CIGAR, DRAMATIC GOLD WORK FOR

PACIFIC CLASSIC Before 300 or so umbrella-toting fans who lined the rail and applauded his every move, Cigar (Palace Music) turned in another solid workout at Saratoga Racecourse Wednesday as he continues preparations for the \$1,000,000 Pacific Classic at Del Mar Aug. 10. The reigning Horse of the Year went seven furlongs in 1:27.56 with regular jockey Jerry Bailey in the irons. "He went very well; he was very willing," said Bailey. "I think he might have been a little pumped up because of the crowd and worked a little better because of it." Trainer Bill Mott added, "I've never had a horse applauded before, during and after a work. It was starting to rain just at that point, or I would have liked to give the people a little more time to see him." Clockers caught Cigar in fractions of :24.24, :36.72, :48.48 and 1:13.94. One more work is on the schedule for the six-year-old before he ships to California Aug. 8. He will try to set a modern-day record of 17 straight victories in the Pacific Classic. **Dramatic Gold** (Slew o' Gold), second to Cigar in the Arlington Citation Challenge July 13, also worked Wednesday, drilling seven furlongs at Del Mar in 1:24 3/5. Trainer David Hofmans said the decision on whether Dramatic Gold will run in the Pacific Classic now rests with the gelding's owners, Golden Eagle Farm's John and Betty Mabee.

BUCKAROO DEAD Buckaroo (Buckpasser) died Tuesday of liver failure. The 21-year-old stallion sired 1985 Kentucky Derby winner Spend a Buck, MGISW and millionaire Roo Art and two-time GI Carter H. winner Lite the Fuse. Buckaroo stood at Bridlewood Farm in Ocala, Florida. During his racing career, he won the 1978 editions of the GIII Peter Pan and GII Saranac S., while finishing off the board just once in ten starts at three. His most famous progeny was Spend a Buck, who won the Derby en route to Horse of the Year and Champion Three-Year-Old Colt honors in 1985; Spend a Buck earned over \$4 million in his two-year career. Overall, Buckaroo sired 25 stakes-winners and the earners of over \$20 million.

MISTLE CAT (Storm Cat), a habitual front-runner, shot from the stalls and set a fast pace. Hot favorite Charnwood Forest and second choice First Island raced at the back of the pack until well into the home stretch. Both started to make a move at the two-furlong pole, with Charnwood Forest leading the charge and taking the lead with 300 yards to go. But First Island eased past to collect the prize. John Ferguson, racing manager to successful owners Mollers Racing, admitted he had his doubts about First Island's chances before the race. "I'm delighted but in a complete state of shock," he said. "I thought he would be better suited to ten furlongs than a mile. But (trainer) Geoff Wragg obviously knows much more than I do about that and it was entirely his decision to aim at Goodwood. I suppose the Juddmonte International at York (August 20) would be a possibility now, if he comes out of this race well."

EXBOURNE EUTHANIZED Exbourne (Exploident), winner of the 1991 GI Hollywood Turf H. and GI Caesars International H., was euthanized July 13 at owner Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms in Lexington, Kentucky, according to a story in today's *Daily Racing Form*. The 10-year-old stallion had a history of hoof problems that included laminitis and resulting infections that had gotten bad enough that "the only humane thing was to put him down," Farm Manager Garrett O'Rourke told the *Form* Tuesday. O'Rourke added, "The infection had gone from his foundered foot into his pastern, and a generalized infection in his bloodstream was the result." Exbourne won eight of 14 starts for earnings of \$999,989. He placed second in the 1989 G1 British 1000 Guineas. His first foals are yearlings of 1996.

SIGNAL TAP RETIRED Signal Tap (Fappiano) has been retired from racing and although plans have not yet been finalized, he is expected to enter stud in 1997. Signal Tap raced for a Centennial Farms partnership. Bred by William S. Farish, E.J. Hudson and W.S. Kilroy, he was purchased from the Lane's End consignment at the 1992 Keeneland July Yearling Sale for \$390,000. His dam South Sea Dancer (Northern Dancer) was a \$1.8 million yearling at the 1982 Keeneland July sale. She is a full-sister to champion and top sire Storm Bird. Signal Tap won seven of 25 starts for earnings of \$429,108. His victories included this year's GIII Hialeah Turf Cup H. and GIII Bougainvillea H., both over the Hialeah turf. He was also third in the 1995 GI Man o' War S. at Belmont. The five-year-old retires due to a slight suspensory injury.

AKSARBEN CLOSED TO RACING The board of Douglas County, which has owned AKsarben since 1992, voted 5-1 in favor of a plan that would eliminate the Omaha, Nebraska racetrack and transform the site into an office complex for First Data Resources, one of the world's largest credit card manufacturers. The July 16 vote precludes any future use of the AKsarben facility for racing; however, the plan submitted by FDR contained a provision for \$2.5 million toward construction costs for a new racetrack in the Omaha area. FDR's offer is contingent upon the passage of a November referendum for casino-style gaming at racetracks, which had been supported by racing interests and was considered vital to the longevity of Nebraska's horse racing industry.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters and an (S) will be used for state-bred races.

SUFFOLK DOWNS FALL DATES APPROVED The Massachusetts State Racing Commission approved the Suffolk Downs fall racing schedule Wednesday, confirming key provisions of the new circuit agreement between Suffolk Downs and Rockingham Park. By a 2-0 vote, the Commission permitted Suffolk Downs' request to open Sept. 23 and run five days a week until Dec. 7, a total of 54 programs. "It's important for us to be racing in September and to utilize our turf course during the fall if we want to attract some of the better outfits from New Jersey and Delaware," said Suffolk Downs Chairman James B. Moseley.

He faces just three opponents, but they include **Blade Ae**, who won over six furlongs at Chantilly at the end of June.

Livermore), who returned from an eight-month layoff to take a seven-furlong Belmont allowance June 22, will definitely start in the Whitney. The four-year-old breezed five furlongs at Saratoga Wednesday in 1:01.43. **Jed Forest** (Gold Alert), fourth to **Wekiva Springs** in the GI Suburban H. July 4, worked five furlongs over Saratoga's main track Tuesday in 1:01.01. **L'Carriere** (Carr de Naskra), second to **Unaccounted For** in last year's Whitney, also went five-eighths over Saratoga's main track Tuesday, covering the distance in 1:00.23. Also considered possible for the Grade I event is superstar filly **Serena's Song** (Rahy), who drilled five-eighths in a bullet 1:01.42 breezing over Saratoga's Oklahoma Training Track Tuesday.

A pair of D. Wayne Lukas-trainees, **Prince of Thieves** (Hansel) and **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner), prepped at Saratoga for the Jim Dandy. Belmont S. winner **Editor's Note** drilled a half-mile on the Oklahoma training track Wednesday in a bullet :47.82, while **GII Swaps S.** runner-up **Prince of Thieves** covered the same distance in a bullet :48.06 Tuesday, also on the training track. Preakness winner **Louis Quatorze** (Sovereign Dancer) drilled five furlongs Monday in 1:00.07 over Saratoga's main track. Pat Day was aboard for the work. "I'm excited about the race," said Nick Zito, trainer of **Louis Quatorze**. "I have one of the best three-year-olds in the country." **Will's Way** (Easy Goer), winner of three of four career starts with his lone loss coming in the **GII Flamingo S.**, in which he finished third, breezed five-eighths in 1:02.07 Tuesday. Also pointing to the race are a pair of Panamanian imports trained by Alfredo Callejas--**Secreto de Estado** (General Assembly) and **Prince Haven**.

Putra earned himself odds of 14-1 for next year's British 2000 Guineas with a thrilling finish here. SAHM (Mr. Prospector), having started a clear favorite to collect his third success in a row, was disqualified from the runner-up spot after causing interference during the last quarter mile. BELGRAVIA (GB) (Rainbow Quest) led early at a decent pace with Grapeshot and Equal Rights stalking him. Grapeshot took over a quarter of a mile from home and, with Putra and Sahm trapped in behind horses, a shock looked possible. But Putra's jockey eased the eventual winner clear of trouble. Richard Hills, attempting a similar move aboard Sahm, bumped AIR EXPRESS (IRE) (Salse). Winning handler Paul Cole will wait before making any definite plans for Putra's next start, but stated, "He has always been an athletic horse and more or less trains himself. It looked a good race and, although he did hang to his left, I thought he won on merit."

Local News, England:

Royal Applause (GB) (Waajib), second ranked European juvenile last season, looks set for a return to Group One events following his victory in yesterday's six-furlong Vaux Samson Conditions S. at Doncaster. Unsuccessful in two previous starts this year, the colt made virtually all the running to collect the first prize of \$8,348 by a neck over **Russian Revival** (Nureyev). Winning rider Kieren Fallon stated, "I haven't asked the horse a serious question. He was never going to get caught and was free-wheeling at the finish." Possible targets for Royal Applause include Deauville's Prix Maurice de Gheest August 11 and the Haydock Park Sprint Cup September 7. Both are Group One contests.

Twist Afleet, sixth as the 3-5 favorite in the GI Shuvee H. in her last start May 25, had won eight straight races before that with one loss in the middle of the streak--a third-place finish in last year's Honorable Miss at Saratoga. The chestnut made amends in this year's edition, dueling for the early lead inside MYBRIDE BARBARA (Medieval Man), shaking clear on the turn and being ridden out by jockey Mike Smith to win as the 2-5 bettors' choice. Twist Afleet's record on off tracks improves to 6-5-0-1. "It's nice to see her run back to her old form," said winning trainer John Kimmel. "We will try the Ballerina next." The GI Ballerina H. will be contested over seven furlongs at Saratoga Aug. 18.
