RECORD SESSION FOR TATTERSALLS SALE

Yesterday's second session of the Tattersalls Houghton Yearling Sale broke the record European single session average. The 91 yearlings sold grossed \$20,225,700, averaging \$222,260. This brought the two-day totals to 148 yearlings sold for an aggregate of \$31,721,250 and an average of \$214,216. These figures represent a 43 percent increase in gross over the first two days--already more than the entire gross of last year's sale with a quarter of the catalogue remaining--while the average is up 61 percent. Wednesday's session topper at \$1,452,000 was a colt by Kingmambo out of Puppet Dance, a stakes-winning full sister to Sadler's Wells. Consigned by Camas Park Stud, the ticket was signed by Demi O'Byrne, who won a protracted bidding duel with German International Bloodstock's Roger Alles. O'Byrne, who buys for Monaco-based businessman Michael Tabor, has been the sale's leading buyer, his seven purchases thus far totaling \$4,273,500. The sale ends today.

WITH APPROVAL MOVES TO BROOKDALE

Canadian Horse of the Year **With Approval** (Caro {Ire}) will stand the 1997 breeding season at Brookdale Farm near Versailles, Kentucky. The 10-year-old stallion, who swept the Canadian Triple Crown in 1989 and who owns the world record for 1 3/8 miles on the turf, is scheduled to arrive at Brookdale Oct. 12 from Live Oak Stud in Ocala, Florida. Among **With Approval's** winners are Canadian juvenile champion **Talkin Man** and MGSW **OK By Me**. With three crops now racing, his runners have earned more than \$1.6 million in 1996. He will stand for \$7,500 live foal.

Saturday, Belmont Park:

JOCKEY CLUB GOLD CUP H.-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/4m

Cigar (Palace Music) drilled a half-mile Wednesday morning at Belmont Park in :48.44, prompting trainer **Bill Mott** to declare the reigning Horse of the Year to be "every bit as good as he was last year" as he prepares to defend his Gold Cup title. "The work this morning seemed to be very good," Mott added. "It's what we wanted to see. It was typical of him, and he came back to the barn feeling good, being sharp. I'm happy to have him back on track and in the winner's circle. I was glad to find out (in the Woodward) he's not going the wrong way and there's still fun to be had with him. He's a once in a lifetime horse and I want us all to appreciate and enjoy him rather than worry ourselves over him." Mott believes the most intriguing part of Saturday's race will be the presence of the nation's top three-year-olds. "It will be interesting to see how the three-year-olds stack up," Mott said, referring to Grade I winners **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner), **Louis Quatorze** (Sovereign Dancer) and **Skip Away** (Skip Trial). "This is the first real opportunity for them to run against older horses. The wise thing for them, until this point, is to run against three-year-olds, which they have been doing."

L'Carriere (Carr de Naskra), runner-up to **Cigar** in the Woodward, returned from Tuesday's half-mile work in :47.18 with heat in his left fore ankle and is questionable for the Gold Cup. "We're not sure if he's going to run," said **Everardo Cambray**, assistant to trainer **Jim Bond**. "It's not really bad, but when you're running against the best horses in the country--actually, the best horses in the world--you want him to be at his best."

Skip Away, winner of the GI Woodbine Million in his last start Sept. 15, breezed an easy half-mile in :49 1/5 over Keeneland's fast track Wednesday. **Shane Sellers**, who will ride the three-year-old in Saturday's race, was aboard for the work. Trainer **Sonny Hine** said the workout was, "a little something to open up the pipes. He's ready to run. He's fit. We weren't looking for anything special. I was worried he'd do too much right on top of the race." **Skip Away**, who has earned \$2,187,360 to date, is scheduled to be flown to New York today.

Also working for the Gold Cup yesterday was **Mahogany Hall** (Woodman), winner of the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga Aug. 3. The five-year-old breezed three-eighths in :36 3/5 at Churchill Downs and galloped out the half-mile in :49 3/5.

FASIG-TIPTON'S EASTERN FALL YEARLING SALE SHOWS GAINS

The open sessions of Fasig-Tipton Midlantic's Eastern Fall Yearling Sale were held Monday and Tuesday at the Timonium Sales Pavilion in Maryland. The sales topper was **Speed Caller**, a dark bay colt by Caller I.D.--Single Spot (Native Tactics). New Farm purchased the yearling, consigned by Charlton, agent, for \$45,000. The open sessions saw 226 horses sell for a gross of \$1,492,100 and an average of \$6,602, up 12.6 percent from last year's average of \$5,861. There were 49 yearlings reported as not sold.

THIRTY SIX RED TO MARGAUX Margaux Farms L.L.C. announced yesterday that Giles Brophy's Grade I-winning millionaire **Thirty Six Red** (Slew o' Gold) has arrived from Gainesway to stand the 1997 season at the Midway, Kentucky nursery. His fee has not yet been determined. **Thirty Six Red** won the GI Wood Memorial and the GI Gotham S. and finished second in the '90 GI Belmont S. A second crop sire of 1996, **Thirty Six Red** has been represented by the stakes-placed **Sally the Mayor** and **Distinguida**.

GOLDEN LARCH SOLD TO SAUDI ARABIAN

INTERESTS Trainer Mike Hushion announced yesterday that **Golden Larch** (Slew o' Gold), third to **Cigar** in the GI Woodward S. in both 1995 and 1996, has been sold by owners Eugene E. Hauman and Barry K. Schwartz to Saudi Arabian interests and will not compete in Saturday's \$1 million Jockey Club Gold Cup. "The transaction was completed this morning and he was brought over to Mohammed Mubarak's barn," said Hushion. "He will then be flown to Saudi Arabia on Saturday." The five-year-old horse, bred in Virginia by Mr. and Mrs. Bertram Firestone, won nine of 35 starts in North America for earnings of \$455,493. Out of the Mr. Prospector mare **Golden Petal**, he is a half-brother to MGSW **Lotus Pool** (Spectacular Bid) and stakes-winner **October Gold** (Ogygian).

BLUE ENSIGN AND WAY WEST TO BONNIE

HEATH Bonnie Heath Farms announced the addition of two stallions to its roster. **Blue Ensign** (Hoist the Flag), a 19-year-old GSW and sire of MGSW **To Freedom** and GISW **Fiery Ensign**, has arrived at the Ocala, Florida farm, along with stakes-winner **Way West** (Fr) (Gone West), who raced exclusively France, earning \$124,155. **Way West's** first foals will arrive in 1997. The pair join stallions **Honor Grades** and **Swedaus** at Bonnie Heath.

A quality field lines up for this Group One test for juvenile colts, which features five previous Group winners: **Bahamian Bounty (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) (G1 Prix Morny in France), **Deep Finesse (GB)** (Reprimand {GB}) (G3 Prix du Bois in France), **Easycall (GB)** (Forzando {GB}) (G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood), **Indian Rocket (GB)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) (G2 Mill Reef S. at Newbury) and **Rich Ground (GB)** (Common Grounds {GB}) (G3 July S. at Newmarket).

Likely favorite Bahamian Bounty has been purchased to race in the colors of Sheikh Maktoum Al Maktoum. The chestnut colt, winner of two of his three starts, was successful last time out in the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville. His victims there included the highly-rated colt **Zamindar** (Gone West) and Tuesday's G1 **Cheveley Park S.** heroine **Pas de Reponse** (Danzig). Since that success, however, Bahamian Bounty, previously raced in the silks of Lucayan Stud, has been bought in a private deal by Sheikh Maktoum. No details of the financial arrangements have so far been revealed.

QUEEN ELIZABETH II CHALLENGE CUP S.-GI, \$400,000, 3yo, f, 1 1/8mT

G1 Coronation S. winner **Shake the Yoke (GB)** (Caerleon), G2 Falmouth S. winner **Sensation (GB)** (Soviet Star) and Prix Finlande heroine **Housa Dancer (Fr)** (Fabulous Dancer) arrived at Keeneland Tuesday night following a flight that originated in France. "They all did great," said Kathy Hardin of International Racehorse Transport. "No problems." The three fillies are currently stabled in a quarantine barn at Keeneland. Assistant trainer Ruper Pritchard-Gordon, who will saddle Sensation Saturday for trainer Criquette Head, has a great deal of respect for Shake the Yoke. "If she's at her best form, she's definitely the horse to beat," he said. "She will be the Champion Three-Year-Old Filly in Europe this year."

Sunday, Longchamp, France:

FORTE MERIDIEN PRIX DE L'ARC DE TRIOMPHE-G1, \$1,369,595, 3yo/up, c/f, 1 1/2mT

Trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam will definitely run his three-year-old colt **Polaris Flight** (Northern Flagship) in the Arc, but his four-year-old Italian Group 1 winner **Court Of Honour (Ire)** (Law Society) will miss the race. Polaris Flight, who was runner-up in both the French and Irish Derbies, disappointed last time out when ninth in the G2 Prix Niel, but Chapple-Hyam explained, "He was very keen and we decided to race him close to the pace. That turned out to be a mistake and we now know that he is best coming from off the pace, so that is how he will be ridden on Sunday. He's very well, jumping out of his skin. Whether he's good enough to win or not, we'll find out on Sunday."

Sunday, Belmont Park:

FRIZETTE S.-GI, \$400,000, 2yo, f, 1 1/16m

Shug McGaughey-trainee **Aldiza** (Storm Cat) breezed a half-mile Wednesday morning at Belmont in :48.71. The two-year-old filly took on colts in her last start, a one-mile Belmont allowance Sept. 21, and came away with a win over Moët Champagne starters **Just a Cat** (Storm Cat) and **Mercer Mill** (Forty Niner). "The filly race wouldn't fill, and Shug wanted to get a race into her before the Frizette," explained McGaughey's assistant Buzzy Tenney.

GOODWOOD BREEDERS' CUP H.-GII, \$300,000a, 3yo/up, 1 1/8m

Dare and Go (Alydar), who shocked the racing world by upsetting Cigar in the Aug. 10 Pacific Classic, will make his first start since that event this Saturday. "Dare and Go was really primed for that race," said his trainer Richard Mandella. "I just hope I've got him back to where he was for the Pacific Classic. He really hit his stride for that race." The five-year-old breezed a half-mile in :49 4/5 Tuesday at Hollywood Park.

A trio of Goodwood contenders prepped for the event Wednesday. MGSW **Alphabet Soup** (Cozzene), third to Soul of the Matter in last year's Goodwood, breezed a half-mile in :50 at Hollywood. **Patrick** (Risen Star), who will be making his stakes debut, went the same distance in :48 at Santa Anita, and **Savinio** (The Minstrel), winner of the GIII San Diego H. at Del Mar July 27, worked five furlongs in 1:03 3/5, also at Santa Anita.

The Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. will be telecast live on NBC as part of the NBC Sports Breeders' Cup Preview Day broadcast from 1:30-3 p.m. Pacific Time.

OAK TREE TURF CHAMPIONSHIP H.-GI, \$300,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/4mT

After winning two Del Mar stakes in her first two U.S. starts, the four-year-old filly **Admise (Fr)** (Highest Honor {Fr}) will go up against the boys in Grade I company Sunday. The last filly to win the Oak Tree Turf Championship was Allen Paulson's **Estrapade** in 1986. "She's training very well and if we've got a shot, we'll go," trainer Walter Greenman said of Admise, who breezed six furlongs in 1:14 3/5 at Santa Anita Tuesday. "She needs the distance and there aren't that many races for her going long." Also working for the race was GSW **Bon Point (GB)** (Soviet Star), who went five furlongs in 1:01 1/5 at Hollywood Park Wednesday. The Oak Tree Turf Championship has produced the Breeders' Cup Turf winner in two of the last three years. Northern Spur completed the double last year, and Kotashaan accomplished the feat in 1993.

Yorkshire (Ire) (c, 2, Generous {Ire}--Ausherra, by Diesis {GB}) earned odds of 20-1 for next year's Epsom Derby when making a sparkling first race-course appearance at Salisbury Wednesday. The Fahd Salman-owned chestnut colt was a well-backed 2-1 second favorite for the one-mile EBF Marlborough Maiden S. (Div. 2). Slightly slow from the gates and showing definite signs of inexperience, Yorkshire was well back in the pack for the first two furlongs. But, after he began to get the hang of what was required, he made smooth progress and was disputing the lead with three furlongs to race.
