STEVENS BACK IN THE SADDLE Jockey Gary Stevens, recovering from surgery on his left shoulder, said Wednesday morning he expects to be back riding at Del Mar by the first of September, a full month before he thought the surgery would allow him to return. Stevens got up on horses for the first time Tuesday, working four mounts. He worked five Wednesday morning. He said the doctor has given him the go-ahead to get up on a few horses each morning for 10 days. "I feel very, very good," Stevens said, adding that he worked hard to stay fit during his three month hiatus from race riding. "It's a lot harder to get fit than to stay fit."

TREMPOLINO COLT TOPS DEAUVILLE TUESDAY A colt by Trempolino--Pelagic (GB) (Rainbow Quest) topped Tuesday's fourth session of L'Agence Francaise's 1996 yearling sale at Deauville, France. The colt, consigned by Haras d'Etreham, was purchased for \$69,230 by Asian Bloodstock Services Ltd. Overall, 63 yearlings were offered Tuesday, with 44 sold for a gross of \$1,280,000 and an average of \$29,195, up 20 percent from the fourth session average in 1995. The sale continues through Thursday.

TEXAS YEARLING SALE WRAP-UP The Texas Thoroughbred Association Summer Yearling Sale at the Will Rogers Equestrian Center in Fort Worth concluded Tuesday with the second of two open sessions. During the day, 195 yearlings changed hands for a gross of \$953,900 and an average of \$4,892. TTBA Director of Sales Clay Murray said, "We really felt the positive influence created by the anticipation of Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie becoming a reality and the steady progress made at the other Class I tracks in Houston and San Antonio. We had some eager new buyers at this sale which was very encouraging." The top seller Tuesday was a chestnut colt by Robin des Pins--Soigneuse (Tom Rolfe). Consigned by Steve Marvin and Roberta Smoodin, the colt, who had been previously sold for \$9,000 as a weanling at the 1995 Keeneland November sale, was purchased for \$40,000 by Leland P. Cook. For the entire two-day sale, 369 yearlings brought a total of \$2,387,100, up 16.28 percent from last year's gross of \$2,052,900. The average was \$6,469.

Key Change, third in the G1 Irish Oaks, needed to reverse her July form to collect here. She did so in fine style, grabbing the lead just after the halfway mark and battling on resolutely to take the prize. Papering made up late ground to grab second. RUSSIAN SNOWS (IRE) (Sadler's Wells) finished third, but was disqualified and placed sixth for interfering with WHITEWATER AFFAIR (GB) (Mr. Prospector) inside the final furlong. Winning jockey Johnny Murtagh said, "The going was hard at The Curragh for the Irish Oaks and was much better--in fact, perfect--here. I could never get to the front in Ireland. But I knew if I could get a clear lead here it would take a good one to pass me." The major disappointment of the event was Prix de Diane heroine SIL SILA (IRE) (Marju), who was virtually pulled up following a stumble around two furlongs out. Her connections were unable to account for the problem.

Abou Zouz, described by trainer David Loder after his maiden win at Newmarket in April as "possibly the best two-year-old colt I've ever had," proved that to be no idle boast when capturing this Group 2 event. Compton Place was fastest at the start and took the field along at a strong gallop. The eventual winner was slightly out-paced early, but jockey Frankie Dettori got him into top gear two furlongs from the wire. Abou Zouz hit the front about 100 yards from home and showed plenty of resolution to deny the runner-up's final-strides fightback. Loder admitted, "I was very disappointed when he was beaten (on his second start) at Kempton, because I expected him to win. I think he was probably a little bit immature mentally--possibly he still is--but he has got the potential to go even further. We gave him some time off after his defeat, but decided to bring him here because it was the obvious target. I am not sure where he will go next. We'll have to sit down and think about it."

Trainer James Toner said the Rare Perfume Breeders' Cup Sept. 13 would be next for Memories of Silver, possibly followed by a start in Keeneland's Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Oct. 5.

Cannon Shell (Torsion), a 17-year-old stallion, has died from a heart attack suffered in his paddock at Highcliff Farm in Delanson, New York, according to a story in today's *Daily Racing Form*. The chestnut won 11 of 40 starts for earnings of \$345,261. Stakes-placed in England in 1982, he found his greatest success racing in the U.S., where he won the Gil True North H. and the Jaipur S., both at Belmont Park. He is the sire of 82 winners of over \$2 million in purses. His best runner was Zapateado, a stakes-winner at Bay Meadows who earned \$144,730.

Undefeated Swiss Yodeler, winner of the Gil Hollywood Juvenile Championship in his last outing July 21, upped his record to a perfect five-for-five here, tracking pacesetter Golden Bronze through the first half-mile, then taking command and drawing clear for his fourth straight stakes victory. "He's all heart," said jockey Alex Solis, who has ridden the colt to all five of his triumphs. "If anybody gets next to him, they had better be prepared for a war. He's a warrior. He does whatever you want him to do. He's a good one." Winning trainer Mike Harrington added, "This horse is five-for-five but he gets no respect. If Lukas (trainer D. Wayne Lukas) had this horse they'd be touting him as the next Citation. If he comes out of this race good, I'll run him in the Futurity (the Gil Del Mar Futurity Sept. 11). This was a hard race for him, so he might not be ready."
