#### MT. LIVERMORE COLT TOPS KEENELAND

**THURSDAY** Thursday's fourth session of the 1996 Keeneland September Yearling Sale saw 293 horses sell for a gross of \$15,902,100 and an average of \$54,273, up seven percent from last year's fourth session average of \$50,738. Yesterday's median price of \$40,000 was down slightly from \$41,500 in 1995. The day's highest price of \$350,000 was paid by Ted Keefer, agent for Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Moss of California, for a bay colt by Mt. Livermore--Never Say Forever (Graustark). The colt will be broken at Keefer's 100-acre training center, Shady Oak Farm, in Magnolia, Texas. Keefer said the colt has "beautiful conformation" and is "very well balanced. I love the pedigree on him. I love Mt. Livermore. Of course, he has the classic line with being out of the Graustark mare." The second highest price of the day, \$310,000, was paid by John and Jerry Amerman for a bay colt by St. Jovite out of the multiple stakes-winning mare Madame l'Enjoleur (L'Enjoleur). The colt will be trained by Ron Ellis. John Amerman is C.E.O of the Mattel toy company and he and his wife Jerry own between 20 and 25 horses in training, some in partnership. The Amermans, who own Peacefields Farm, a 62-acre spread in Temecula, California, are primarily involved in racing, but do own one broodmare in Kentucky as well as an interest in Star of Cozzene. They've been involved in racing for about 10 years. In explaining why they invested in the St. Jovite colt, Mr. Amerman pointed out that the freshman stallion has gotten off to a fast start at stud. "The dam's side is absolutely spectacular," he added. "We're very excited." Agent Demi O'Byrne purchased the day's third highest-priced yearling, a bay by Deputy Minister--Silver Valley (Mr. Prospector), for \$290,000 on behalf of John Magnier and Michael Tabor. D. Wayne Lukas will train the colt. "He's a full brother to Silver Deputy," O'Byrne said. "I rated him very highly. He looks the part to be a two-year-old." The 11-day auction continues through Thursday, Sept. 19.

**DEL MAR MEETING ENDS** Del Mar retained its spot as the industry leader in total daily average attendance with a mark of 31,587 set at the 43-day 1996 meeting which concluded Wednesday. The figure was down 4.7% from last year. Del Mar bested its one-day on-track attendance by almost 10,000 on Pacific Classic Day, leading to a total on- and off-track mark of 1,358,225. Total handle from all sources, including on-track, intertrack and simulcast sites, was a record \$502,146,559, an increase of 3.7% from 1995. Total daily average handle was also a Del Mar record of \$11,677,827. On track handle was a daily average of \$2,280,389, down 2.7% from 1995. Daily average on-track attendance was 14,814, down 2.5% from a year ago. Daily average purses during the meet were \$404,722. Alex Solis captured his first leading rider title at Del Mar with 44 wins, while trainer Mike Mitchell led all trainers for the sixth time with 17 wins.

**JOCKEY CLUB RELEASES 1995 LIVE FOAL**

**CROP STATISTICS** The Jockey Club yesterday announced a live foal crop of 39,015 for 1995. The crop was a result of the matings of 5,889 Thoroughbred stallions and 60,868 mares in 1994. The foal crop figure indicates an overall live foal percentage of 64%, up three percent from the previous year. The figure was up 2.2% over the 1994 live foal crop of 38,152, and reversed four years of steady decline in the live foal crop size. "The average stallion book size of the breed is going up," said Roger Shook, director of registration services for The Jockey Club. "Typically, larger books generate higher live foal percentage returns." The number of stallions decreased by seven percent from the 6,335 reported bred in 1993. There was a 1.8 percent decline from the 62,003 mares reported bred in 1993. Kentucky set the pace for the country, with 11,031 live foals, while Florida moved into second place with 4,002 live foals. California slipped to third, reporting 3,791 foals. The 1994 statistics include progeny sired by stallions standing in North America but foaled abroad, as reported by foreign Stud book authorities. In this category, 91 live foals by North American stallions were reported from Japan, up from 41 foals the previous season. The Jockey Club also advised that preprinted Service Certificates have been mailed to all stallion owners who returned Reports of Mares Bred by the August 1 deadline, the first step in the registration process for foals of 1997.

**OUR EMBLEM RETIRED TO CLAIBORNE**

**FARM** Our Emblem (Mr. Prospector) has been retired and will stand the 1997 breeding season at stud at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky. The stud fee for his initial season will be \$10,000 live foal. Our Emblem, the second foal out of the undefeated champion mare Personal Ensign, is a full-brother to GI Jockey Club Gold Cup winner Miner's Mark and a half-brother to My Flag, who won the GI Gazelle H. at Belmont last weekend. The five-year-old, bred and raced by Ogden Phipps, won five of 27 starts and placed in eight graded stakes including the GI Carter H., GI Met Mile and GI Vosburgh H. Seventh in the GI Iselin H. at Monmouth in his final career start Aug. 25, he earned \$366,013 during his racing career. According to a story in today's *Daily Racing Form*, Our Emblem will be syndicated, with the Phippses keeping an interest in him.

**REMINGTON PARK'S FALL MEET BEGINS**

**TODAY** Remington Park's 1996 Fall Meeting begins today, with post-time for the first race set for 1:15 p.m. The 54-date meet at the Oklahoma City track will run through Dec. 1. Remington Park will host the biggest day in Oklahoma racing Sunday, Nov. 3 with the fourth running of the Oklahoma Classics, a series of seven events for accredited Oklahoma-breds worth an estimated \$375,000. A total of 27 stakes worth over \$1 million have been carded for the Fall Meeting. Highlights of the stakes schedule include the \$150,000 Remington Green H. for ages three and up at 1 1/8-miles on the turf Oct. 5; the \$100,000 Red Earth Derby for three-year-olds at 1 1/8-miles Oct. 12; and the \$100,000-added Mathis Brothers Remington Futurity for two-year-olds Oct. 19.

**SCRATCHES, CHANGES NOW ON INTERNET**

Late scratches, rider changes, overweights or any other program amendments can now be posted by tracks through the Equibase web server, enabling immediate access by receiving sites through the Equibase home page on the World Wide Web, the Thoroughbred Racing Associations and Equibase Co. announced yesterday. "Although the ultimate success of this innovation will depend upon the racetracks' cooperation in immediately transmitting their changes to the Equibase web server, this new link makes it easy to reach every receiving site and ensure its patrons have access to vital wagering information," said TRA Executive Vice President Chris Scherf. The first public demonstration will be given at the TRA Simulcast Conference which begins Monday in Houston.

Bookmakers shortened odds on Epsom Derby runner-up **Dushyantor** (Sadler's Wells) yesterday following news that both **Chief Contender (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) and **Pricket** (Diesis {GB}) have been forced out of the St. Leger with last-minute problems. Connections of the pair had been hoping to declare for the final leg of Britain's Triple Crown. However, Chief Contender has a skin rash and Pricket was found to be stiff behind following her final piece of work earlier in the week. No alternative plan has so far been revealed for Godolphin's Epsom Oaks second. But Chief Contender's trainer, Peter Chapple-Hyam, said, "We hope to prepare him instead for the Prix Lutece at Longchamp (Oct. 5)." **Bishop Of Cashel**, almost certainly running his last race in Britain, was an impressive winner in his second consecutive Park S. victory. The four-year-old captured this race last year when it was run under another name, so the change of sponsors made no real difference to trainer James Fanshawe's charge. **ROYAL PHILOSOPHER (GB)** (**Faustus**) set off in front at a good pace. But **Restructure** kept contact with him from the start and took over the lead with just over a quarter of a mile left. **Walter Swinburn**, however, steadily made up ground on the eventual winner. He asked **Bishop Of Cashel** to go for broke passing the furlong marker and, despite lugging slightly left in the final few strides, his mount proved an easy winner. "The Prix de la Foret is his big autumn target before he goes to stud next year," said **Fanshawe**. "He may run in the Prix Dollar beforehand."

**Double Trigger (Ire)** smashed the course record with a wire-to-wire victory here, giving weight to all five of his rivals. **Frankie Dettori**, acting as substitute for his usual jockey **Jason Weaver** (currently serving a suspension), did not hesitate in taking the lead on **Double Trigger** as soon as the gates opened. **Dettori** made certain his mount found a nice rhythm following an 84-day layoff and then, about three furlongs from home, kicked hard for the wire. **Celeric**, who needs to be held up for a late run, began to make ground inside the final two furlongs. But **Dettori's** mount did not slow and always appeared certain to win despite his recent foot problems. Winning trainer **Mark Johnston** said, "I didn't think he looked all that comfortable, but he was obviously enjoying himself. The time (more than two seconds inside the previous best) proves it. He lost all but the toe of a front hoof when tearing off his shoe in the Gold Cup at Ascot and for a long time we could not get any nails in to put another plate on. But the farrier has done well to sort him out and this is a tribute to his skill."

Horsemen will have the option of outfitting their horses with a new type of weight under their saddles when the fall meeting kicks off Oct. 5 at Keeneland. The track will offer Best Pad Race Weights along with traditional lead weights. The new pads are made of felt, closed-cell foam and vulcanized rubber, and are viewed as a safe alternative to lead weights. The pads have been carried by many high-profile figures in racing. After Jerry Bailey won the Kentucky Derby aboard Grindstone with the Best Pad Race Weights, he had several high weight pads designed for Cigar, who carried them when tying Citation's 16-race winning streak. Keeneland will become the first race course to offer the pads.
