SARATOGA SELECT SALE AGAIN POSTS MAJOR GAINS

Following a strong sale in 1995, Fasig-Tipton's 1996 Saratoga Select Yearling Sale showed significant increases in gross, average and median once again as it concluded with Thursday night's session. In all, a total of 169 yearlings were sold over the three nights of this year's auction, grossing \$27,311,000, up 21 percent from 1995 when 176 horses brought in \$22,545,000. The final session saw 53 hips gross \$9,079,000, up 40 percent from last year's closer when 51 yearlings sold for a total of \$6,238,000; the '96 average on the last day was \$171,302, up 46 percent from last year's figure of \$122,314. The average over the entire sale was \$161,604, up 26 percent from the '95 average of \$128,097. The 1996 median was \$130,000, 30 percent higher than last year's median of \$100,000. "I think what we have seen this week is a demonstration that there is some urgency in the marketplace, especially at the top," said Fasig-Tipton Chairman D. G. Van Clief, Jr. "We have had one heck of a horse sale here this week. The emphases will all be in the same places next year. The game plan for the last few years has been on quality in the selection process--on occasion giving up on pedigree to improve on the physical. The emphasis will be on a grand physical horse with as much pedigree as we can get." Buzz Chace, agent for Paraneck Stable, was the top bidder on one of two colts who topped the final session at \$500,000. The bay, a son of Danzig out of GSW Nervous Baba (Raja Baba), was consigned by Derry Meeting Farm, agent for Wild Oak Plantation. "He will be pinhooked, most likely at Barretts next year," said Chace. "I thought he'd go for more money--I really thought he'd be at around \$700,000 in this market." The co-high priced colt, a son of Kingmambo out of SW Long View (Damascus), was consigned by Lane's End, agent, and bought by Fox Hill Farm. There were 27 percent buy-backs Thursday, as compared to 20 percent on the final day of 1995.

THOROUGHBRED OWNERS FORM "MAJOR LEAGUE"

A group of prominent Thoroughbred owners announced yesterday at Del Mar that they are establishing the National Thoroughbred Association, an association which will be modeled on the governing bodies of Major League sports such as baseball, basketball and football. Hamilton Jordan, former Chief of Staff for President Jimmy Carter and an unpaid advisor to the group, explained, "The essence of the NTA is to provide racing a structure that it currently lacks. A research committee has shown that all other sports have four common characteristics--one, a central governing body; two, they organize the pool television rights, giving those rights greater value; three, they integrate the rights to the sports, and the sports are better marketed and can grow; and four, the athletes and talent have a major say in the governing of the sport." The new league's first order of business will be to convince tracks to sell their simulcast signals for a price of seven-to-nine percent of the handle, rather than the current market price of three percent, changing the selling of simulcast signals from a buyers' market to a sellers' market. The NTA will work with the racetracks to package the highest quality of racing on the weekends when the public is best able to attend, and then will sell the off-track television and simulcast signals for a premium. John R. Gaines, creator of the Breeders' Cup, was joined by many of racing's leading owners, including Allen Paulson and Ed Friendly, who was instrumental in establishing the Thoroughbred Owners of California and said that the TOC's Board of Directors has voted unanimously to endorse the NTA. Said Gaines, "A major league structure has worked successfully for all other sports and it is now time for us to embrace such a plan to take Thoroughbred racing into the next century." The NTA hopes to gather the extra funds from the simulcast price increase at a national level and pass them back down to the tracks in the form of higher purses and payments to the facilities. The plan would require the cooperation of the tracks to be effective; when asked if there is any guarantee of the tracks' cooperation, Fred Pope, a Lexington advertising executive and founder of the NTA, said, "I think the only guarantee is that this is a solid business plan. This is something that has to make sense to everybody. The tracks that we have talked to have said it makes sense to them." Hollywood Park and Del Mar have shown interest in the plan. Joe Harper, president of Del Mar, said, "We are very pleased to find that the leading Thoroughbred owners want to take such an active role in the destiny of the sport. It is my hope that racetracks nationwide will join the race-horse owners in pursuing this exciting initiative."

KEENELAND ANNOUNCES SEPTEMBER

YEARLING SALE CATALOGUE A record 3,901 Thoroughbreds have been catalogued for Keeneland's 1996 September Yearling Sale, to be held Sept. 9-19. Officials at Keeneland recently extended the auction to 11 days to accommodate the record number of entries. The total consists of 2,060 colts, 1,840 fillies and one gelding. The 1996 sale tops the previous record of 3,705 set in 1995. Leading sires represented by yearlings in the sale include Danzig, Deputy Minister, Forty Niner, Gone West, Mr. Prospector, Nureyev, Pleasant Colony, Seattle Slew, Seeking the Gold, Storm Bird, Storm Cat and Unbridled. The Keeneland September Yearling Sale has produced 150 individual stakes winners of 207 stakes races so far this year. Twenty of these races were Grade I events, including the Belmont S., won by Editor's Note (\$125,000 in 1994); the Kentucky Oaks, won by Pike Place Dancer (\$40,000 in 1994); and the Whitney H., won by Mahogany Hall (\$120,000 in 1992). Sessions for the 1996 sale will begin at 10 a.m. daily.

IRGUN RETIRED Irgun (Sunny's Halo), a winner of three of his five career starts including the 1994 GI Wood Memorial, has been retired after suffering a slight tear in the tendon of his right front leg. The injury appeared several days after a bullet six-furlong work in 1:12 2/5 Monday, July 29 at Saratoga. Owned by Brandon and Marianne Chase, the five-year-old was plagued by foot and ligament problems and was on the shelf for two years after his Wood Memorial victory, finally coming back this past April to run fifth in a Santa Anita allowance test in what would be his final start. He popped a splint in that race but was once again nearing a return when he came up with the injury which has ended his racing career. A \$28,000 Keeneland September yearling, he goes to the breeding shed with earnings of \$476,975. Stud plans have not yet been finalized, but trainer Steve Young said, "He is a very attractive stallion prospect. He was a brilliantly fast horse who could get a mile and an eighth. He has very good conformation and he's out of a Secretariat mare."

BREEDER JAMES PHILLIPS DEAD According to a report in yesterday's *Daily Racing Form*, James W. Phillips, a Thoroughbred breeder and member of The Jockey Club, died Saturday in Ohio at the age of 73. The son-in-law of John W. Galbreath, Phillips bred 18 stakes winners in partnership with Galbreath, including the GISW and millionaire Brian's Time. He is survived by his wife, Joan, daughters Dianne Albrecht, Deborah Bower and Cynthia Close, and son John Phillips.

CHARLOTTE BROOKS ON THE IMPROVE Steeplechase jockey Charlotte Brooks, injured in a fall at Delaware Park July 9, has started therapy at the Bryn Mawr Rehabilitation Hospital in Malvern, Pennsylvania after spending nearly four weeks at Christiana Medical Center. Doctors expect Brooks to fully recover after suffering a fractured skull when her mount Princess Tori fell at the two-mile race's sixth hurdle. The filly veered through the right wing and fell over the turf course's outside rail; both horse and rider hit the main track's eighth pole. A 25-year-old English native, Brooks is assistant trainer to Jonathan Sheppard and rides as an amateur with the National Steeplechase Association and Amateur Riders Club of the Americas.

PACIFIC CLASSIC-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 10f

Cigar (Palace Music) arrived at Del Mar at noon, local time, Thursday, accompanied by two California Highway Patrol cars which followed the horse van during the entire 95 miles from Ontario Airport to the track. A news helicopter recorded the final miles of the trip, and a crowd of television crews, photographers, turf writers and fans greeted him as he completed his journey. As for the flight, trainer Bill Mott said, "It was very nice, very uneventful. It was about 10 hours from stall to stall." Remarking on the attention his champion received upon his arrival, Mott said, "Actually, we've become a little bit used to it. It's been pretty enthusiastic over the last several races. We've kind of come to expect it, and actually, it's pretty nice." Stabled with trainer Bill Shoemaker's string, the six-year-old will gallop this morning.

Jockey Chris McCarron, who rode **Best Pal** (Habitony) in his last 13 races, was aboard the retired gelding for a jog around the track yesterday. The eight-year-old, California's all-time leading money winner, will start a new tradition when he leads the post parade for Saturday's big event. Best Pal won the inaugural running of the Pacific Classic in 1991 and finished second and third in two other editions.

Trainer Eduardo Inda, who will saddle **Luthier Fever** (Mt. Livermore) for the final leg of the MGM Grand Classic Crown, will take time out from his preparations this morning to be sworn in as an American citizen. The 53-year-old native of Chile has been a resident in the U.S. for more than 30 years.

ESPN will air a 30-minute special featuring Cigar at 10:00 p.m. EDT tonight; the Pacific Classic will be televised live on ESPN Saturday from 6-7:00 p.m. EDT.

Prospect Bay was making only his fourth start of the year and already had two on-the-board finishes in graded races after running second in the GII True North and third in the GII De Frances Memorial Dash in his last start July 20. The colt, the crowd's choice, sat behind the early lead of Honour and Glory, passed that rival in midstretch and drew clear. "That was exactly what I wanted to see," said John Kimmel, currently the leading trainer at the Saratoga meet with seven wins. "When Honour and Glory broke a little slow and was then rushed up, Jerry (Bailey) was able to get (Prospect Bay) to settle off him. Formerly he would go in :21 and :43 and the horse who went with him would finish 10 lengths back. He marks himself as a colt who deserves to be considered up there with the best sprinters." Kimmel named the GII Forego H. at Saratoga September 2 as a possible next start for the winner, with an eye toward the GI Vosburgh September 21 and the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Woodbine October 26. Met Mile hero Honour and Glory set solid early fractions after getting off a step slowly and could not withstand the winner. "He broke in a little, and I had to use him to make the lead," said jockey John Velazquez. "I still think he ran a good race, but the break did kill us."

Away from the races since that effort with a fractured hind cannon bone, she returned from a 9½-month layoff here as the 2-5 favorite. Ridden by new jockey Jerry Bailey, the bay sprinted clear in the early stages, set fractions of :21 4/5, :45 and :57 1/5 on the front end and was taken in hand through the final eighth for a handy victory.
