J. Couto added, "It is gratifying to know that so many industry leaders share TOBA's vision and hope for the future. TOBA must increase its effectiveness as an industry catalyst and work to improve the services it provides to horsemen. Unfortunately, that requires increased funding. However, with the help of such generous sponsors, our ability to accomplish these goals becomes much more a reality."

BRITISH BOOKMAKERS SEEK GOVERNMENT HELP Bookmakers in Britain are asking the government to make a 1.25 percent cut in betting taxes. The country's Chancellor of the Exchequer Kenneth Clarke reduced the tax to 6.75 percent in last November's Budget, with the new rate taking effect March 1, but, following a recent report which suggests the racing industry has been badly hit by gambling on the National Lottery, a further cut is now thought vital for the health of the sport in Britain. Reductions in the minimum values of races for 1997 have already been labeled a near certainty. So, with this latest report suggesting that 650 off-course betting outlets may be forced to close with the loss of around 3,000 jobs, bookmakers are eager to make racing's current plight clear to Clarke. Peter Wilson, speaking on behalf of the Bookmakers' Committee, said, "The whole essence of our argument is that in the new environment created by the National Lottery, we need to give punters a better deal."

THORO-GRAPH ANALYSIS, by Jerry Brown

The Saratoga session gets into full gear Saturday with a barn-burning edition of the Test. The fastest filly in the race is **Capote Belle** (Capote), who exploded with a Thoro-Graph figure of 3 3/4 in her second lifetime start. She ran well again in her next outing, capturing the Gil Prioress by six lengths, but the stress of those two big efforts caused her to back up some in her most recent try when she took a Belmont allowance event by a length and a quarter. Coming back now for the third time in five weeks, the once-defeated filly may not be ready to fire her best shot.

The value in the race is undefeated **Minery** (Forty Niner), who ships up from Kentucky. This one is fast and comes off a win in the Wilma C. Kennedy S. at Churchill July 7; she has a lifetime best of 4 3/4, with room for improvement. At what should be a square price, Minery is the Thoro-Graph play in the Test.

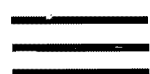

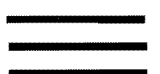
