MARIA'S MON RETIRED Maria's Mon (Wavering Monarch), the 1995 Eclipse Award winner as the country's top two-year-old, has been retired from racing and will be shipped to Pin Oak Stud near Versailles, Kentucky, where he will stand at stud; a fee has not yet been determined. Owned jointly by Mrs. Morton Rosenthal and Josephine Abercrombie, Maria's Mon captured the GI Futurity and the GI Moet Champagne S. before suffering a non-displaced condylar fracture of his left front cannon bone while preparing for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He returned to race at three, finishing second against older horses in a Belmont allowance race July 17, then running a disappointing sixth in the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga August 4. After that race, it was discovered that he was developing problems associated with his original injury, and the decision was made to retire to him. "We had a couple of options," said Dr. E. C. "Pug" Hart, the colt's racing manager. "In the best interest of the horse, I recommended retirement. Considering his race record, conformation and pedigree, Maria's Mon's potential as a major force in the breeding industry far outweighs taking any chances of hurting him on the track." He retires with a record of four wins from seven starts and earnings of \$507,140.

VETERAN TURF WRITER BILL LEGGETT

PASSES AWAY Bill Leggett, who had graced the New York racing press box with his wit and wisdom since the 1950s and covered every major event in the sport as a turf writer for *Sports Illustrated* and the *Thoroughbred Times*, passed away Friday morning after a brief illness. He was 64. Leggett earned an Eclipse Award for Outstanding Magazine Writing in 1979 while at *SI*, where he wrote for 30 years; he also received the Walter Haight Award while writing for the *Thoroughbred Times* in 1989. A native of Saratoga Springs, New York, Leggett was a graduate of Seton Hall University. He served as president of the National Turf Writers Association from 1978-81, and was also a president of the New York Turf Writers Association. A regular contributor to the *Thoroughbred Daily News*, he will be missed as a valued member of our *TDN* family. Leggett is survived by his wife, Jane; daughters Eileen, Patricia, Maureen and Susan, and son Bill. Visitation will be held Sunday and Monday from 2-5:00 p.m. and 7-9:00 p.m. at Quinn's Funeral Home in Flushing, New York. A service will be held at Mary's Nativity Roman Catholic Church in Flushing Tuesday morning at 9:45.

SOUL OF THE MATTER TO AIRDRIE STUD Soul of the Matter (Private Account), who suffered a torn sesamoid ligament in his right front leg during a workout at Del Mar August 7, has been retired and will stand stud in 1997 at Mr. and Mrs. Brereton C. Jones' Airdrie Stud near Midway, Kentucky. The West Virginia-bred five-year-old made his last start March 27, finishing a game second to Cigar in the Dubai World Cup. A graded stakes winner from a mile and a sixteenth to a mile and a quarter, the dark bay captured the GI Super Derby at three and three Grade II events at three and four. He was second in the GII San Anonio H. in his only other start this year, and retires with seven wins from 16 starts and earnings of \$2,302,818.

DANZIG SEASONS TOP STALLION ACCESS

SALE Two seasons in Danzig (Northern Dancer) brought the highest bids during last night's Stallion Access Champagne Sale of Selected Seasons and Shares, held at Saratoga Springs. The first season offered brought \$131,000, while the second drew a high bid of \$135,000. The 19-year-old stallion, who stands at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky, has sired 113 stakes winners to date, including champions Dance Smartly, Chief's Crown and Dayjur. Only one stallion share was offered, that a lifetime breeding right to Pleasant Colony, but the share did not bring its reserve of \$120,000; one season to the 18-year-old attracted the third-highest bid of the night at \$55,000, but a second did not reach its reserve of \$49,000. In all, a total of 46 stallion seasons brought \$1,163,700 for an average of \$25,298. There were seven seasons listed as not sold.

ARLINGTON TEAMS WITH STATE LOTTERY

Arlington International and the Illinois Lottery have formed an aggressive partnership that will jointly promote the Lottery and horse racing in the state. The two organizations have joined forces to create several promotional events. Arlington will sell and redeem Instant Lottery tickets, Lotto and Little Lotto starting immediately, and mutuel tickets at the track will have special Lottery offers on the back. There will also be two 30-second commercial spots aired on the state's simulcast network every day during the 1996 racing season. In exchange, the Lottery will provide coupons good for discounted admission to Arlington; film its game show, *Instant Riches*, at the track September 20-21; and sponsor a race each day through the remainder of the meet.

Trainer John Kimmel reported yesterday that GII A Phenomenon S. winner **Prospect Bay** (Crafty Prospector) came back from his stakes record-setting performance in good shape, but that he may get a short break before his next start. "He's a horse who has had soundness problems in the past, so we might opt to give him some extra time between races and look at the Vosburgh (September 21) and the Breeders' Cup Sprint (October 26)," said Kimmel. Now four, the colt suffered a fractured tibia at two and a hairline knee fracture at three. "He never underwent surgery, it just entailed time off," the trainer remarked. "When horses run that fast, it's hard for their bodies to take it."

GII Peter Pan S. winner **Jamies First Punch** (Fit to Fight), away from the races since finishing eighth in the GI Belmont S., worked three furlongs in a bullet :35.42 Friday. Trainer Bobby Barbara said the three-year-old could be pointed to the GII King's Bishop S. August 24.

Gabr (GB) (Green Desert), twice successful in the U.S. and winner of Newmarket's G3 Van Geest Criterion S. on what was to be his final outing, is making steady progress following a leg injury which brought his racing career to a premature end last month. The Robert Armstrong-trained six-year-old broke his off-fore pastern during a piece of routine exercise and needed emergency surgery. Connections are still hoping he will recover fully and be able to stand as a stallion. But although Gabr is proving to be what Armstrong describes as "a model patient" following his operation, he is still in the care of a Newmarket veterinary practice. Armstrong said: "Gabr is doing all right and, so far, the long-term prognosis is reasonably good. But the bone was shattered, so it was not possible to pin or plate it and he has had to undergo a second anaesthetic so the cast on his leg could be charged. He came out of it well, though, and we are expecting to have him back here early next week."

Royal Applause (GB) (Waajib {Ire}), the second high-rated juvenile in Europe last year who returned to winning form at Doncaster July 31, appears set to have his next run in the G1 Haydock Park Sprint Cup September 7. The Barry Hills-trainee was defeated in his first two starts of this year, the 2000 Guineas and the King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot, but he began to reveal his old form when scoring a comfortable victory in a six-furlong conditions event on his most recent outing at the end of last month. Hills said: "I think six furlongs is his best distance and the Haydock race is his main aim now. He could go on to Ascot's Diadem S. (September 29) and will stay in training as a four-year-old."
