**GERI OUT OF ISELIN** Geri (Theatrical {Ire}), winner of the GI Oaklawn H. earlier this year and runner-up in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup last out, will most likely miss Sunday's GI Philip H. Iselin H. at Monmouth Park, trainer Bill Mott reported yesterday. Mott explained that the four-year-old, who was expected to be favored against four rivals in the Iselin, has been under the weather and would not be 100 percent for the race. "It's a case where we could go, but I wouldn't feel everything was going our way," said Mott. "He's not what you would call a sick horse--it's like he had sort of a sinus infection." With Geri's apparent defection, there are just four horses definite for the \$300,000 event: **Serena's Song** (Rahy), **Eltish** (Cox's Ridge), **Smart Strike** (Mr. Prospector) and **November Sunset** (Runaway Groom).

**BROADWAY FLYER RETIRED** Broadway Flyer (Theatrical {Ire}), who earned Grade I status with an impressive six-length victory in the GI Sword Dancer H. at Saratoga August 10, suffered a fractured sesamoid in his right front leg during training at Saratoga yesterday morning and has been retired. The five-year-old, twice a Group 3 winner in England at three, shipped to the States for his '96 campaign and had finished first or second in five of six starts this year; he goes to the breeding shed with a record of six wins, six seconds and two thirds from 21 career starts and a bankroll of \$602,758. Plans for his stud career have not yet been announced.

**MOCKINGBIRD STALLION ROSTER CHANGES** Several changes to the stallion roster at Harry Mangurian Jr.'s Mockingbird Farm in Ocala, Florida were reported in an article written by Bill Giauque in yesterday's *Ocala Star-Banner*. According to the article, **Crusader Sword** (Damascus) has been sold to Lou Salerno's Questroyal Farm in New York. The 11-year-old stallion had his first graded stakes winner last weekend, when Isitingood won the Gill Longacres Mile at Emerald Downs. "(Crusader Sword) will be an important stallion in the New York breeders program," Mangurian told the *Star-Banner*. "I held some breeding rights in him." With Crusader Sword's departure, Mangurian will bring two new stallions to Mockingbird Farm for 1997; both are currently part of his racing stable. They are last year's Gil Hutcheson S. winner **Valid Wager** (Valid Appeal) and GSW Lahint (Woodman), a full-brother to 1991 Champion Three-Year-Old Colt Hansel.

Pivotal gave trainer Sir Mark Prescott his first Group One success with this last-stride victory. Evening-performance, first out of the stalls, led at her usual blisteringly fast pace. Pivotal and Hever Golf Rose started gaining ground on the leader with 200 yards remaining, but it seemed that the eventual runner-up would hold on. However, under driving from jockey George Duffield, Pivotal inched closer all the way to wire and was given a short-head verdict by the judge. Prescott said, "I've waited 25 for years for this. The jockey gave him a fine ride and I am lucky to have such a good horse. We didn't think he was all that good at first but he started to show us he was useful last September. I think he'll get even better, although I don't know yet if his owners will want him to stay in training for another year."

Bianca Nera gave Newmarket trainer David Loder's rejuvenated team another boost by winning this Group 2 event. Loder's stable had struggled to find its form in the first half of the season. But, in recent days, everything he saddles seems to run well. Bianca Nera was no exception. Though she could not quite match the early pace of **WELL WARNED (GB) (Warning {GB})**, she was never far off the leaders. Jockey Kevin Darley took her to the front with two furlongs left and, despite the persistent late challenge of **Arethusa**, kept enough up his sleeve for a neck success. Loder, whose filly had won her only previous race at Beverley just last week, said, "I could not run a lot of my horses earlier on in the year. I would probably have beaten them! But I ran Bianca Nera seven days ago because I didn't want her to come here without some experience of racing."

**DEVIL BEGONE TO WINDFIELDS FARM** Devil Begone (Devil's Bag) has joined the stallion roster at Windfields Farm in Ontario, Canada. The six-year-old is out of the Grade I-winning mare **Endear (Alydar)**, and is thus a half-brother to dual Breeders' Cup Mile winner **Lure**. His first foals arrived this spring. "We have been looking for a good outcross for Northern Dancer-line mares," farm manager Bernard McCormack said, "and we saw some great results with **Hail to Reason**-line sires, particularly through **Halo** and his sons **Devil's Bag** and **Sunday Silence**. Devil's Bag is off to a great start as a sire of sires, too. His son **Diablo** is the leading freshman sire this year, and another freshman son, **Twilight Agenda**, has a graded stakes winner already." Devil Begone, who stood the 1996 season at stud at **Curramore Farm** in Ontario, won two of 13 career starts, his victories coming in a maiden special weight at **Woodbine** and a turf allowance at **Monmouth Park**. Devil Begone will stand the 1997 season for \$1,500, Canadian Funds, payable when the foal stands and nurses.

**DEAUVILLE WEDNESDAY RESULTS** A colt by Pursuit of Love--Lady Reem (Al Nasr {Fr}) topped Wednesday's fifth session of L'Agence Francaise's 1996 yearling sale in Deauville, France. Consigned by Haras d'Etreham, the colt was purchased for \$63,110 by F.B.A. on behalf of Dr. R. Bousquet. Overall, 52 horses were offered Wednesday, with 30 sold for a gross of \$816,290 and an average of \$27,210. The sale concluded Thursday.

**Local News, Blue Ribbon Downs:**

BancFirst of Seminole, Oklahoma has established the Ron Childers Hospital Fund to aid the jockey who was critically injured in a riding accident Friday, Aug. 16 at Blue Ribbon Downs. Childers, a native of Bowlegs, Oklahoma, suffered severe head injuries and has been listed in critical condition in Sparks Hospital in Fort Smith, Arkansas since the accident. He has undergone brain surgery and remains in a coma. Donations can be sent to BancFirst, P.O. Box 1071, Seminole, OK 74868.

**Local News, Hoosier Park:**

Hoosier Park Thoroughbred Racing Secretary Warren Groce announced yesterday that all of the track's 795 stalls have been assigned for the upcoming Thoroughbred meet, which begins Sept. 20. In all, Hoosier Park received nearly 1,600 stall applications. The 53-day meet, which will last through Nov. 30, will carry average daily purses of \$85,000. The meet features a schedule of 18 stakes races, highlighted by the second running of the \$100,000-added Indiana Derby Oct. 5.

**Local News, Keeneland:**

According to yesterday's *Lexington Herald-Leader*, Keeneland may be close to hiring a racecaller for the first time in its history. The report said track officials have been in contact with former Arlington International announcer Kurt Becker for about six weeks. Becker, 27, left Arlington in 1994 to call auto racing on the NASCAR circuit for MRN Radio; he continues to call harness races at county fairs, and his father, Carl, is the track announcer at The Red Mile's Grand Circuit meet. The *Herald-Leader* disclosed that Keeneland has received more than 15 audition tapes since June, when it was first revealed that the track was considering adding a racecaller to the staff. Mike Battaglia, the announcer at Churchill Downs and Turfway Park, calls the Keeneland races for simulcast programs but is not heard at the track. An announcer's booth on the grandstand roof is under construction, but live calls are not expected to be added to the Keeneland program before the 1997 Spring meet.

"The Grand National is a possibility for the fall, but we'll have to wait and see how he does physically because he has a couple of bowed tendons," said winning trainer Thomas M. Voss. ### TOMORROW'S DATE IN HISTORY...

**August 24, 1968...**Carrying 134 pounds, **Dr. Fager** set the world record for a mile in the Washington Park H. at Arlington Park. The time for his 10-length victory was 1:32 1/5. The previous record was 1:32 3/5, set by three-year-old Buckpasser June 25, 1966 at Arlington Park.

**Indiscreet** (St. Jovite) set a new course record and earned himself odds of 20-1 for next year's 2000 Guineas after a brilliant racecourse debut in the six furlong Moorestyle Convivial Maiden S. at York yesterday. When Frankie Dettori asked the colt to quicken inside the final 330 yards, Indiscreet strode clear for a smooth three-length victory in a York course-record time of 1:09.59 to become the fourth winner for his champion freshman sire. Winning trainer David Loder said, "He's a natural athlete and will improve when going over further. I don't think he will run too much more this year, but he could be a Dewhurst S. (Group One, Newmarket, October 18) horse."

**First Island (Ire)** (Dominion) and **Bijou d'Inde (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux), who finished second and third behind Halling in Tuesday's G1 Juddmonte International S. at York, will meet again in Ascot's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. Sept. 28. Mark Johnston, who handles Bijou d'Inde, explained, "There is still a chance he could go back up to a mile and a quarter for the Breeders' Cup Classic." The Ascot event is also the intended aim for Newmarket 1000 Guineas heroine **Bosra Sham** (Woodman). The Henry Cecil-trained filly has not raced since her Classic triumph because of foot problems.
