OJC REACHES UNION SETTLEMENTS The Ontario Jockey Club announced Tuesday that it has reached a memorandum of settlement with each of its three union bargaining units, all with the Service Employees International Union, Local 204. Those three units are security guards, Fort Erie maintenance and Fort Erie housekeeping. The memorandum of agreement with the security guard unit was reached late Monday night and is subject to ratification by the approximately 100 union members of the unit, who are located at Woodbine, Mohawk, Fort Erie and Greenwood teletheatre. Likewise, the Fort Erie maintenance and housekeeping units also reached their memoranda late Monday night and will be arranging ratification meetings shortly. The settlements mean that preparations for the 1996 Breeders' Cup Championship, scheduled for Oct. 26 at Woodbine in Toronto, can now proceed as planned.

TINNERS WAY TO VINERY IN 1997 Mr. and Mrs. Ben P. Walden Jr.'s Vinery announced yesterday that triple Grade I winner **Tinners Way** (Secretariat) will enter stud at the Midway, Kentucky farm in 1997. Winner of the \$1 million Pacific Classic in both 1994 and 1995, Tinners Way will continue to race in 1996 for his owner/breeder Juddmonte Farms Inc. and is scheduled to make his next start in the 1996 Pacific Classic, to be run Aug. 10 at Del Mar. A multiple stakes-winner at three in England, Tinners Way also won the GI Californian S. in his 1996 debut. He is from the last crop by Secretariat out of Devon Diva (The Minstrel), and is a half-brother to Western Approach (Gone West), a stakes-winner of \$177,220. "We're honored that Juddmonte has considered us a worthy home for another of their sire prospects," said Ben Walden Jr. "Marquetry has been an extremely popular stallion for us and Tinners Way certainly fits the profile at Vinery, where our emphasis rests on legitimate racing class."

Fun Galore and Putra are also unbeaten and that pair, along with the dual winner Imperial President, probably represent the biggest hurdles for Sahm in an event won last year by European champion juvenile **Alhaarth (Ire)** (Unfuwain).

HASKELL INVITATIONAL H.-GI, \$750,000, 3yo, 1 1/8m

GII Swaps S. winner **Victory Speech** (Deputy Minister) galloped at Saratoga Tuesday morning for trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He is dead fit right now," Lukas said. "We just asked him to pick it up a little in the stretch to get some air into him." Victory Speech will van to Monmouth from Saratoga Friday. Another Lukas trainee pointing to the Haskell, Long Branch S. winner **Dr. Caton** (Seattle Slew), worked five furlongs in 1:00 yesterday at Monmouth with jockey Joe Bravo in the irons. "He keeps impressing me with the way he's trained for the race," said Lukas assistant Mike Maker. "I expect him to make a good account of himself in the Haskell." Ohio Derby winner **Skip Away** (Skip Trial), 124-pound starting highweight for the Haskell, drilled five furlongs from the gate Monday in a bullet :59 3/5. "He's ready to run; let's get on with the show," said trainer Sonny Hine. Long Branch S. fourth **Foolish Pole** (Polish Numbers) also worked Monday, breezing five furlongs in 1:00 4/5. "He worked perfect for me, just what I wanted," said trainer Buddy Raines. "I didn't want him to go too fast. I want him to have some juice left for the Haskell." **Devil's Honor** (Devil's Bag), second in the Long Branch, had his final Haskell workout Tuesday at Monmouth. The six-time stakes-winner went a half-mile in :46 2/5, galloping out five-eighths in :59 4/5. Also pointing to the Haskell are **Hesabull** (Dispersal) and **Slew O Mink** (Slewacide), winner of the GIII Round Table S. at Arlington July 6.

NEW YORK STATE RACING AND WAGERING BOARD CHAIRMAN RESIGNS

New York State Racing and Wagering Board Chairman Dr. Jerry Bilinski resigned Tuesday amid charges by the state Ethics Commission that he still owned stallion shares and that a trip he took to Florida was paid for by New York taxpayers. Bilinski, who accepted the position of chairman in May, 1995, was required to sever all ties with his breeding, racing and veterinary businesses in order to fulfill his new role. However, an ad for two of his former stallions later appeared in an industry publication; the phone number of his state office was listed in the ad, prompting the Ethics Commission investigation. Bilinski yesterday told Governor Pataki of his intentions to resign, and released a statement in which he said the Ethics Commission's requirements were "too onerous" and they "created a significant and unanticipated financial hardship."

ARLINGTON'S REQUEST FOR FIVE-DAY RACING WEEK IN LIMBO

Arlington International Racecourse's attempt to reintroduce the five-day racing week appears to be in limbo because of objections from Harness and Thoroughbred horsemen. An Illinois Racing Board teleconference scheduled for Tuesday to vote on the proposed change from a six-day racing week was cancelled in view of the controversy surrounding the request. The Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association objected to the loss of one day of inter-track revenue and to the loss of purse money. Even though Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association President Christine Janks agreed to support Arlington's request in return for purse and recapture clause concessions from the track, some of her constituents have expressed their desire to continue racing six days.

GRINDSTONE GIVES SOMETHING BACK TO DERBY MUSEUM

Kentucky Derby Museum President Carl Pollard has announced that W.T. Young is donating a stallion season for his 1996 Derby winner **Grindstone** (Unbridled) to the museum. The money raised from Grindstone's stud fee will help benefit the equine education program at the museum. A similar donation of a 1992 season to Kentucky Derby winner Unbridled was previously purchased by Young; Young used the season for his mare Buzz My Bell and the resulting foal was the second generation Derby winner Grindstone. "We are honored and excited by Mr. Young's gesture," said David Wagner, executive director for the museum. "Mr. Young has always been a strong supporter of the Museum and his generosity is always appreciated."

But Hever Golf Rose, last year's winner, soon overtook her and seemed guaranteed a repeat victory with a three-length advantage and a quarter of a mile to run. Rambling Bear's jockey, Ray Cochrane, had nowhere to go, as he was in behind a wall of horses. However, switching sharply left to find a gap, he took his mount to the stands' rail and Rambling Bear responded with a strong surge to lift this prize from under the highweight's nose. Winning trainer Michael Blanshard said, "Rambling Bear is highly strung and part of the plan was to give him time to find his feet. Ray has given him a great ride as I think the leaders may have gone a bit fast."

St Mawes booked a place in Britain's final Classic of 1996, the St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 14., with a late-charging victory here. The chestnut had frustrated connections for much of his three-year-old campaign, but wearing blinkers for the first time helped him concentrate. **DESERT BOY (IRE)** (Green Desert) led at a good pace in the early stages. Storm Trooper, never far back, grabbed a clear advantage with three furlongs left to run. St Mawes, though, was switched left to make his challenge and, responding bravely for jockey Kevin Darley, he swept to the lead 50 yards before the post. Chief Contender also produced a late flourish. Winning trainer John Dunlop said, "St Mawes got jarred up after a rough race in the Epsom Derby (he finished 17th of 20). But he stays well and I think the St Leger is the obvious target for him."

The Santa Anita Companies yesterday reported results for the second quarter and six months ended June 30, 1996. For the 1996 second quarter, the Companies achieved combined net income of \$1,396,000 or 12¢ per share on revenues of \$16,246,000, compared to combined net income of \$702,000 or 6¢ per share on revenues of \$17,970,000 a year ago. For the six months ended June 30, 1996, Santa Anita had combined net income of \$9,470,000 or 84¢ per share on revenues of \$57,032,000, compared to combined net income of \$7,482,000 or 67¢ per share on revenues of \$57,539,000 in 1995. Messrs. William C. Baker and Stephen F. Keller, chairmen of the boards of Santa Anita Realty Enterprises Inc. and Santa Anita Operating Company, respectively, said, "Santa Anita continued to make good progress during the second quarter on its program to dispose of non-related assets and reduce debt. This is reflected by a 52 percent reduction in the combined companies' total debt from a year ago. With a sharper operational focus and enhanced financial flexibility, we remain very excited about Santa Anita's long-term prospects."

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

CAPOTE BELLE (f, 3, Capote--Rythmical, by Fappiano)

When Capote Belle won the GII Prioress S. June 23, we touched briefly on her pedigree and mentioned we would return to look at her in more detail should the opportunity arise. Now her dominating victory in Saturday's GI Test S. has given us that opportunity.

Capote Belle is by a son of Seattle Slew out of a mare by a son of Mr. Prospector, and this pair have always been likely to work together. Seattle Slew and Mr. Prospector both trace in tail female line to the brilliant sprint mare Myrtlewood. In addition, Seattle Slew's granddam, Fair Charmer, is linebred to great tap-root mare Frizette, who is actually the granddam of Myrtlewood. The second strain appears via a mare called Black Wave (by Sir Gallahad III), who is actually a three-quarters genetic relative to Sequence (by Bull Dog, brother to Sir Gallahad III), the granddam of Mr. Prospector.

This may be getting a little complicated, so, just to recap briefly, Seattle Slew has two strains of Frizette, which come through Black Wave and Myrtlewood, and Mr. Prospector has Black Wave's close relative Sequence, a daughter of Myrtlewood.

Capote Belle's sire Capote brings in additional strains of Bull Dog and Frizette through his broodmare sire, Bald Eagle. Tiger, the broodmare sire of Bald Eagle, is by Bull Dog out of a great-granddaughter of Frizette. To complete the Frizette collection, Capote Belle's fifth dam is Vagrancy, who is by Sir Gallahad III out of a granddaughter of Frizette.

So, in all, Capote Belle has five strains of Frizette, four of them combined with Bull Dog or Sir Gallahad III, and three--Bald Eagle, Mr. Prospector's dam Gold Digger and Capote Belle's fourth dam Natasha--have Nasrullah added to the mix. We must not forget to mention that, as well as Frizette, this pedigree has a considerable build-up of the brothers Bull Dog and Sir Gallahad III, and that Capote Belle's broodmare sire Fappiano traces to Bull Dog and Sir Gallahad III's full-sister Marguerite de Valois.

Capote Belle's fairly close duplications of genetic relatives is probably the source of her tremendous speed, but the linebreeding to brothers and sisters behind those genetic relatives gives hope that she may be able to stretch that speed a little farther. With her linebreeding to Frizette and Plucky Liege, two of the most influential broodmares of this century, she should certainly have a future as a producer too.
