CIGAR RETURNS HOME Reigning Horse of the Year Cigar (Palace Music) was loaded onto a van near his Del Mar barn at 6:05 a.m. Sunday and driven north to Ontario Airport where he was to begin his return flight to New York. The plane was scheduled to take off at approximately 9 a.m. Before departing, trainer Bill Mott passed along to the media the following thoughts about the champion's second-place finish at 1-9 odds in Saturday's \$1 million Pacific Classic. Cigar had won 16 consecutive races before Saturday's 3½-length defeat. "It's disappointing," Mott said. "But everyone involved knows if you lead them over there often enough, they'll get beat. I have no regrets. We can't put this horse in a vacuum. The most basic thing in racing got us--pace. Pace makes the race. Ever since I've been involved in racing I've heard that one. And yesterday it was certainly true. We were concerned about **Siphon (Brz)** (Itajara {Brz}) (3rd) and his speed. Jerry (jockey Bailey) and I talked about it and we thought he was our biggest concern. Maybe we gave him too much respect. But he beat us at Hollywood (in the Gold Cup when Mott and Bailey ran second to him with Geri {Theatrical}) and he appeared to be a genuine speed horse. We thought the fractions would be realistic and that we could stay close by him. We knew he'd gotten away with a half in :47 and change in the Gold Cup and we thought a half in :46 and change or so here would be likely. But he went faster (:45 4/5) and we went with him. There aren't too many horses who can run the mile in 1:33 and change (Cigar's mile in the Pacific Classic was 1:33 3/5) and still have enough left to be around at the end of a mile and a quarter." Mott added that Cigar came out of the race in good physical shape. "He came out of the race fine and he ate up last night," said the trainer. "This morning he seems to be fine; his legs are okay. I think he knows he got beat, though. His attitude was lower than I've seen it in a while." Mott has already mapped out a tentative fall schedule for the six-year-old. "We'll get him back to New York and see how he's doing. If he's doing okay in five weeks or so, we'll look at running in the Woodward (Sept. 14). Another possible race for him could be the Jockey Club Gold Cup (Oct. 5). We've got to be sure to save something for that last race (Oct. 26 Breeders' Cup Classic)." Mott added one final thought: "I hope (Pacific Classic winner) **Dare and Go** (Alydar) is in our next few races. I'd like another shot at him. I'd like to try to get our reputation back. I'm sorry that the streak was broken, but it doesn't mean the pressure is any less. I don't feel that way. He's still a very special horse. That hasn't changed."

 Mantovani, whose only previous success had come in a maiden over this course and distance, beat much better fancied rivals to register a 20-1 victory in yesterday's Group One event at Leopardstown. **RAPHANE** (Rahy) was fastest out of the stalls, but **OCEAN RIDGE** (Storm Bird) soon sprinted to the front and set a good pace. **Muchea (GB)** kept close tabs on the leader with **Verglas** also holding a prominent position. The eventual winner, meanwhile, was buried deep in the pack as the front four battled on toward the final two furlongs. But successful jockey **Conor Everard** spotted a gap on the inside rails with 200 yards to race and, squeezing through bravely, **Mantovani** quickened well to provide a surprise result. Winning trainer **Jim Bolger** admitted, "I am as surprised as everyone else. I knew he would handle the (rain-softened) ground. But he has only started to work well at home over the past three weeks."

The Head family was in superb form again yesterday as Anabaa, owned by Mme. Alec Head, trained by her daughter Criquette and ridden by son Freddy, landed his sixth straight victory and his second in a row in Group 1 company. Given a patient ride by Freddy Head, the colt was content to wait at the back of the field, allowing POPLAR BLUFF (IRE) (Dowsing) and EASY DOLLAR (GB) (Gabitat {Ire}) to make the initial fast pace. Anabaa and eventual third Danehill Dancer played a waiting game at the back of the field, until, with two furlongs to run, Anabaa cruised up on the stands side and hit the front with only one furlong left to run. Freddy Head was oozing confidence, taking a quick look over his shoulder before drawing away from the fast-finishing Miesque's Son, who lost nothing in being second. Criquette Head was delighted with the win and said the horse has proved he could win from any position. Possible targets for Anabaa are the G1 Haydock Park Sprint Cup in Sept. or the G1 Prix Abbaye de Longchamp in October.

AVERAGE UP AT SARATOGA PREFERRED

YEARLING SALE Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Preferred Yearling Sale, held Saturday night in Saratoga Springs, New York, saw 38 yearlings sell for a gross of \$761,800 and an average of \$20,047, up nine percent from last year's average of \$18,383. There were 20 yearlings reported as not sold, up from eight in 1995. The sales topper was **Danish Echo**, a bay filly by Eastern Echo--Danish Prospector (Miswaki). Consigned by Harry L. Landry, agent, the New York-bred filly was purchased for \$53,000 by Roger L. Toffolon.

DEL MAR RECORDS FALL ON PACIFIC

CLASSIC DAY Along with setting an on-track attendance record during Saturday's Pacific Classic Day, Del Mar broke several other records as well. Off-track attendance was 31,020, exceeding the previous standard of 30,940 set August 15, 1992. The off-track figures, combined with the record on-track attendance of 44,181, gave Del Mar a total of 75,201, far and away the largest crowd ever for the seaside course. The total handle of \$20,813,571 topped the previous record of \$15,506,324 set August 19, 1995, and Saturday's out-of-state handle of \$8,048,522 was well above the previous record of \$4,539,475 set last year.

GLORY OF DANCER TO ARLINGTON

MILLION Epsom Derby fourth **Glory Of Dancer (GB)** (Shareef Dancer) is set to run in the Arlington Million Aug. 25. Trainer Paul Kelleway decided on a trip to Chicago after assessing his colt's latest performance, a fourth-place finish in Saturday's G3 Rose Of Lancaster S. over 10 furlongs at Haydock. Newmarket-based Kelleway said, "I don't want him to take on older European horses--the three-year-olds just cannot seem to beat them this season--and he will be guaranteed fast ground at Arlington. The only time it wasn't firm there was when I was third with Madam Gay (GB) in 1981." Last year's Highweight Colt at Two in Italy, **Glory Of Dancer** won the G1 Gran Criterium at Milan in 1995 and the G2 Homeowners Dante S. at York in May.

Red Camellia (GB) (Polar Falcon), quoted fourth in the betting for next year's English 1000 Guineas following her victory in the listed Milcars Star S. at Sandown July 25, will have her Classic credentials tested again when she tackles the G3 Prestige S. at Goodwood August 25.
