### STORM CAT FILLY TOPS STRONG SECOND SESSION AT SARATOGA

A daughter of Storm Cat out of the Grade I stakes winner Buy the Firm (Affirmed) commanded a bid of \$430,000 as the highest priced yearling during the second day of Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Select Yearling Sale, held yesterday. Consigned by Walnut Green (Jones Bros.), agent, the filly was purchased by Courtlandt Farm. "I bought her primarily because of her pedigree. We'll race her and then we'll ultimately use her as a broodmare," said Courtlandt Farm owner Donald Adam. "The pedigree was outstanding and she was one of the real, nice, correct Storm Cat fillies in the sale--everything you would expect for \$430,000." Buzz Chace, agent, was the underbidder on the filly. The top-priced colt Wednesday, a son of Unbridled out of Code Alert (Fight Over), herself a half-sister to MGISW Lost Code, was purchased by Walnut Green Bloodstock for \$330,000. Named **Unbridled Elegance**, the bay was consigned by Dixiana Farm, Inc. (Bruce Kline), agent. Walnut Green's Russell Jones, who was acting as agent for Morven Stud, said of the colt's future, "I take all the yearlings to the same training center in Virginia and we try to figure out where they fit once we've broken them." A yearling by Alleged out of MSW Black Tulip (Fr) (Fabulous Dancer), third highest-priced filly on the day at \$320,000, will head across the Atlantic for her racing career. Consigned by Fares Farms Inc., she was purchased by Paul Webber, agent for Faisal Salman's Belgrave Bloodstock, who said, "She'll go to England to be trained by Sir Mark Prescott, who trains Last Second (Ire), winner of the G2 Nassau S. for Faisal Salman last weekend. I hope this one is half as good. I loved her looks; I thought she was a very racy filly with a few faults which hopefully we can forgive with Alleged, and she'll make a good broodmare." While there were 19 percent buy-backs as compared to 12 percent a year ago, a total of 57 yearlings sold for \$9,123,000 Wednesday, up 13 percent from 1995 when 61 hips brought \$8,079,000. The 1996 average of \$154,627 was up 17 percent from last year's second-session figure of \$132,443. "It had a lot of sizzle," said D. G. Van Clief, Jr., Chairman of Fasig-Tipton Co. Inc. of the second day of the sale. Added Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson, "It was good straight through, at every level of the market. I think the buying public might have been more aggressive tonight than last night." The sale's third and final session begins tonight at 8 p.m.

**SOUL OF THE MATTER INJURED** Soul of the Matter (Private Terms), winner of four graded stakes and over \$2 million, was injured Wednesday morning at Del Mar while preparing for Saturday's Pacific Classic. The five-year-old horse, unraced since finishing second to Cigar in the March 27 Dubai World Cup, worked a half-mile in :48 1/5, according to trainer Richard Mandella. "He worked fine," Mandella said during a teleconference yesterday, "but, when he pulled up he was noticeably limping and within seconds he became lame and had to be brought back to the barn in an ambulance." X-rays revealed no fracture but it appeared the colt had suffered a strain of the inside sesamoid ligaments of his right front leg. Mandella said the injury is career-threatening. Soul of the Matter, who has raced just twice this year, was forced to miss his last scheduled start, the June 30 Hollywood Gold Cup, after coming down with a sore right fore foot. "He was a great horse," Mandella said. "He always had brittle feet. Any time he didn't run as good as you thought he should, you always found a reason afterwards--a (quarter) crack or a bruise or something. With most horses, you spend half your time wondering what you did wrong when you really didn't do anything wrong; they just weren't good enough. He was good enough. He just happened to be born with some poor feet."

**TRINITY MEADOWS CLOSES** Trinity Meadows Racetrack, the first North Texas horse racing track to offer legal parimutuel wagering since it was outlawed in the 1930s, shut down Tuesday. State officials attributed the shutdown to financial problems and an ongoing court battle between Texas-based and Ohio-based co-owners for control of the track, located west of Fort Worth. However, track officials blamed competition from the new Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie, about 40 miles to the east. Since Lone Star Park opened, Trinity Meadows has seen its on-track and simulcasting handle decrease more than 40 percent. The track opened for pari-mutuel betting in 1991 with a basic facility, a meager budget and no competition in a lucrative sports marketplace. For a while, the Class 2 track did well. David Freeman, executive secretary of the Texas Racing Commission, said the commission approved the track's request Tuesday to cancel the last 20 dates of its racing schedule and halt its year-round simulcast wagering.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

**Saturday, Del Mar:**

**PACIFIC CLASSIC-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/4m**

The field of six, in post position order, is as follows: **Tinners Way** (Secretariat), Delahoussaye; **Dare and Go** (Alydar), Solis; **Siphon (Brz)** (Itajara {Brz}), Flores; **Cigar** (Palace Music), Bailey; **Luthier Fever** (Mt. Livermore), Blanc; **Dramatic Gold** (Slew o' Gold), Nakatani. All carry 124 pounds.

Cigar had his final tuneup for Saturday's race when he worked five furlongs in 1:00.98 at Saratoga Wednesday morning in front of an estimated 7,500 fans. New York Racing Association clockers caught the six-year-old in fractions of :23.37 and :35.39. After the work, trainer Bill Mott pronounced the champ set to vie for what would be his record-breaking 17th straight win. "He's fit and ready to race," Mott said. "It's a respectable, full-dimensional field. There's the Hollywood Gold Cup winner (Siphon) and Tinners Way, who's won the race twice and obviously loves the track. There's speed, closers, stalkers, and then you've got Cigar. It should be a very good race."

Jockey Jerry Bailey, who has ridden Cigar to his last 15 victories, isn't admitting to any added pressure in seeking to surpass Citation's modern-day record of 16 consecutive wins. "Pressure is just part of the package in riding a horse like Cigar," Bailey said during a Wednesday teleconference. "But I can tell you this much--there's not another horse in the world I'd want to be riding in this race. And I really don't feel any more pressure than usual." Bailey added, "With most good horses, you always find some kind of chink in the armor. But Cigar has no chinks and he's overcome everything that's been thrown at him."

Five horses now stand in Cigar's path to a record 17th straight win. When asked how it would feel to play the spoiler Saturday, trainer Richard Mandella, who will saddle Siphon and Dare and Go, said, "Terrible--for about a second." David Hofmans, trainer of Dramatic Gold, who finished second to Cigar in the Arlington Citation Challenge, added, "It's like trying to beat the heavyweight champion. You're always trying to do your best and beat the champion. That's what we're here for."

**Best Pal** (\*Habitony), winner of the Pacific Classic in 1991, will lead the post parade for Saturday's renewal. Jockey Chris McCarron, who rode the eight-year-old gelding in his final 13 races, will be aboard in the silks of John and Betty Mabee's Golden Eagle Farm, where Best Pal now resides in retirement.

Last year's Champion Sprinter **Not Surprising** (Medieval Man) looks to get back on track in the A Phenomenon, a race he won in 1995. The six-year-old has won only three times in eight starts this year, including a one-length score in the Gil True North H. at Belmont in June, and was most recently fourth in the Gil Joseph De Francis Memorial Dash at Laurel July 20. "He ran so good here last year that we've been dying to get him back," said trainer Judson Van Worp. "Last year's A Phenomenon win let us know that we had a legitimate horse. He's a high-strung horse that likes it up here. It's quiet and he has a nice view through his stall window. We're hoping we can get him back on track in here and start a bit of a roll."

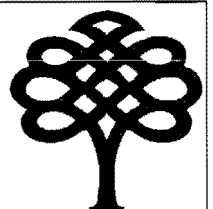

Owner/trainer Eddie Broome announced the retirement of his GSW **Gail's Brush** (Broad Brush) after the mare sustained a fractured sesamoid last week. Gail's Brush was scheduled to work on the turf last Monday, but never made it to the track. "There was never any indication of her being off," Broome said. "The first time we noticed something was wrong was when we took her out of the stall to get her ready for the work." Since Broome claimed her this past February at Gulfstream, the five-year-old mare had made six starts, winning five and placing once. The mare won three stakes at the current Monmouth Park meeting--the Gill Eatontown S., the Politely S. and the Rumson S.--and scored in the Columbiana S. at Hialeah in May. Gail's Brush will be sold in November in Kentucky as a broodmare prospect. She retires with 11 wins in 39 starts for earnings of \$250,702.

**Pentire** (GB) (Be My Guest), hero of Ascot's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. July 27, will start next in the G3 Prix Foy at Longchamp Sept. 15. The four-year-old colt's connections are still considering aiming him for Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe before tackling the Breeders' Cup Turf and then the Japan Cup. Trainer Geoff Wragg said, "There is certain to be cut in the ground for the Prix Foy, which should give us a chance to see how he handles it. If he fails miserably then, we will almost certainly give the Arc a miss. But, at present, it is still a possible target for him."

Britain's dual champion jockey Frankie Dettori, out of action since breaking his left elbow at Newbury in June, returns to the saddle at Newmarket Friday evening. The Italian-born rider, injured when thrown from his mount before the start of the listed Ballymacoll Stud S. June 13, was given the all-clear to make a comeback following a visit to his specialist Wednesday. Dettori had been expected to be sidelined for at least another week, but his agent, Mattie Cowing, said, "He's raring to go. It has mended much quicker than he had hoped. But he's going to start back only with selected rides." Dettori returns with two mounts Friday, but is expected to have three more at Newmarket Saturday, including the John Gosden-trained juvenile **Literary** (GB) (Woodman) in the listed Enza New Zealand Sweet Solera S.

Last year's G1 Derby Italiano winner **Luso** (GB) (Salse), sixth in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 27, is now being prepared to bid for Group One compensation in the Aral-Pokal at Gelsenkirchen-Horst August 18. The Clive Brittain-trained four-year-old has already won at the Group Two level in 1996. Brittain said, "We weighed him when he got home after the King George and he'd lost only one kilo. Maybe they went so fast that he didn't sweat! But he's now on course for the German race and, all being well, that's where he goes next."
