SPECTRUM RETIRED TO COOLMORE STUD

Spectrum (Ire) (Rainbow Quest), winner of last year's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 Dubai Champion S., has run his last race and will stand the 1997 breeding season at Coolmore Stud in Ireland. Coolmore has acquired majority ownership in Spectrum from the colt's breeder Lord Weinstock, but Lord Weinstock has retained an interest and will send mares to Spectrum at Coolmore. A spokesperson for Coolmore revealed that a large offer for Spectrum has recently been made from Japan. However, the offer was rejected because the four-year-old "has so much to offer European breeders in general and Irish breeders in particular." Spectrum, a 10-length winner in his only start at two, went on to win two more races over a mile at three, notably defeating Group 1 winners Bahri, Prince Arthur and Oscar Schindler in the Irish 2000 Guineas. He was also capable of staying a mile and a quarter, as he showed with his two-length victory in the G1 Dubai Champion S. Overall, the bay won four of nine career starts for earnings of \$559,187. Spectrum's pedigree is free of Northern Dancer blood, and his sire Rainbow Quest has an outstanding record with mares by Northern Dancer-line stallions, with this combination already being responsible for 15 stakes-winners.

WILL'S WAY OUT OF BREEDERS' CUP Travers winner **Will's Way** (Easy Goer) returned from his seventh-place finish in Sunday's G1 Super Derby at Louisiana Downs with a virus and will miss both the Oct. 5 Jockey Club Gold Cup and the Oct. 26 Breeders' Cup, trainer Jim Bond reported Wednesday. "He's coughing pretty bad," said Bond. "He coughed the whole way home (to New York) on the plane." Bond said the colt seems to be responding well to antibiotics, but added he would wait at least a week to 10 days before making a decision whether to end his three-year-old campaign now or to run again this year. Will's Way has won four of seven career starts for earnings of \$565,000.

TIMARIDA TO SKIP ARC Timarida (Ire) (Kalaglow {Ire}), winner of a trio of Grade/Group 1 stakes in her last three starts, will not be supplemented for next week's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp. Her owner The Aga Khan and trainer John Oxx decided Tuesday to skip that event and concentrate instead on the mile and a quarter G1 Dubai Champion S. at Newmarket Oct. 19. Oxx said, "We have always been worried about her stamina for the Arc. She is not bred to get a mile and a half and the Arc is the toughest mile and a half race in Europe." In her last three outings, the four-year-old mare has won the G1 Grand Prix Dallmayr Bayerisches Zuchtrennen in Germany, the G1 Beverly D. at Arlington and the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown.

OJC CUTS 1996 THOROUGHBRED PURSES The Ontario Jockey Club announced Wednesday a 10 percent reduction in Thoroughbred purses, effective this Saturday, Sept. 28, but it is a decision expected to last only for the balance of the 1996 season. The cut, which affects Woodbine Racetrack through its Dec. 14 closing and Fort Erie Racetrack until its final day Oct. 27, will still result in a net increase in Thoroughbred purses paid for 1996. The expected total is \$48.3 million, up from the \$47.8 million paid in 1995 and almost \$10 million greater than the \$38.9 million sum of just two years ago. "We anticipate that purses will rise to their pre-reduction levels when we reopen our Thoroughbred racing next spring," said OJC President and CEO David Willmot. "We had hoped this move would not be necessary. However, the tax reduction we expected to be implemented July 1 did not take place as scheduled, thus resulting in less than anticipated revenues available for purses in 1996." In an accompanying move, to help keep the purse reduction at 10 percent and no greater, the OJC announced it will apply to the Ontario Racing Commission to cancel its six Monday dates in November and December which the ORC previously granted.

GATE DANCER TO SILVERLEAF Bob Cromartie, president of Silverleaf Farms Inc., has announced that Silverleaf Farms has purchased an interest in 1984 Preakness S. winner **Gate Dancer** (Sovereign Dancer) and will stand the 15-year-old stallion at their farm in Summerfield, Florida for the 1997 breeding season. Gate Dancer, a MGI winner of over \$2.5 million, has nine crops to race, total progeny earnings of over \$10.1 million and 18 stakes winners, including recent two-year-old Gill Sorority S. winner Annie Cake. Gate Dancer formerly stood at Lucas Farm in Summerfield, Florida. His stud fee will remain at \$5,000 live foal.

TWIST AFLEET'S RETIREMENT CONFIRMED

Two-time Grade I winner **Twist Afleet** (Afleet) is definitely being retired, trainer John Kimmel confirmed Wednesday morning. "She had a recurrence of a saucer fracture on her left shin that was repaired when she was a two-year-old," Kimmel said. "We'll let her down and she will be sent to Kentucky to be bred to Danzig next year. She's been too good to us to take any chances with." The five-year-old mare won 13 of 18 starts for earnings of \$659,568. Her seven graded stakes victories included tallies in the GI Test S. and GIII Columbia S. at three, the GII First Flight H. at both three and four, the GI Top Flight H. at four and the GIII Vagrancy H. and GIII Honorable Miss H. this year. In her final career start Sept. 14, the top sprinter stretched out to 1 1/16-miles and finished fifth in the GI Ruffian H. at Belmont Sept. 14.

PETIONVILLE TO CRESTWOOD IN '97 Multiple graded-stakes winner **Petionville** (Seeking the Gold) will enter stud at Pope McLean's Crestwood Farm in Lexington, Ky for the 1997 breeding season. The 4-year-old has won seven of 14 career starts with victories in the GII Ohio Derby, GII La Jolla H. and GIII Louisiana Derby. To date, the colt has earned \$811,905, making him the leading active runner for his sire, Seeking the Gold.

Entrepreneur (GB) (Sadler's Wells) earned himself odds of 20-1 for next year's Epsom Derby and, almost certainly, a place in next month's G1 Dewhurst S. with a comfortable victory at Chester Wednesday. The Michael Stoute trainee, a full-brother to 1995 Epsom Oaks second Dance A Dream, cost \$980,850 as a yearling. Only three rivals took him on in the Heswall Conditions S. over 7f 122yds and Entrepreneur was a 1-6 favorite to bring his career score to two wins from three starts. His margin of victory, achieved with no more than gentle persuasion, was 2 1/2-lengths, but would surely have been greater if he had not become slightly unbalanced on the tight final bend.

Matiya (Ire) (Alzao), winner of the Irish 1000 Guineas in May, will start next in the G2 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp Oct. 6. The Ben Hanbury-trained filly proved disappointing when finishing last of ten on her most recent run on unsuitably fast turf in Goodwood's G1 Sussex S. in July.

Bahhare (Woodman), 6-1 favorite for next year's 2000 Guineas after his success in the G2 Laurent-Perrier Champagne S. at Doncaster earlier this month, is to spend the winter in Dubai. But the John Dunlop-trained colt, now unbeaten in three outings, will not be joining the Godolphin team. He will, instead, be supervised in the Middle East by staff from Dunlop's stable. Angus Gold, racing manager for Bahhare's owner Hamdan Al Maktoum, stated: "It is basically so he can benefit from the climate and come back next year."
