SARATOGA SELECT YEARLING SALE BEGINS

TONIGHT Fasig-Tipton's 76th annual Saratoga Select Yearling Sale kicks off tonight at 8 p.m. in the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in Saratoga Springs, New York. The sale's three sessions will be held tonight, Wednesday and Thursday; all sessions begin at 8 p.m. A total of 233 select yearlings have been catalogued for the auction, including a half-brother by Dixieland Band to Champion Sprinter Smile; a half-sister by Belong to Me to millionairess Fit for a Queen; the first foal out of MGI winner Turnback the Alarm--a filly by A.P. Indy; a half-sister by Manila to Saturday's G2 Prix d'Astarte winner Shaanxi; and a half-brother by Kingmambo to MGI winner and \$1.3 million earner Alphabatim. Perennial leading sires with yearlings in the sale include Mr. Prospector, Danzig, Seattle Slew, Pleasant Colony, Private Account, Halo, Storm Bird, Storm Cat, Woodman, Miswaki and Gone West. "The physical quality of the horses we have here is of a uniformly high standard, and that is what the market in Kentucky rewarded," said Terence R.P. Collier, director of marketing for Fasig-Tipton. "Our initial projection would be that we would like to see solid growth on the average, a manageable percentage of horses not sold and a good interplay between the domestic money that made this sale a great success last year and the new foreign money that promises to be here. The interesting question about this Saratoga sale is, 'What is going to top the sale?' We have some very attractive fillies. I think what we're speculating is that the market between \$100,000 and \$200,000 is going to be solid. I think it's more of a feeling of comfort that the middle of the market is pretty solid this year."

GOLDEN ATTRACTION RETURNS Last year's Champion Two-Year-Old Filly **Golden Attraction** (Mr. Prospector), sidelined with a stress fracture of her hind cannon bone since finishing third in the Oct. 28 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, has been entered in Thursday's seventh race at Saratoga, a six-furlong allowance for fillies and mares, ages three and up. Trained by D. Wayne Lukas, Golden Attraction won six of eight starts in 1995 for earnings of \$675,587. Her victories included the GI Frizette S. and GI Matron S. at Belmont, the GI Spinaway S. and GI Schuylerville S. at Saratoga and the Debutante S. at Churchill Downs.

Saturday, Del Mar:

PACIFIC CLASSIC-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/4m

Travel plans have been altered slightly for 1995 Horse of the Year **Cigar** (Palace Music), bringing him to Southern California earlier Thursday than originally planned. Flight plans now call for the six-year-old, who will be trying to set a modern-day record of 17 consecutive victories in the Pacific Classic, to arrive at Ontario, Ca. airport at approximately 9 a.m. Thursday. He'll then be vanned to Del Mar, with arrival at the track expected to be at about noon.

Trainer Richard Mandella confirmed Monday morning that **Dare and Go** (Alydar) will start in the Pacific Classic. Earlier, Mandella had said the five-year-old had only a "small chance" to make the field. Following Dare and Go's five-furlong workout in :59 4/5 over Del Mar's main track Monday, Mandella said, "He went really good. He's had two races in him now and he looks fantastic." After a 3½-month layoff, Dare and Go finished fifth in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup June 30 and second by a head in the GII Bel Air H. at Hollywood Park July 14. Dare and Go's presence in the field gives Mandella three chances to win this year's Pacific Classic. Mandella will also send postward Dubai World Cup runner-up **Soul of the Matter** (Private Terms) and Hollywood Gold Cup hero **Siphon (Brz)** (Itajara {Brz}).

Tinners Way (Secretariat), who will be trying to win the Pacific Classic for the third straight year, breezed six furlongs in 1:14 4/5 over Del Mar's main track yesterday with regular rider Eddie Delahoussaye aboard.

GULFSTREAM ANNOUNCES RECORD STAKES

PURSES FOR 1997 Gulfstream Park officials yesterday announced a Florida record stakes distribution of \$5,075,000 for its 1997 meeting, which will be held January 3 through March 16. "Our record stakes distribution enables us to increase the minimum stakes purse to a new high of \$75,000 while continuing to maintain the value of our richer events," said Gulfstream President and CEO Douglas Donn. "The additional stakes funding is disbursed virtually throughout our 63-day meeting." The previous record stakes distribution was \$4,750,000, established last season. The stakes minimum purse was \$50,000. Robert D. Umphrey, Gulfstream director of racing, has carded 39 stakes, 29 carrying graded status. The 46th running of the \$500,000 GI Florida Derby March 15 will headline the Gulfstream agenda, and will again be telecast live on ABC's "Wide World of Sports." Stars of the handicap division will be showcased in the \$300,000 GI Donn H. Feb. 8 and the \$500,000 GI Gulfstream Park H. March 1.

JIM DANDY WRAP-UP Having had four veterinarians go over 1995 Champion Two-Year-Old Colt **Maria's Mon** (Wavering Monarch) with a fine-toothed comb, trainer Rick Schosberg said Monday morning he could find no physical reason for the gray's disappointing sixth-place finish in Sunday's GI Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga. "He scoped clean; he cooled out fine--we're disappointed and a little baffled," said Schosberg. "The only thing I can think of is that he wasn't really tired after the race, which may mean he wasn't as mentally prepared as I thought. Maybe he had us fooled and we jumped the gun with him." Schosberg added that the Aug. 24 Travers S. is "pretty much out of the picture" for **Maria's Mon**. "We'll evaluate him further and come up with an alternate plan," the trainer said. "Off an effort like that, going in a race like the Travers would be detrimental to him." **Will's Way** (Easy Goer), second to **Louis Quatorze** (Sovereign Dancer) in the Jim Dandy, came out of the race "very good" and will start next in the Travers, according to trainer H. James Bond. "My goal is to try and move him up a length while picking up 10 pounds," said Bond. "I thought for his fifth lifetime start he ran very, very well." Trainer D. Wayne Lukas said **Prince of Thieves** (Hansel) (5th) and **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner) (4th) both came out of the Jim Dandy in good shape, and added that he will probably send **Editor's Note** and Haskell runner-up **Dr. Caton** (Seattle Slew) into the Travers. "Don't hold me to that," Lukas said. "I might send three."

GUINEAS SPONSOR NEEDED Newmarket is in need of a sponsor for the 1997 editions of the 1000 and 2000 Guineas after Pertemps informed the racecourse that it will not continue its sponsorship of the two races, *The Sporting Life* reported Monday. When Madagans decided to cancel its sponsorship of this year's Guineas, Pertemps stepped in as a last-minute replacement at a price believed to be considerably less than the \$389,105 paid by Madagans in 1995. Nick Lees, Newmarket's clerk of the course, told *The Sporting Life*, "We have had a meeting with Pertemps and the company has said it is not able to come up with the asking price. Tim Watts, Pertemps' chairman, was very open about the situation and has said that, if we cannot find anyone else, Pertemps is prepared to sponsor the Guineas meeting for a lesser sum. It is reassuring to know that we have a fall-back position."

CALDER ANNOUNCES PURSE INCREASE Due to an increase in overall handle figures this season, Calder is enhancing purses for two-year-olds running for claiming prices under \$25,000 and horses in the three-year-olds and up (non-maiden) category by five percent, effective this Thursday, August 8. Two and three-year-olds participating in maiden special weight contests already received a boost over last year's purses at the beginning of the meet, as did two-year-olds running for tags of \$25,000 or more, through added Florida Owners' Awards and Canadian Fund monies. Calder began the 1996 meet with the highest purse structure in its 26-year history, highlighted by the attractive schedule for Florida-bred two-year-olds. It was announced at the beginning of the meet that all subsequent purse increases would be allocated to the aforementioned categories so as to enhance the overall program.
