JOCKEY CLUB GOLD CUP FIELD TAKES

SHAPE The likely presence of reigning Horse of the Year **Cigar** (Palace Music) in the \$1 million Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Oct. 5 doesn't seem to be scaring off the competition. Trainer H. James Bond said Wednesday that **L'Carriere** (Carr de Naskra), second to Cigar in last Saturday's GI Woodward, came out of the race "beautifully" and will make his next start in the Jockey Club Gold Cup. "Actually, I think a mile and a quarter (Gold Cup distance) is better for him, personally," said Bond. The trainer added that Travers winner **Will's Way** (Easy Goer) will also be nominated to the Gold Cup, although he doubted the three-year-old would run. Trainer Sonny Hine reported from Monmouth Park that **Skip Away** (Skip Trial), winner of the GI Woodbine Million last Sunday, returned to New Jersey Monday evening following a 14-hour van ride and will most likely make his next start in the Gold Cup. "Actually, he's a little tired, for a change," said Hine. "He hasn't tried to bite me yet. He'll jog tomorrow (Thursday) and we'll see if he's his old self, raising a little hell. I have until Saturday to nominate him and he'll tell us if he's ready. If he runs one more time this year, he'll be there." Mike Hushion, conditioner of **Golden Larch** (Slew o' Gold), third in the Woodward in both 1995 and 1996, said his charge will definitely be nominated to the Gold Cup.

ANTI-GAMBLING AMENDMENT DROPPED IN ARKANSAS

The amendment to the Arkansas State Constitution, which would have eliminated gambling of all sorts and shut the doors of Oaklawn Park, was dropped from the November ballot Wednesday by the Arkansas Supreme Court. A statement from the court read, "It was clear to all concerned that the proposal, Amendment 6, should be removed from the ballot." The Committee Against the Loss of Arkansas Jobs, a group composed primarily of Oaklawn employees and Hot Springs leaders, had filed suit against the Amendment, as had the Southland Greyhound Park in West Memphis. "The jobs and livelihood of 4,000 individuals tied to the racing industry at Oaklawn were at stake," commented Oaklawn General Manager Eric Jackson. "We owed it to Oaklawn, its people and tradition, as well as to the entire racing industry. Now that this part of the struggle is behind us, we will continue to strive for Amendment 4, our own amendment, which gives the people of Hot Springs the choice to accept casino gaming in our community. This is an economic issue that's centered around jobs, education, law enforcement and the future of racing in our area."

SMARTEN FILLY IS TOPS AT KEENELAND

William R. Peeples paid \$43,000 for a bay filly by Smarten--Space Flower (Relaunch) to top Wednesday's next-to-last session of the 1996 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. The filly, a half-sister to the stakes-placed Space Warning (Caveat), was consigned by Vinery (Ben P. Walden Jr.), agent. With one day remaining in the 11-day auction, Keeneland has sold 2,748 horses for a sale-record \$135,885,900. During Wednesday's session, 229 horses brought a gross of \$2,057,100 and an average of \$8,983, up 3.9 percent from last year's corresponding session average of \$8,643. The sale ends today.

GOFFS FRANCE ANNOUNCES ARC SALE

CATALOGUE Goffs France will hold its 1996 Arc de Triomphe Sale Oct. 5 at Goffs new site in Saint-Cloud, France. The catalogue for the sale, which features horses in training, yearlings and breeding stock, includes runners from the stables of top French trainers Pascal Bary, R. Collet, John Hammond, Criquelette Head and Elie Lellouche. Group performers being offered at the 1996 auction include G3 Prix du Calvados runner-up **Dame d'Harvard** (Quest For Fame {GB}), listed Prix Louis Desboudet winner **Ming Dynasty (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), G3 Prix Berteux second **Kharizmi (Fr)** (Lashkari {GB}) and G3 Prix de Royaumont third **Met Mech Nich (Fr)** (Assert {Ire}).

SHAAMIT HAS ARC TARGET

Epsom Derby winner **Shaamit (Ire)** (Mtoto {GB}) will end his three-year-old campaign in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 6. While saddling runners yesterday afternoon at Yarmouth, trainer William Haggas said, "He didn't have a race in Ireland last time out (when fourth in the G1 Irish Champion S.) and will be fine for the Arc." New riding plans for the colt, now beaten in both his starts since Epsom, have still to be decided as his Derby partner Michael Hills, has already committed himself to **Pentire (GB)** (Be My Guest) and Pat Eddery, on board in the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., is expected to stay loyal to **Dushyantor** (Sadler's Wells).

ROBERTS SUCCESSFUL IN RETURN Former British champion jockey Michael Roberts, out of action since breaking his left wrist in a fall at Sandown in July, won on his comeback ride at Yarmouth yesterday afternoon. The South African-born rider, who returned to race riding only this week, climbed aboard the Clive Brittain-trained **Secret Aly** (Secreto) before the Golden Jubilee Challenge Trophy H. still feeling only "98 percent" fit. But he was all smiles after his mount, winning for the first time since last October, came from off the pace to win by half a length. Roberts will partner the Brittain-trained **Fantastic Fellow** (Lear Fan) in Saturday's G1 National S. at The Curragh.

ROCKINGHAM RACING RAINED OUT Rockingham Park was forced to cancel its live racing card Wednesday afternoon after torrential rains made track conditions unsafe. The New Hampshire track remained open for simulcasting and live racing will resume Friday night, as scheduled.

Sleepytime (Ire) (Royal Academy) rocked the betting market for next year's 1000 Guineas with a spectacular first racecourse appearance at Sandown Park yesterday. The Henry Cecil-trained filly justified her even-money odds with a powerful move a quarter-mile from the wire. Sleepytime drew further away with every stride and scored in a canter by five lengths. Bookmaker response to the performance was to promote Sleepytime to 7-1 second-favorite for the 1000 Guineas next spring. Cecil said, "We will consider supplementing her for the G1 Cheveley Park S. (at Newmarket October 1)."

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

One couldn't find a much more "classic" pedigree than that owned by the St. Leger winner **Shantou** (c, 3, **Alleged--Shaima** {**Shareef Dancer**}). His sire was a close second in the St. Leger on his only classic attempt, but did win consecutive runnings of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and has since sired nine classic winners. The dam is a group winning daughter of Irish Derby winner **Shareef Dancer** and **Oh So Sharp**, who defeated the colts in the St. Leger, having earlier taken the 1000 Guineas and Oaks. The pedigree is actually somewhat reminiscent of two earlier good performers by **Alleged--Flemensfirth** and **Midway Lady**. **Flemensfirth**, who took last year's G1 Prix Lupin, is by **Alleged** out of a mare by **Diesis** (GB), a brother to **Oh So Sharp's** sire **Kris** (GB) (this is a reverse of one of the number of successful **Sharpen Up/Ribot** crosses). **Midway Lady**, heroine of the Oaks and 1000 Guineas, is by **Alleged** out of a mare by **His Majesty**, a brother to **Graustark**. The combination of **Alleged** and **Graustark/His Majesty** gives two sons of **Ribot**, but more subtly also combines the related **Determine** (another classic winner) and **Flower Bowl**. A final parting note of interest regarding **Shantou**: his fifth dam, **Malindi**, is a sister to **Nasrullah**, and his pedigree is entirely free of that strain, which opens up some interesting possibilities for matings.

Irish-based **Marju** (Ire) (**Last Tycoon** {Ire}--**Flame of Tara** {Ire} {**Artaius**}) is represented by his first crop of three-year-olds and he is already responsible for a pair of Group 1 winning fillies, the French Oaks victress **Sil Sila** and Sunday's Prix Vermeille heroine **My Emma** (GB) (f, 3, **Marju** {Ire}--**Pato** {GB} {**High Top**}). **My Emma**, who is a half-sister to last year's St. Leger winner **Classic Cliche**, has a rather interesting pedigree, which is particularly notable for linebreeding to the classic-winning brothers **Sayajirao** and **Dante**.
