**SUFFOLK DOWNS SOLD** Sterling Suffolk Racecourse Limited Partnership, the operator of Suffolk Downs in East Boston, Massachusetts, confirmed Wednesday that it signed a purchase and sales agreement last week to buy the racetrack property from Belle Isle Limited Partnership. Sterling Suffolk, headed by Chairman James B. Moseley and President John Hall, has operated the track since 1992 under lease from Belle Isle. The property is 190 acres and the premises include the track and its buildings, stable area and parking lots. "We have been trying to accomplish this since 1993," said Moseley. "We have always felt it is best for us to own this property. The racing industry in Massachusetts is on shaky ground. This allows us to stabilize this industry and brace ourselves for the next few years." Hall added, "We're much better off with the added control that owning the property provides. This is valuable property and we think there is development potential that can go hand in hand with our racing operation." Sterling Suffolk has 120 days to close the transaction and Hall said he anticipates financing for the deal will be complete before then. Terms of the agreement include a base price of \$30 million with a \$10 million second note and considerations to the seller in the event of future development.

**NEW RIDER FOR SKIP AWAY** GI Haskell winner **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) will get a new rider for his next start, which is expected to be the Sept. 15 Woodbine Million. Jose Santos rode the three-year-old in his last four outings--a second-place finish in the Belmont S., victories in the GI Ohio Derby and GI Haskell, and most recently a third-place effort in the Aug. 24 Travers S. Santos had been criticized, however, for his ride in the Travers, when he tried unsuccessfully to squeeze through along the rail then was forced to check and bring his mount to the outside for a clear run. At first, trainer Sonny Hine appeared ready to stick with Santos for the colt's next start, but said the jockey helped to make up his mind when he told reporters after the race that Skip Away had "a very clean trip." Hine said, "I asked him what happened and he said 'nothing.' It hurt because we could have locked up the championship, but that's been messed up. I thought about it, I digested it, I saw the replays and then I read his comments. I owe it to Shane and I better go back to him."

Harghar, making his first career start outside Ireland here at 7-1 odds, was graded stakes placed in that country at age two. Ridden in his stateside debut by Pat Day, the dark bay lingered toward the back of the field early, quickly closed ground on the second turn and prevailed over the favored Sir Cat in a long drive. "He ran as nice of a race as a horse could run," said winning trainer Burk Kessinger Jr. "The horse has been training great and today he proved it." Kessinger said the GIII Keeneland Breeders' Cup Mile Oct. 12 may be next for Harghar. Sir Cat had been undefeated in two starts on the turf coming into this race. The Storm Cat colt won the GI National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame S. at Saratoga in his last outing Aug. 5. "We had a good trip and we made the lead with ease at the stretch," said Sir Cat's jockey Jerry Bailey. "Harghar was better than us today. But when you give the winner 10 pounds over a course to his liking, he will be better than you on any day."

Jockey Shane Sellers, who will reclaim the mount, was aboard Skip Away when the colt won the April 13 GII Blue Grass S. by six lengths and when he finished second in the Preakness. Sellers lost the mount to Santos when he broke his wrist following the Preakness. Other possible entrants in the Woodbine Million include **Will's Way** (Easy Goer) and **Louis Quatorze** (Sovereign Dancer), first and second respectively in the Travers.

### YOUNG ERN RETIRED TO STUD

**Young Ern (GB)** (Efisio {GB}) has been retired to stud, according to a story in yesterday's *Racing Post*. The six-year-old will stand the 1997 breeding season at Cobhambury Farm Stud in Edenbridge, Kent, England. Young Ern won eight of 38 starts for earnings of \$406,272. His triumphs included the G3 Prix du Palais-Royal in France and the G3 Toplist Hungerford S. in England, both in 1994. He also won the listed Leicestershire S. in England in both 1995 and 1996. "He was the best horse I've ever trained by a long way," his trainer Simon Dow told the *Racing Post*. "I owe him a tremendous amount and will always remember his battle with Pollen Count in the Hungerford. That was a marvelous win and put the stable firmly on the racing map." Dow explained his decision to retire his stable star, saying, "This was always going to be his last year and in truth he hasn't really been firing lately. Rather than keep persevering and risk an injury, I decided enough was enough. He owes us nothing and, as a six-year-old, probably has his mind on other things." In his final career start Aug. 11, Young Ern finished seventh in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville.

### DIABLO COLT TOPS OBS WEDNESDAY

The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company completed the second session of its August Open Yearling Sale Wednesday, with 200 horses sold for a gross of \$1,466,700, an increase over last year's corresponding session gross of \$1,409,500. Wednesday's average of \$7,334 was down 9.4 percent from \$8,100 in 1995, and the median of \$5,200 represented a 8.8 percent decrease from last year's \$5,700. The day's highest price was paid for a colt by leading juvenile sire Diablo out of Two Roses (Double Edge Sword). Consigned by Donald Kielty's Great Luck Farm, agent, the dark bay or brown colt was purchased by Peter Redekop for \$57,000. "The average and median dipped slightly," said OBS Director of Sales Tom Ventura. "There were not as many higher priced horses in this year's session compared to last year." The sale concludes today.

**SIMULCAST CONFERENCE EYES FUTURE** The fourth annual National Simulcast Conference in Houston, Texas will be held from Sept. 16-18. The conference will feature Philip O'Hara, general manager of Penn National, who will discuss the creation of a national telecommunications network for the transmission of wagering data and simulcast information, and Sid Dhanoa, Information Systems/Programming and Operations Manager at the New York Racing Association, who will update attendees on the latest developments regarding mutuel operations and tote systems. The event, sponsored jointly by the Thoroughbred Racing Association, the American Quarter Horse Racetrack Association and Harness Tracks of America, is fast approaching its maximum registration capacity of 350, so prospective participants are encouraged to reserve their spots as soon as possible.

Hughes said afterwards, "She hit the front too soon when she won the Phoenix Sprint at Leopardstown earlier this month, so this time I wanted to wait and wait as long as possible and it worked."
