“RACING TO THE BREEDERS’ CUP” KICKS OFF THIS WEEKEND

The 1996 “Racing to the Breeders’ Cup” series launches its fifth season on ESPN this weekend with the \$350,000 Whitney H. (GI) from Saratoga Saturday (4:30-5:30 p.m. EDT) and the \$750,000 Buick Haskell Invitational (GI) from Monmouth Sunday (4:30-5:30 p.m. EDT). Sunday’s Haskell telecast will also include the \$125,000 Jim Dandy S. from Saratoga. “Racing to the Breeders’ Cup” is hosted by Dave Johnson and Charlsie Cantey, with analysis provided by Bob Neumeier and Tom Durkin. This year’s series features seven Grade I races, including the Aug. 10 Pacific Classic from Del Mar, Aug. 24 Beverly D from Arlington, Aug. 25 Arlington Million, Sept. 14 Woodward S. at Belmont and, for the first time, the Sept. 15 Woodbine Million from Woodbine Racetrack--site of this year’s Breeders’ Cup Championship. The broadcast schedule concludes with two added attractions: a 90-minute Breeders’ Cup special preview of the Breeders’ Cup Championship races Oct. 20 and the Breeders’ Cup Post-Position Draw telecast Oct. 23.

REMINGTON SETS FALL STAKES SCHEDULE

The 54-day Fall Thoroughbred Meeting at Remington Park is set to begin Friday, Sept. 13. The action will begin each day at 1:15 p.m. After two three-day weekends of activity to get things underway, Remington will move to its normal Wednesday through Sunday schedule until the conclusion of the season Dec. 1. Remington will offer a daily average of \$100,000 in purse money to begin the meet. The stakes schedule is highlighted by the \$300,000-estimated Mathis Brothers Remington Futurity for two-year-olds Oct. 19. Other featured events include the \$150,000 Remington Green on the turf Oct. 5 and the \$100,000 Red Earth Derby Oct. 12. The state’s Thoroughbred spotlight afternoon will be held Sunday, Nov. 3 with the fourth Oklahoma Classics Day, a series of seven races for Oklahoma-breds worth a total of \$375,000.

Grey Shot made all the running for the win, but he had to fight a thrilling final-furlong battle with Lear White before he finally secured the prize. Jeff Smith, owner of both first and third, said, "This is a wonderful result for me and, considering Persian Punch is only a three-year-old and therefore has more of his career ahead of him, I think they've finished in the order I would have liked. Grey Shot really deserved this, too, as he hurt his back when finishing second to Double Trigger in the Sagaro S. at Ascot back in May. After he ran so badly in Germany last time, we took him home to have him treated and to freshen him up. He is better on softer ground, so he should do well between now and the end of the season."

Easycall upped his career record to a perfect three-for-three with an impressive score here. Trainer Brian Meehan had been confident beforehand that his colt would put in a bold display, but Raphane was the starting favorite following his Group Three victory in Ireland last month. CLOSE RELATIVE (IRE) (Distant Relative) set the early pace, with Easycall tucked in just behind and Raphane, with blinkers on, pulling hard. With two furlongs left, however, Easycall cruised alongside the pacesetter going easily. Brett Doyle pushed his mount into a clear lead 50 yards later and, needing only slight encouragement, the winner strode well clear to collect at odds of 7-2. Meehan said, "Easycall has done very well on his previous starts and I think he's pretty good. He's a bit lazy at home. But, from the first time he ran, I knew he was useful."

Zamindar, the full-brother to 1993 English 2000 Guineas winner Zafonic, made all the running to beat Dyhim Diamond easily. This was Zamindar's second racecourse appearance, having won his debut at Maisons-Laffitte July 1. Like Zafonic, Zamindar is trained by Andre Fabre and he so impressed the English bookmakers Ladbrokes that they immediately cut his odds for next year's English 2000 Guineas from 10-1 down to 8-1 favorite. Local News, England:

Bosra Sham (Woodman), unbeaten winner of this year's Newmarket 1000 Guineas, seems set to miss the G1 Juddmonte International at York in less than three weeks' time. The Henry Cecil-trainee is proving rather slow to recover from persistent foot problems and, although connections are not making fixed plans at the moment, Ascot's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. September 28 appears more likely to mark her next outing. Cecil said yesterday, "I hope she will come back later in the year. But she will not run until I'm happy she is ready and fit enough to do herself justice. She is in the Queen Elizabeth and the Champion S. at Newmarket. But it is just a question of getting her feet to grow."

Epsom Derby winner **Shaamit (Ire)** (Mtoto {GB}), third in Saturday's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., looks set to have only one more run this year. But the Classic hero, reportedly "fine" following his exertions at Ascot over the weekend, seems almost certain to stay in training as a four-year-old in 1997. Newmarket-based handler William Haggas intends to wait a month before confirming any future engagements for Shaamit. However he is hinting that the Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown September 18 could be the colt's final outing this year, before he is aimed for the top European events over 10 furlongs and upwards next season. Haggas reasoned, "Shaamit's sire got better with age and I'm sure it will be the same with our horse. I'd like to see him have one more run this year and then come back for the Eclipse and the King George as a four-year-old." **Classic Cliche (Ire)** (Salse), meanwhile, is to be aimed at the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Connections of the Godolphin colt, a neck ahead of Shaamit when runner-up to **Pentire (GB)** (Be My Guest) in Saturday's test, will probably have his Arc prep in September's Prix Foy over the big-race course and distance at Longchamp.

Ocean Ridge (Storm Bird), easy 2½-length winner of the Prix Robert Papin at Maisons-Laffitte last Sunday, looks set for a rematch with **Dazzle (GB)** (Gone West) in the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville August 18. Dazzle, the early favorite for next year's 1000 Guineas, beat Ocean Ridge by five lengths when taking Newmarket's G3 Cherry Hinton S. July 9.
