### SHIRLEY HEIGHTS COLT TOPS TATTERSALLS FIRST SESSION

A colt by Shirley Heights (GB) brought a final bid of \$825,000 to top Tuesday's first session of the 1996 Tattersalls Houghton Yearling Sale in Newmarket, England. Demi O'Byrne made the bid, acting on behalf of Michael Tabor, owner of 1995 Kentucky Derby winner Thunder Gulch. The colt, out of the Top Ville mare Darara (Ire), was consigned by Sir Andrew and Lady Lloyd-Webber's Watership Downs Stud. He is a half-brother to champion Dariyoun (Shahrastani) and to French Group 2 winner Darazari (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). John Magnier brought home the second-highest priced yearling of the session, paying \$660,000 for a colt by Caerleon--Fair Salinia (Ire) (Petingo {GB}) consigned by Camas Park Stud. O'Byrne also purchased the session-topping filly from Camas Park, bidding \$561,000 for a bay by Sadler's Wells--Broadway Joan (Bold Arian). The filly is a half-sister to millionaires Fourstardave and Fourstars Allstar and a full to GSP Astor Place (Ire). In all, 57 yearlings were sold for \$11,149,555, an average of \$201,676. The average was up 80% from last year's first-session average of \$110,862. "We mustn't underestimate the contribution of the Japanese to the strength of the market," said Tattersalls' Chairman Edmond Mahony. "They bought three lots tonight, and were very active in making the market as underbidders." The sale continues through Thursday.

Pas de Reponse, winner of the G3 Prix d'Arenberg at Evry in her last outing Sept. 10, caused confusion in the betting on next year's 1000 Guineas when winning the Cheveley Park S. The previously undefeated DAZZLE (GB) (Gone West) had been the hot favorite for the 1997 one-mile distaff classic before yesterday's Group One event. But all that has now changed. Ocean Ridge led at a steady pace with Moonlight Paradise and Pas de Reponse not far behind. Dazzle, meanwhile, was restrained at the back of the pack and, although she began to make progress at halfway, she could never really land a telling blow. Pas de Reponse made the decisive move with around two furlongs to go. She quickened up smoothly for jockey Freddie Head and gamely held off the challenge of Moonlight Paradise. Ocean Ridge faded to third, but still finished in front of Dazzle, who had beaten her decisively by five lengths in the G2 Cherry Hinton S. July 9. Successful trainer Criquette Head said, "We expected her to run well, but thought it would be difficult to beat Dazzle. I think Pas de Reponse has improved since she was beaten (when third in the G1 Prix Morny Piaget)--she was still green at that stage and I hope she can come back for the 1000 Guineas next year."

**OAK TREE MEETING BEGINS TODAY** The Oak Tree Racing Association's 28th season of autumn classic Thoroughbred racing at Santa Anita Park begins today. The 27-date meeting runs through Monday, November 4. Racing will take place Wednesdays through Sundays, with special Monday racing Oct. 14 and Nov. 4. The meeting's rich stakes schedule features 12 graded stakes and three Grade I events--the \$200,000 Oak Leaf S. Oct. 5, \$300,000 Oak Tree Turf Championship Oct. 6 and \$600,000 Yellow Ribbon S. Nov. 3. Nine stakes for California-breds worth a total of \$1,100,000 will be distributed during California Cup VII Day Saturday, November 2.

**DARE AND GO TO VINERY** Mr. and Mrs. Ben P. Walden Jr.'s Vinery announced Tuesday that **Dare and Go** (Alydar), winner of the GI Pacific Classic in 1996 and the GI Strub S. in 1995, will enter stud at the Midway, Kentucky farm in 1997. The five-year-old horse will continue to race this year for his owner/breeder, the La Presle Farm of Alain and Gerard Wertheimer, and is scheduled to run in the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup Oct. 5 at Oak Tree and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Oct. 26 at Woodbine. "Dare and Go possesses brilliant natural speed, and being from Fappiano's female family, he will offer breeders ties to three of the most important American Thoroughbreds of the past quarter century in Alydar, Secretariat and Fappiano," said Ben Walden Jr. Dare and Go has won seven of 20 career starts and \$1,549,786 to date.

**OJC SEEKS CHANGES IN 1997 SCHEDULE** The Ontario Jockey Club has applied to the Ontario Racing Commission for several changes to its 1997 schedule for racing dates, as compared to its schedule for 1996. The ORC is scheduled to hold hearings today regarding 1997 dates requests. The OJC is seeking two major changes in its Thoroughbred schedule. The first is a reduced live schedule at Woodbine, in the hopes that this would create larger fields and better racing. The OJC is requesting that Woodbine's season open Friday, March 28 with racing held only Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays until April 30. Mondays in November and December would also be eliminated. Saturday, December 6 would be closing day. In all, 21 fewer dates are being requested (180 in 1997 versus 201 in 1996). The other major change requested involves the OJC's intention to eliminate night racing at Woodbine, held currently at 6:55 p.m. Wednesdays and Thursdays. Wednesday post times would be 4:30 p.m., while Thursdays would revert to a 1 p.m. start.

**FASIG-TIPTON MIDLANTIC EASTERN FALL SELECTED YEARLING SALE RESULTS** Fasig-Tipton Midlantic held the selected session of its Eastern Fall Yearling Sale Monday at the Timonium Sales Pavilion in Maryland. There were 142 yearlings sold for a gross of \$3,598,600 and an average of \$25,342, up seven percent from last year's selected session average of \$23,674. There were 31 yearlings reported as not sold. The top price of \$170,000 was paid for a bay filly by Wild Again--Sweetly Decorated (Well Decorated). Consigned by Muirfield East, agent, the filly was purchased by Jan, Mace & Samantha Siegel. The sale's open sessions were held Monday and Tuesday.

**RETAMA PARK MEET CONCLUDES** Retama Park in San Antonio, Texas posted a significant jump in off-track handle, helping the track to an increase in total handle during its 66-day Thoroughbred meeting which concluded Sept. 28. Retama's total combined average daily handle from its live card increased 23 percent to \$824,235 from \$672,138 a year ago. The increase was the result of a 53 percent hike in off-track handle, which went up from \$423,356 per day during 1995's inaugural meeting to \$646,128 in 1996. An aggressive full-card simulcasting network brought in \$42,370,901 from approximately 102 sites around the country. The total combined handle for Retama Park's 1996 meeting reached \$54,125,975. "Nineteen ninety-six was a very trying time, but we had a staff that was dedicated to the challenge," said Retama Park's Chairman and C.E.O. Joe Straus Jr. "The results have been gratifying in as much as we were able to remain open and continue the education process of pari-mutuel wagering." Retama Park also announced it has been granted \$1.3 million in funding from its new bond holder group Call Now Inc., which will fund operations for the remainder of its current fiscal year, which ends March 31, 1997.

**BUICK MEADOWLANDS CUP H.-GI, \$750,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/8m**

GIII Pennsylvania Derby winner **Devil's Honor** (Devil's Bag) has joined the list of probables for Friday night's \$750,000 Buick Meadowlands Cup. The three-year-old was third in the GI Super Derby at Louisiana Downs in his last start Sept. 22. "We made the decision this morning," trainer Jim Ryerson said Tuesday. "We waited until we breezed him (a half-mile in :47 3/5 with Nick Santagata up). We were running back a little close to his Super Derby start. We liked what we saw. We'll have Craig Perret ride him in the Cup."

It rained Monday night and Tuesday in Paris, and the going at Longchamp is getting softer by the minute, so Pentire's participation must now be in some doubt. The G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. winner is listed as "probable if there is no further rain."

Tamure (Ire), last year's Epsom Derby runner-up, will make his long-awaited return to racing in Sunday's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. The four-year-old has not run since finishing fourth in the Breeders' Cup Turf last Oct. 28. Trainer John Gosden said, "He hasn't run all year because of fast ground. He was being aimed at the Geoffrey Freer S. (at Newbury Aug. 17), but was pulled out because of a corn on his foot. The Arc is a tough race to come back in, but we will give it a try."

**Saturday, Belmont Park:**

**JOCKEY CLUB GOLD CUP-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/4m**

The winners of two of this year's Triple Crown events tuned up yesterday for their engagements in the Jockey Club Gold Cup. Belmont S. winner **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner) drilled five furlongs in :59.83 at Belmont. "He did it very handily," said Team Lukas assistant Jerry Barton. "Obviously, we're very realistic (about our chances) considering the horses we'll be in against. But in the same sense, we know we have a good horse. When he's got his act together and his mind in the game, he'll give any horse in the country a good challenge." Also at Belmont yesterday, Preakness hero **Louis Quatorze** (Sovereign Dancer) breezed five furlongs in 1:00.11. The three-year-old is attempting to rebound from a seventh-place finish in the GI Woodbine Million Sept. 15. "I think he's bounced back," said trainer Nick Zito. "I hope what happened in Canada was a situation similar to the Kentucky Derby where he just didn't like the track. He acts terrific and looks good. I hope he can run back to the Preakness."

**THREE CHIMNEYS SPINSTER S.-GI, \$500,000a, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/8m**

Last year's Champion Two-Year-Old Filly **Golden Attraction** (Mr. Prospector), winner of the GII Turfway Breeders' Cup S. in her last start Sept. 21, breezed a half-mile in :48 4/5 Tuesday at Churchill Downs. "She worked great," said Dallas Stewart, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "She's a champion filly and she's on the right path headed toward the Breeders' Cup." Pat Day picks up the mount on Golden Attraction for the Spinster. Also pointing to the Grade I event are **Bedroom Blues** (Cure the Blues), **Belle of Cozzene** (Cozzene), **Blonde Actress** (Lyphard's Ridge), **Different (Arg)** (Candy Stripes), **Top Secret** (Afleet) and **Urbane** (Citidancer).

**Sunday, Belmont Park:**

**BELDAME S.-GI, \$400,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/8m**

Last year's Beldame winner **Serena's Song** (Rahy) will try to defend her title in Sunday's renewal. In preparation for the task, the four-year-old filly worked five furlongs in :59.09 at Belmont yesterday, galloping out six furlongs in 1:12.43. "It was a real easy move for her," said Jerry Barton, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "She came back sharp and is right on target for Sunday." The champion looks for her first victory in her fifth start since taking the GI Hempstead H. at Belmont June 29. Also working for the Beldame yesterday was Hempstead H. runner-up **Shoop** (Double Sonic), who was clocked in 1:00.36 for five furlongs.

Goulash broke her maiden in her fourth career start at Hollywood Park May 30 and had not lost in three starts since, taking a one-mile Bay Meadows allowance by nine lengths in her most recent appearance Sept. 21. Trying stakes company for the first time here, the bay filly made it five wins in a row, stalking the pace early, taking a short lead nearing the second turn then drawing clear to defeat the favorite by four lengths.

### Local News, Santa Anita:

Two-year-old **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck), a winner of two out of three career starts including a victory in the GII Del Mar Futurity, will be forced to miss Sunday's GII Norfolk S. after coming down with a slight temperature yesterday morning. During a teleconference yesterday, trainer Bob Baffert announced that his precocious runner might also miss the Breeders' Cup if he isn't well enough to run in a prep race before the Oct. 26 championship. Baffert cited the Oct. 11 GII Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland as a possible alternative race, if the colt recovers quickly from his 102 degree fever.

## WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

### PEDIGREE SHORTS...

Canadian S. (GIC) winner **Daylight Come** (f, 3, **Miswaki--Lady Winner {Fr} {Fabulous Dancer}**) is the second stakes-winner this year by **Miswaki** with **Targowice** in the pedigree (he appears as sire of the second dam here). What is so notable about this? **Targowice's** granddam, **Lyceum**, is a sister to **Lea Lark**, the fourth dam of **Miswaki**. Add the fact that both **Miswaki's** granddam, **Rose Bower**, and **Targowice** also have **Nasrullah** and **Princequillo** close up, and one can see that the pair are close genetic relatives. Since **Targowice** spent his stud career in Europe and Japan, the cross can't have had too many opportunities either.

One of the more interesting pedigree developments of the last few years has been the rapid rise in status of the family of the mare **Mofida** (GB) (**Right Tack {GB}--Wold Lass {GB} {Vilmorin}**). In the space of two generations, the family has climbed from one which was noted for producing tough, sound runners somewhat below top-class to one which throws up runners of classic standard. **Mofida's** daughter **Zaizafon** (by **The Minstrel**) was a group stakes winner who was also group placed against colts, and subsequently became the dam of champion and classic winner **Zafonic** (by **Gone West**). Then **Modena**, a **Roberto** half-sister to **Zaizafon**, produced **Elmaamul** (by **Diesis {GB}**), the top-weighted English three-year-old of his generation. Now another classic candidate has appeared in the shape of **Elmaamul's** two-year-old half-sister **Reams of Verse** (f, 2, **Nureyev--Modena {Roberto}**), winner of **Ascot's** G1 **Fillies Mile Sunday**. Often when a family "explodes," we find that a very closely inbred mare is to be found at the site of detonation. Sure enough, **Mofida's** dam, **Wold Lass**, is inbred 2x3 to **Gold Bridge**, one of the greatest speed influences to be found in European pedigrees, while **Mofida** herself is heavily linebred to the brothers **Fairway** and **Pharos**.
